# WHAT THE SIGNALS MEAN



Holding. (Penalty—by offense, 15 yards; by defense, 5 yards.)



Offside or violation of kick-off formation. (Penalty, 5 yards.)



Illegal forward pass.



Crawling or pushing or helping ball carrier, 15 yds.



Score—touchdown, field goal, or conversion.



Unnecessary roughness, illegal defensive use of the hands, clipping, running into or roughing the kicker. (Penalty, 15 yards.)



Player illegally in motion. (Penalty, 5 yards. If from shift or huddle, 15 yards.)



Penalty refused, incomplete pass, missed field goal or conversion, both sides offside, etc.



Interference with forward pass. (If penalty on offense, when interference occurs beyond line of scrimmage, 15 yards and loss of down.)

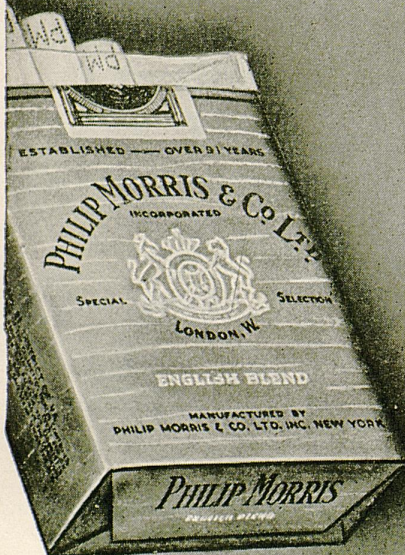

## PENALTIES

1. Taking more than four times out during either half.
2. Illegal delay of game.
3. Failure of substitute to report to an official.
4. Violation of kickoff formation.
12. Team not ready to play at scheduled time.
13. Violation of rules during intermission.
14. Illegal return of suspended or disqualified player.
15. Failure to stop at least one second on shift play.
24. Striking, kneeling, or kicking opponent—half the distance to the goal and disqualification of offending player.
25. Foul within one yard line—half the distance to the goal.
26. Interference by defensive team on forward pass—first down for passing team at spot of foul.

### LOSS OF FIVE YARDS

5. Illegal return or withdrawal of eligible players.
6. Failure to maintain proper alignment of offensive team before ball is snapped. Also, backfield man illegally in motion.

### LOSS OF FIFTEEN YARDS

16. Intentional grounding of forward pass.
17. Interference by member of passing team with defensive player on an interception. (Also loss of a down.)
18. Illegal use of hands and arms by offensive player.

### OTHER PENALTIES

27. Illegal forward pass—five yards from spot of pass, also loss of down.
28. Flagrant roughing of kicker—disqualification, plus fifteen yards.
29. Flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct—disqualification, plus fifteen yards.

7. Offside by either team, or encroachment on neutral zone.
8. Attempt to draw opponents off-side.
9. Flying block or flying tackle.
10. Illegal use of hands and arms by defensive player.
11. Crawling by runner.
19. Defensive player striking opponent above shoulders.
20. Roughing the kicker.
21. Piling up, hurdling, clipping.
22. Tackling player out of bounds.
23. Coaching from the sidelines.
30. Forward pass becoming incomplete beyond the line of scrimmage by touching or being touched by an ineligible player—loss of fifteen yards from spot of preceding down, play to count as down.
31. Illegal touching of kicked ball inside opponent's 10 yard line—touchback.

# Important Information

The distribution of tickets for the public games in Lexington will be made under the following regulations:

All applications must be made by mail addressed to the University of Kentucky Athletic Association, Lexington 29, Kentucky, Attention: Manager, of Ticket Sales. No tickets will be sold at the box office.

All applications must carry a postmark dated within the prescribed dates of sale for any particular group. Applications not properly postmarked will be returned.

The application must be accompanied by a check for the exact amount due; otherwise it will be returned.

Reserved seats will be \$1.25 each, including tax. Each application must include a sum of 25 cents to cover mailing and registering.

Persons whose applications are received early enough to be allotted Box Seats will be advised of additional amount to remit.

Preferences for particular seats may be expressed, but the location of the seats assigned will be in order of application.

With the exceptions noted below, no application will be approved for more than two seats to each game. The games desired must be clearly specified. Applications may be made for one, two, three, four or all five Lexington games.

## PRIORITY GROUPS

Applications must be postmarked from November 1 to November 15, inclusive, for the following groups. No person in these groups may exercise his privileges under more than one category, and he should indicate on his application the category under which he wishes to be included.

Recipients of complimentary tickets.

The University Faculty and Staff—limit of two tickets to each applicant for each game.

Persons who made donations in excess of \$20.00 to the Athletics Fund from January 1, 1946 to September 20, 1946—limit of two tickets to each applicant for each game.

Members of the Lexington Salesman Club—limit of two tickets to each applicant for each game.

Regular purchasers of season basketball tickets as recorded in the Athletics Office—the same number of tickets for each game as the number of season tickets purchased in 1945-46.

## NON-PRIORITY GROUPS

Applicants not included in the above groups must submit applications postmarked between November 16 and 20, inclusive. Such tickets as remain will be distributed by drawing.

Games assigned to the public are for the faculty, townspeople, and other non-student fans. Students' applications for the purchase of tickets to these games will not be accepted.

For the game on November 28 (Thanksgiving) 1,000 tickets are to be assigned the Shrine organization to be sold to its members and guests.

The distribution of tickets for the three games in Louisville will be made under the following regulations.

The games are in no sense regarded as home games, and University of Kentucky students will have no privileges in connection with them not accorded all other persons.

For each game 3,000 seats will be reserved for applicants from Jefferson and adjoining counties (Hardin, Bullitt, Spencer, Shelby and Oldham) and the applications must carry the postmark of a post-office in these counties.

For the Notre Dame game 600 seats will be sent to Notre Dame for sale to alumni of that institution, and applications from such alumni should be mailed to South Bend, Indiana.

All applications must be made by mail addressed to the University of Kentucky Athletic Association, Lexington 29, Kentucky, Attention: Manager of Ticket Sales. No tickets will be sold at the box office or at any Louisville establishment.

All applications must carry a postmark dated within the prescribed dates of sale for any particular group. Applications not properly postmarked will be returned.

The application must be accompanied by a check for the exact amount due; otherwise it will be returned.

The price of seats will be \$2.00 each, including tax. Each application must include a sum of 25 cents to cover mailing and registering.

Under no condition will any applicant be sold more than two tickets. The check accompanying every application should, therefore, be in the maximum amount of \$4.25.

All tickets in all categories will be drawn from those properly postmarked.

The order of drawing will determine the location of the seat.

## PRIORITY GROUPS

Applications from members of the University of Kentucky Alumni Association paid up as of November 1, 1946, members of the University Board of Trustees, and members of the Board of Directors of the University Athletics Association shall be received and placed in the drawing for each of the three games when postmarked as follows:

DePaul—November 18 to 23, inclusive  
Notre Dame—January 10 to 15, inclusive  
Temple—January 15 to 20, inclusive

## NON-PRIORITY GROUPS

Applications from all other persons shall be received and placed in a second drawing when postmarked as follows:

DePaul—November 25 to December 1, inclusive.  
Notre Dame—January 16 to 20, inclusive.  
Temple—February 21 to 25, inclusive.

If the drawing should fail to dispose of all seats, late applications will be filled for each game in order of receipt.

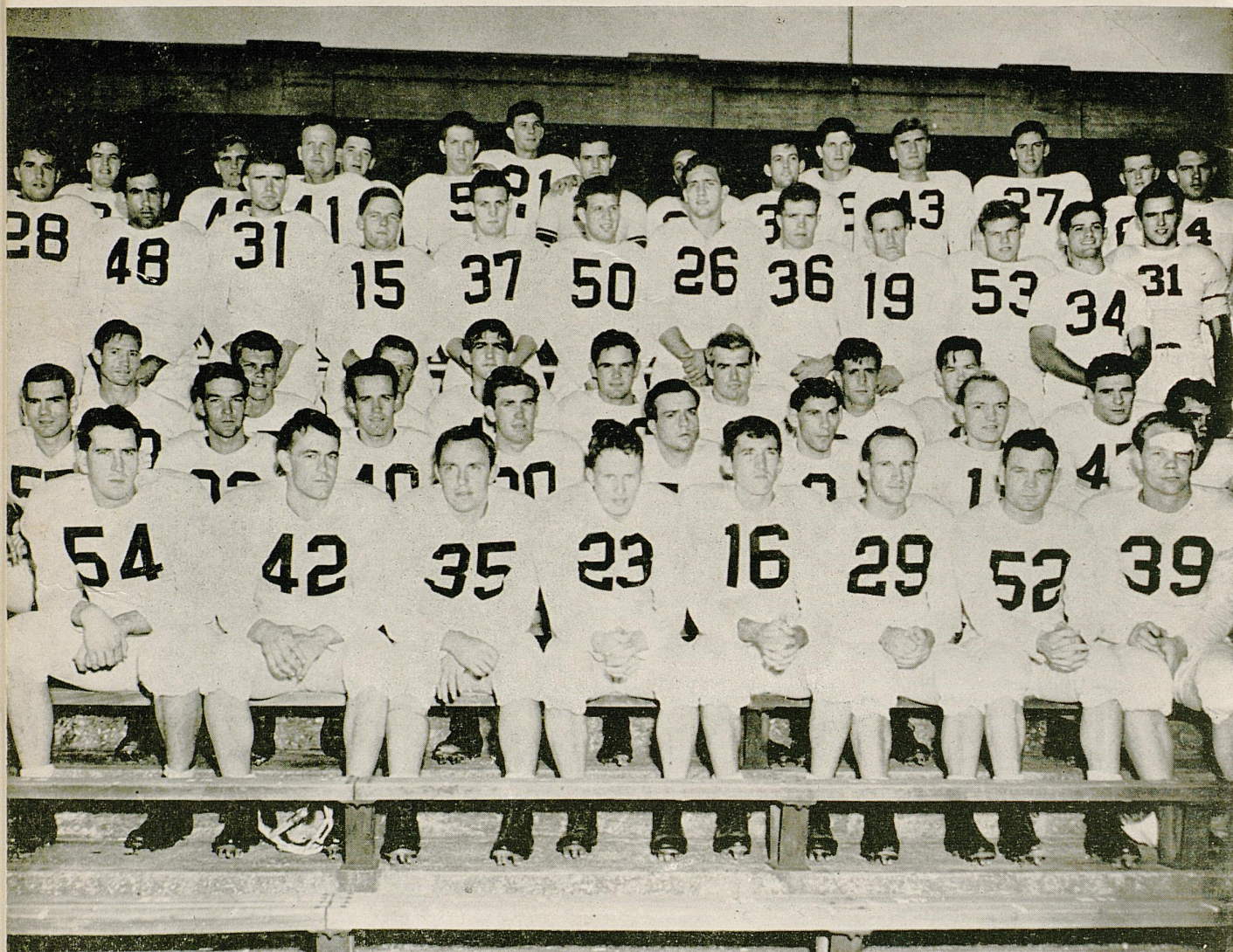
## GENERAL INFORMATION
