Add/drop trouble is avoidable

Knowing procedures and instructions helps cut red tape

For students who go through add/drop tomorrow, remembering the statement "patience is a virtue" can make a long day much easier.

While it's true that there are long lines and closed classes involved in the process, most students' stories about add/drop are unrealistic, according to Ann Fister, director of advising conferences.

"The stories are like the fish story — they get bigger and bigger — but for some people it is a bad experience," Fister said.

Only those students who advanced registered in November are eligible to go through centralized add/drop tomorrow.

Students who received their schedules last semester through distribution in the Student Center Ballroom or the mail should check for errors that resulted from faulty computer

printing, said Margey McQuilkin, director of student records. She suggested that students compare the schedule card with the listings in the spring schedule book.

All new and re-admitted undergraduate and graduate students registering today must wait until Wednesday to add or drop a course. Today's late registration will begin at noon at Memorial Coliseum.

Those undergraduate students who have been accepted for the spring 1985 semester will need to attend an advising conference at 8 a.m. in the Classroom Building.

Also, anyone who failed to pay the \$50 advance registration fee will not be able to go through add/drop because their schedule of classes has been cancelled. These students must re-register beginning Wednesday.

Undergraduates must go to 204 Miller Hall and graduate students must go to 351 Patterson Tower.

Centralized add/drop will begin at 10 a.m. at Memorial Coliseum and will last until 5:30 p.m. To make the process easier, there are some things to remember.

First of all, times will be outlined according to alphabetical distribution. George Dexter, acting registrar, said it takes approximately 20 minutes to check in a group so there is no point getting there an hour early and waiting outside.

Next, carefully read all instructions, especially those on page six of the 1985 Spring Schedule of Classes. "If students read instructions, there would be 90 percent fewer problems," Fister said.

Also, remember to bring your official schedule of classes. The registrar will have copies available at the coliseum. Perhaps the most important thing to remember is that barest of necessities — a No. 2 pencil.

If students do have questions, ROTC students will be there to help, as will members of the registrar's staff.

When going through add/drop, always add a class before dropping one so the academic credit hour status will not be accidentally altered. It is always easier to drop a class than it is to try and pick one up. "Students need to have an idea of what their shopping for before they come in," Dexter said.

When changing sections of a class, remember to sign up for the new section and also drop the other section in order to be removed from a previous class list. This will create an opening for someone else.

Students who are dropping a class that does not change their full-time academic status may want to wait until Wednesday or Thursday to do so, thus eliminating the wait in line. But, if students are changing from full-time to part-time status, or reducing their part-time hours, they must drop these courses tomorrow

in order to receive a full refund of registration fees paid or to get cancellation of the amount owed for the term.

After tomorrow, they will only receive a partial refund. From Jan. 16 to Jan. 22, students withdrawing or dropping courses that change their status will receive 80 percent of their entitled refund. From Jan. 22 to March 7, 50 percent will be refunded. In order to receive these refunds, students must officially drop the course by notifying the registrar's office of the reduction.

All re-assessment of fees will be done in the Gillis Building, not in the Student Center. Students who, of course, pay their fees at Student Billings located in 257 Student Center.

Add/drop will continue through January 22. The College of Arts and Sciences will continue to hold its add/drop from 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. at the Coliseum, on Wednesday. Add/drop for late registering students will also be held there. From Jan. 17-22, add/drop will be held in the academic department and dean's offices.

UK squad cheerleader champions

The UK cheerleaders have cheered their way to the top of the national college cheerleading championship.

A total of 105 teams entered the nationwide competition and the six regional winners competed in the finals in Honolulu, Hawaii Dec. 15 to Dec. 17. UK advanced to the finals after winning its region in November.

Scott Hendrickson, a marketing and physical education junior and a member of the squad, said he thought their chances were really good when they went to Hawaii. "It was just hitting the routine and getting it clean."

"The national championship was our goal for the whole season. All the practice was worth it now," Hendrickson said.

The squad began preparing for the national competition in October, according to adviser T. Lynn Williamson. Because the competition took place during finals week, Williamson wrote to the cheerleaders' instructors to ensure academic responsibilities could be completed before the competition.

Williamson said the squad's two strongest areas of the four scored were fundamentals and crowd appeal/image.

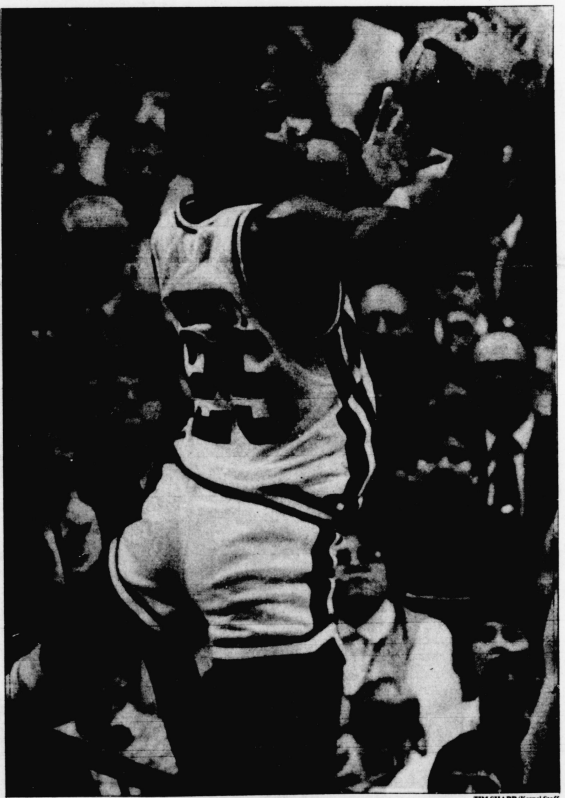
Other areas scored by the judges included communication and projection and group technique.

Williamson said the squad scored high in crowd appeal and image category because the members promote an "all-American image."

Davin Duncan, an undecided sophomore and a first-year member of the squad said the most important thing was that the team members were able to work together as a squad. "We all worked real hard and when it worked, it was a great feeling for us."

"This year we had confidence we could do it," she said.

Duncan said the cheerleaders have already discussed next year's competition and are planning on defending their title. No school has won it twice. The last time a UK squad won the national competition was in 1980.

Offices open longer to lessen crowding

Each semester brings with it bills to pay, ID's to validate, financial aid checks to pick up and meal plans to change.

Many University services have extended their hours to accommodate students the first few weeks of class.

The Office of Student Billings in 257 Student Center has been open since Jan. 13 and will extend its hours the first two weeks of school, according to Tammie Boggs, an account clerk at the office.

Boggs said students could have mailed in their bill payments to the University last month, but now the only alternative is to stand in line at the Student Billings office to make the payments. "There is no easy way," she said.

Student Billings will be open from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. for the next two weeks, except on Friday, when it will be open until 4:30 p.m.

The last day to pay fees will be Jan. 29 and Boggs said the office will stay open until 8 p.m. "We try to be as accessible to students as possible," she said.

If a student has paid through the mail but has not had his or her ID validated, it will be done the first two weeks of class in the Student Center Ballroom. Students who have not had their ID's returned by Student Billings can pick them up in the ballroom. The ballroom will also be the place to pick up financial aid.

Students who have lost their ID's can have one remade in 206 Student Center from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. during the first week of school. A replacement will cost \$5. The ID service will move to its permanent location in 106 Student Center during the second week of school and will be open from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. each day.

The ballroom will be open from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for the first week and the second week the financial aid checks and ID validation will be moved to 206 Student Center. After the second week the service will be continued in Student Billings.

If a student's account is credited with financial aid, he or she will not have to stand in line at Student Billings. Financial aid money that stu-

dents receive from the government will be credited to the student's account according to David Stockham, director of financial aid. Students can pick up financial aid checks if the amount exceeds the cost of tuition.

Students who late registered cannot receive their financial aid checks until registration is over because their student account is not established until that time, Stockham said.

Jan. 28 will be the first day these students can pick up financial aid checks. "I wish we could do it sooner," Stockham said. "It's our biggest problem. We advise students to come to campus with some money."

If students change their status from full-time to part-time status or from part-time to full-time status, they need to have their fees reassessed. Boggs said these students should first go to the registrar's office in the Gillis Building.

If students wish to change their meal plan, they can do so until Jan. 25 according to Allen Riemann, director of Food Services. There is a \$25 charge for making a meal plan change.

To change their meal plan, students who live in residence halls must do so through the housing office in the Service Building or in 206 Student Center, Riemann said. Students who have meal plans but do not live in residence halls can make changes the first week of classes in 206 Student Center or the second week in the Food Storage Center behind K-Laif grill.

Students must pay for meal plan changes before Jan. 29, Riemann said. Students who do not live in residence halls must make a \$100 deposit for the card to be valid.

Refunds for meal plan changes in which the number of meals is reduced will be given after Jan. 29, Riemann said.

A meal card will be valid even if the student's fees have not been paid in full, he said. But, "there is always a few that slip by because of human error." Students should ask a food service employee to call the office and check if they have already paid the \$100 deposit.

Planning ahead

Little Kentucky Derby will highlight spring semester full of events scheduled by the Student Activities Board

Turning UK into a home away from home, rather than a "suitcase school" is the main goal of the Student Activities Board this semester, according to President Louis Straub.

"If nothing is going on during the weekend, then the students pack their bags and head home for the weekend," Straub said. "The majority of the students are only from a 50-mile radius from Lexington, so its easy to go home. We (SAB) want to make UK the students' second, or even first home."

The big event for this semester will be the Little Kentucky Derby. "We are really looking forward to it," Straub said. "It used to be a

really big bash before problems arose and the students got out of control," he said. "Administration cracked down and campus involvement started going downhill. We have decided this year to build it back up into a fun, student-oriented event."

The theme for this year's LKD is "A Tradition Renewed."

"We're going to have a big publicity drive for it," he said. "We're planning a big concert, an on-campus party, a triathlon, the bike race, the balloon race; we're just going to try to make it bigger than the Fall Free-for-All was last semester. It will be a festival atmosphere, like a carnival."

"It's the Homecoming of spring," said Scott Mustian, SAB vice presi-

dent. "It's been a UK event for over 30 years. It's pretty much a tradition."

"Of course, the primary goal of the LKD is to give out scholarships," he said. "Last year we gave out three \$600 scholarships. This year we want to be able to give out four which may include a little more money."

The scholarships come from the Little Kentucky Derby Scholarship fund. Money goes into the fund from fundraising events, including the Alumni Golf Tournament and the balloon race. The interest on the fund pays for scholarships.

LKD is not the only event scheduled for this semester, however. UK is 130 years old, and SAB plans to celebrate the birthday in February.

"We'd like to make the celebration big with possibly two or three dances and outdoor parties," Straub said.

"We also plan to have a UK day at Keeneland," he said. "We hope that student discounts will be given, but mainly it will be held to promote Keeneland."

SAB is also planning two jazz concerts, one to be scheduled around NCAA tournament time. The artists which will perform are not known, but Mustian promises "it will be a major event."

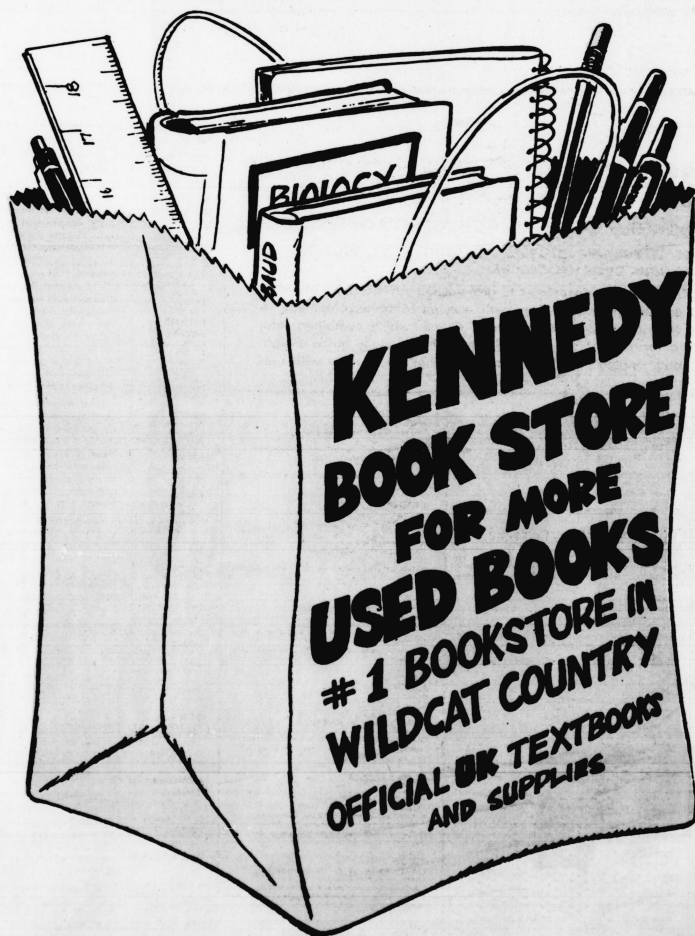



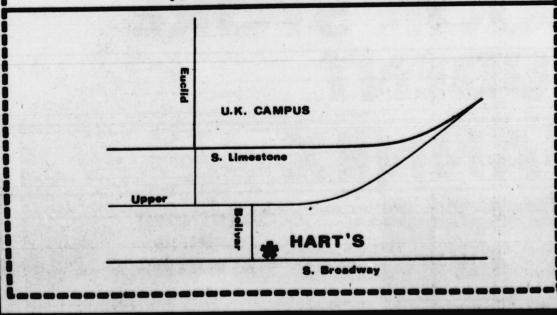
