

Program seeks to curb rate of suicides after one family's tragedy

One family's loss has given others at UK an opportunity to prevent a similar tragedy.

QPR — "question, persuade, refer" — is a suicide prevention program offered by UK's counseling and testing center, and funded by the Kevin and Jeffrey Graham Memorial Fund.

The Kevin was a premed student at UK, killed himself June 21, 2003. About nine months later, an explosion in Iraq killed his brother, 2nd Lt. Jeffrey Graham.

UK has always done suicide prevention training,
but it never had the funding
to launch a program such as
QPR, Bolin-Reece said. The

UK Housing is a real fixer-upper



compared to UK's benchmark universities.

"They're not the best, but we're working on making them the best," said Ben Crutcher, vice president for auxiliary services. Considering we haven't built housing in 40 years, it's long overdue."

Campus housing is not traditionally seen as luxury accommodations, but even Crutcher said UK's quality of residence halls does not compare well to its benchmarks. He said that pared to other benchmark corns.

Crutcher's honesty is refreshing. Almost everyone knows UK's dorms are outdated and nieed renovations. What's encouraging is that administrators admit there is a problem and have outlined how they intend to fix it.

In the past few years, UK has installed air conditioning in Patterson Hall and completely renovated the dorm. There are plans to add air conditioning in other dorms within the next few years as well. New furniture was added in Patterson and Holmes halls, while the commons areas and lobbies in every dorm were re-

modeled.

Though cosmetic renovations are nice, UK falls behind its benchmarks when it comes to the design of its dorm rooms.

About 83 percent of UK's undergraduate housing is the traditional double-occupant of the traditional consideration of the traditional constructed monstrous dorms. University is not where two or four students share a bathroom. 

Paul's handle, but nothing moves him these days

like an artistic court design BYJOHN WALTER

I BLAME CHRISTO and Jeanne-Claude. Ever since their artwork *The Gates* debuted in New York City's Central Park on Feb. 12, I have become obsessed with thinking outside the box when peering inside the box.

Central Park, you see, is rectangular in shape. As is a basketball court (and Sicilian pizza . . . mmm, pizza). And so ever since happening upon Christo's 7,500 orange flags (made, I believe, from the shorts of Hooters waitresses) that now adorn the park, I have become obsessed with watching hoops not as a sports fan but as an art aficionado. A court marshal, if you will. After all, a basketball court is nothing more than a 94-by-50-foot canvas, minus an artist's signature just above the baseline. Herewith, this crack critic's notes:

 With a state map adorning the floor, you can't go wrong.
 A state map has both educa-

tional and aesthetic appeal. Indiana, North Carolina and Texas all proudly display a map of their state at midcourt. Hawaii and Tennessee once did also, but no longer. which is a shame. The Aloha State comprises five main islands, after all. Even if the game were boring, I'd watch, waiting for that moment when each Rainbow Warriors player stood on a different island ("Maui passes to Molokai!"). The sliver-thin map of Tennessee, meanwhile, practically begged long-range bombers to attempt a three from Memphis or Bristol.

One school that should consider cartography is Alaska-Anchorage. Why not promote the Last Frontier's enormous size? I'd extend the map beyond the court, so that someone sitting in Row 17 might peek under their seat and find one of the Aleutian Islands.

· Have you seen the court at Colorado State's Moby Center? The artist eschewed paint for two shades of wood. The darker shade resembles a ram's horns emanating from the midcourt circle. Each horn orbits outward to the edges of the court. The effect is of a pair of giant, dizzying pinwheels. As with The Gates, I viewed it initially with revulsion, then with awe. The last time I watched a CSU game, I had an inspiration. I repeatedly ran toward the TV screen, then backpedaled, all the while playing U2's Vertigo in the background. Yeah, I live alone.

- Saint Joseph's, with its exceedingly drab hardwood, should give its floor a Jackson Pollockstyle redesign. Splashes of hues everywhere. The marketing department on Hawk Hill would promote it as "Saint Joseph's and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcourt!"
 "Points in the paint" is a rela-
- tive term. At Boise State and Ole Miss the free throw lanes are natural wood, but the remainder of the area inside the three-point arc is painted.

At **Delaware** the entire area inside the arc, including the free throw lane, is a garish blue.

Then again, what do I know? I'm no artiste. Nor Artest. As Christo recently said of his *Gates*, "This project is not involving talk."

What Christo meant was that discussing art is like discussing your NCAA tournament bracket. No one is an expert, because everyone is an expert.




