TAPES AND TAPE PLAYERS

IN KING LIBRARY

The Margaret I. King Spoken Word Collection on tapes is now available for use. The following areas are included:

- 1. British Literature of the Middle Ages, the Neoclassical Period, the Renaissance, the Victorian Period, the Romantic Period, and the Modern Period.
- 2. American Literature--Romantic Triumph; Rise of Realism; Twentieth Century Drama, Poetry and Prose.
- 3. Recordings in American and World History.
- 4. Caedmon, Spoken Arts, and Argo Shakespeare Series.
- 5. Representative Spanish Literature.
- French Literature of the Seventeenth, Eighteenth, and Nineteenth Centuries.

This collection is housed in the Newspaper / Microtext Room (110-A), King Library South (ground floor of the old building). There is an author card file in the Reading Room and a subject list available at the counter in the Newspaper/Microtext office. The items are also included in the main library card catalog.

Recorded tapes may be borrowed by anyone who has a borrower's card from King Library. The loan period is two weeks, with a two-week renewal privilege.

Tape play-back units are available for use with Library tapes on presentation of ID card for in-library use. A deposit is collected for loan of players outside the library. The loan period is also two weeks, with a two-week renewal privilege. Tape duplication service is available in the library.
