Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, September 16, 1980

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met in regular statutory session at 2:00 o'clock (Eastern Daylight Time) on Tuesday, September 16, 1980 in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington campus.

# A. Meeting Opened and Oath of Office Administered

Mr. Sturgill, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 2:02 p.m. Following the invocation pronounced by Mr. Black, Mr. Darsie administered the oath of office to the following:

Mr. A. Stevens Miles, appointed by Governor John Y. Brown, Jr. to replace Mr. George W. Griffin, for a term expiring May 1, 1984.

Mr. W. T. Young, Sr., appointed by Governor Brown to replace Dr. John R. Woodyard, for a term expiring June 30, 1984.

Mr. Brad Sturgeon, who will serve as student trustee during his term of office as President of Student Government.

#### B. Roll Call

The following members answered the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, Mr. William R. Black, Governor Albert Benjamin Chandler, Mrs. Betty Pace Clark, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. Tracy Farmer, Mrs. Edythe J. Hayes, Mrs. Sally Hermansdorfer, Dr. David A. Hull, Mr. Thomas B. Kessinger, Mr. W. Terry McBrayer, Mr. A. Stevens Miles, Mr. Frank Ramsey, Mr. Homer W. Ramsey, Mr. Brad Sturgeon, Mr. W. B. Terry, Professor Constance Wilson, and Mr. William T. Young, Sr. Professor Michael Adelstein was absent. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Vice Presidents Jack C. Blanton, Peter P. Bosomworth, Donald B. Clapp, Lewis W. Cochran, Raymond R. Hornback, John T. Smith, M. Stanley Wall, and Robert G. Zumwinkle; and Mr. John C. Darsie, General Counsel. Members of the various news media were also in attendance. The secretary, Mrs. Clark, reported a quorum present and the Chairman declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 2:05 p.m.

#### C. Minutes Approved

The Minutes of the August 12, 1980 meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees were approved without objection.

# D. Nominating Committee Report

Under the Governing Regulations, officers of the Board and the Executive Committee are elected annually at the September meeting. Mr. Sturgill, who had appointed a Nominating Committee which was composed of Mr. Homer Ramsey, Mr. Thomas Kessinger and Mr. Frank Ramsey, called on the chairman of the committee, Mr. Homer Ramsey, to present the committee's recommendations.

Mr. Ramsey placed the name of Mrs. Betty Pace Clark in nomination for Secretary of the Board. Mr. Sturgill called for nominations from the floor. There being none, Mr. Ramsey moved that Mrs. Clark be elected Secretary by acclamation. His motion was seconded by Governor Chandler and passed without dissent.

Mr. Ramsey next placed in nomination for Vice Chairman the name of Mr. Albert G. Clay. There being no nominations from the floor, Mr. Ramsey moved that Mr. Clay be elected by acclamation. His motion was seconded by Mrs. Clark and passed without dissent.

Since the next office was for the chairmanship of the Board, Mr. Sturgill asked that Mr. Clay assume the Chair. Mr. Clay asked that Mr. Ramsey continue his report, and Mr. Ramsey placed in nomination the name of Mr. William B. Sturgill for Chairman of the Board and moved acceptance of the nomination. His motion was seconded by Governor Chandler. There were no nominations from the floor and the motion was adopted without dissent.

Mr. Clay congratulated Mr. Sturgill and said he felt the Board was very fortunate to have Mr. Sturgill reelected as Chairman.

Mr. Sturgill resumed the Chair, and Mr. Ramsey continued his report by placing in nomination for membership on the Executive Committee the names of Mr. William B. Sturgill, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. William R. Black, Mr. William T. Young and Mr. Homer W. Ramsey, with Mr. Sturgill as Chairman. There being no nominations from the floor, on motion by Mr. Kessinger, seconded by Mr. Terry and passed, the slate was elected as proposed.

#### Honorary Degree

Mr. Sturgill, indicating that the Board of Trustees wished to have representation on the Honorary Degree Committee, appointed Mrs. Sally Hermansdorfer to serve on that committee.

#### Council of Supervisors, University Hospital

Mr. Sturgill appointed Mr. W. Terry McBrayer to serve on the Council of Supervisors, University Hospital, along with Mr. William R. Black, Mrs. Sally Hermansdorfer, and Dr. David A. Hull. Mr. McBrayer's three-year term will expire on June 30, 1983.

#### F. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

President Singletary reviewed briefly the items in his monthly report to the Trustees, calling particular attention to (1) the increase in fall enrollment which is estimated to be 23,500, a 2.5 percent increase over last year, and noted there were approximately 19,000 students enrolled in the Community College System, (2) the dedication ceremonies for the Southwest campus of Jefferson Community College which will be at 2 p.m. on Sunday, September 28, and (3) the two search committees which were recently appointed to help find deans for the College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Business and Economics. He pointed out that a Trustee is serving on each of these committees. Mrs. Clark is serving on the Arts and Sciences Search Committee and Mr. Clay is serving on the Business and Economics Search Committee.

As a matter of information, President Singletary said he would like to read a letter from Stanley Wall, Vice President for the Community College System, in which Dr. Wall indicated he would like to retire on January 31, 1981, or as soon thereafter as possible. An advisory committee will be named soon in the search for a successor to Dr. Wall.

Upon the recommendation of President Singletary, the Chairman received the President's Report to the Trustees and ordered it filed.

#### G. College of Law Visiting Committee Report

President Singletary recently received the first report from the College of Law Visiting Committee which was appointed approximately one year ago, and said he wished to share the report with the Trustees. He read a summary of the report which included the recommendations of the committee. The report indicates that the Law School is performing "creditably but that its standing with respect to other law schools is threatened by inadequate funding". President Singletary's reaction to the report was that it contained no great surprise. The Law School, not unlike other areas in the University, is definitely in need of additional resources. President Singletary said the report required no action; he merely presented it as an information item. He added that he would be happy to make the report available to any member who might wish to read it.

# H. Recommendations of the President (PR 2)

Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Frank Ramsey and passed, the recommendations in PR 2 consisting of (1) the appointment of Mr. George W. Griffin as a public member of the Council of Supervisors, University Hospital, for a three-year term which would expire June 30, 1983, (2) the naming of the service road connecting Tates Creek Road and Cooper drive as "Alumni Drive", and (3) the routine appointments and/or other staff changes were approved and ordered made an official part of the Minutes of the meeting. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

# I. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3)

President Singletary explained that the proposed amendment to the Governing Regulations as presented in PR 3 would define more clearly the conditions under which professional work (consulting or professional practice) outside the University can be undertaken and would provide better clarification with respect to the Board's meaning of a conflict of interest. He then recommended that the proposed amendment to the Governing Regulations be received for preliminary consideration and placed on the agenda for action at the next meeting of the Board of Trustees. On motion by Governor Chandler, seconded by Mr. Homer Ramsey and passed, it was so ordered. (See PR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

#### J. Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations (PR 4)

President Singletary pointed out that the proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations to change the name of the University of Kentucky Student Government to University of Kentucky Student Association, as presented in PR 4, were received and tabled at the June 27, 1980 meeting of the Board.

The Chairman then recognized Mr. Sturgeon who, speaking on behalf of the organization designated by the Board to represent the 23,500 students at the University, said he enthusiastically supports the amendments to the Governing Regulations in PR 4. Mr. Sturgeon presented a statement expressing his feelings about the significance of the proposed change for the students and for what is now known as Student Government.

On motion by Mr. Terry, seconded by Mr. McBrayer and passed, the name University of Kentucky Student Government was changed to University of Kentucky Student Association. (See PR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

# K. 1980-81 Budget Revisions (PR 5)

Noting that the proposed revisions in the 1980-81 budget were routine in nature, President Singletary recommended approval. On motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Frank Ramsey and passed, the proposed budget revisions in the 1980-81 budget were authorized and approved. (See PR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

#### L. Approval of Degree Candidates--University System (PR 6)

Without discussion, on motion by Mrs. Hayes, seconded by Mr. Black and passed, the President was authorized to confer upon each individual whose name appears on the list presented in PR 6 the degree to which he or she is entitled, upon certification by the Dean of Admissions and Registrar and approval by the University Senate, that the individual has satisfactorily completed all requirements for the degree for which application has been made. (See PR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

# M. Candidates for Degrees--Community College System (PR 7)

Acting on the recommendation of President Singletary, Mr. Homer Ramsey moved that approval be given to the awarding of degrees and certificates as specified to the persons named in PR 7. His motion was seconded by Mrs. Hermansdorfer and passed without dissent. (See PR 7 at the end of the Minutes.)

# N. Change of Departmental Name from Department of Theatre Arts to Department of Theatre (PR 8)

Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. McBrayer and passed, approval was given to change the name of the Department of Theatre Arts to the Department of Theatre. (See PR 8 at the end of the Minutes.)

#### O. Reestablishment of the Department of Mining Engineering (PR 9)

President Singletary recommended that the Department of Mining Engineering be reestablished as an educational unit in the College of Engineering, effective with the appointment of a Chairman or Acting Chairman of the Department. This recommendation has the approval of the College of Engineering and the Senate Council.

On motion by Dr. Hull, seconded by Mrs. Clark and passed, the reestablishment of the Department of Mining Engineering was approved. (See PR 9 at the end of the Minutes.)

#### P. Acceptance of Audit Reports (FCR 1)

Mr. Clay, Chairman of the Finance Committee, reported that the Finance Committee had met twice since the last Board meeting. The committee has three items to present to the Board for action, the first of which is the audit reports. The Finance Committee has reviewed the audit reports submitted by the firm of Arthur Andersen & Company, Certified Public Accountants, and found that they adequately reflect the financial position of the University. He then moved that the Board of Trustees accept the University of Kentucky Purchasing Compliance Letter, the University of Kentucky Cash Reconciliation and the summary audit report of the financial records of the University of Kentucky for the fiscal year 1979-80, consisting of the Accountant's Report from Arthur Andersen & Company, Balance Sheets, Statement of Current Funds Revenues, Expenditures and Transfers, Statement of Changes in Fund Balances, Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, and Notes to the Financial Statements. His motion was seconded by Mr. Kessinger and carried without dissent. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

#### Q. Land Exchange (FCR 2)

Mr. Clay said that the land exchange recommendation in FCR 2 is prompted by the desire of both the University and Kappa Kappa Gamma to improve their respective parking facilities. He then moved that the Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer be authorized to contract with Beta Chi of Kappa Kappa Gamma for the exchange of certain properties whereby the University would acquire from Kappa Kappa Gamma a portion of 238 East Maxwell Street and Kappa Kappa Gamma would acquire from the University a portion of 248 East Maxwell Street. His motion was seconded by Governor Chandler and passed without dissent. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

# R. Agreement with R. C. Durr and the Heirs of Hager Combs Concerning the Robinson Forest (FCR 3)

Mr. Clay explained that the Finance Committee had an additional item to recommend to the Board which was not included on the agenda. He said the Finance Committee feels that the proposed agreement in FCR 3 between the University of Kentucky, River Mining Company, R. C. Durr and the heirs of Hager Combs concerning the Robinson Forest is in the best interest of the University. He added that by this agreement the University is preserving the ongoing research in the Robinson Forest area and is preserving the ecological and natural integrity of the forest. Mr. Clay then asked Mr. Darsie to make a presentation to the Board which is a summation of the agreement before the Board.

Mr. Darsie explained that the University had acquired the Robinson Forest in separate conveyances from the E. C. Robinson Foundation in 1923 and 1930. He then stated that the University had for a period of approximately ten years resisted efforts to obtain strip mining permits in an adjacent area, comprised of approximately 6,000 acres and known as the Buckhorn watershed. He then stated, that in his opinion, the University could not realistically expect to prevent strip mining in the area to which the University does not claim title for an indefinite period of time. Mr. Darsie advised that in early 1980 the University had received notice that the heirs of Hager Combs claimed ownership of approximately 900 acres of land in the Robinson Forest, in the Cole's Fork area, and that R. C. Durr had filed applications for strip mining permits both within the boundaries of the Robinson Forest itself on the disputed 900 acres and in the Buckhorn watershed. Internal consultations have established that the water quality research being done in the Buckhorn watershed can be completed prior to March 1, 1982. He then presented to the Board for their consideration an agreement, attached as FCR 3, which provides (1) that the Combs heirs will quitclaim to the University the 900 acres in dispute, (2) that R. C. Durr will amend his mining permit application to delete any areas within the Robinson Forest, (3) that R. C. Durr and the River Mining Company will delay mining in the Buckhorn watershed until March 1, 1982, and (4) that the University will withdraw its protests to the mining applications sought by R. C. Durr and the River Mining Company.

The Chairman recognized Governor Chandler, who indicated he had some misgivings about the agreement. He then read a letter to President Singletary from Dr. Charles E. Barnhart, Dean of the College of Agriculture, in which Dean Barnhart acknowledged his support for the agreement. Governor Chandler said that, based largely upon Dean Barnhart's statement, he will support the agreement concerning Robinson Forest.

Following discussion, on motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Terry and passed, the Board approved the agreement between the University of Kentucky, River Mining Company, R. C. Durr and the heirs of Hager Combs and authorized the President of the University to execute same. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

# S. Meeting Adjourned

It having been determined that there was no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned at 2:52 p.m.

This action was requested by the Alumni Association Board of Directors in a resolution adopted at its annual summer workshop.

Recommendations: (1) that approval be given to the appointments and/or other staff changes which require Board action; and (2) that the report relative to appointments and/or changes already approved by the administration be accepted.

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE GOVERNING REGULATIONS

Recommendation: that the following proposed amendment to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky be received for preliminary consideration and, at the next regular or special meeting of the Board of Trustees, provided at least one month has elapsed, be included on the agenda for action.

(Note: Proposed deletion is bracketed; proposed addition is underlined.)

Amendment -- Change Part X.C.3.a (page 47) to read:

#### 3. Professional Practices

#### a. General Policies

[During their annual assignment period (whether academic year, ten months or twelve months), faculty and research staff members are expected to serve the University. It is assumed that all persons on the academic staff will be interested primarily in the work of their respective educational units, giving their chief efforts to the promotion of that work.

A member of the University's academic staff shall be permitted to engage, as an expert, in professional work outside the University and to receive pay for this activity, provided that such does not interfere with the proper performance of University assignments. Each faculty member shall be expected to exercise sound judgment in requesting approval of outside assignments, keeping in mind with utmost care the matter of conflict of interest. In considering such requests, the chief administrative officers of the educational units shall be guided by criteria through which performance of duty within a faculty member's rank is judged, as well as by the relevant terms of employment.

In general, any outside assignment demanding more than purely spare-time effort must be substantially justified in terms of the contribution its performance can bring to that faculty member's pursuit of teaching, research, and service.

All proposals to undertake outside assignments shall be made in writing to the chairmen whose recommendations shall be forwarded to the respective deans or directors and thence to the appropriate vice president for final action. Such proposals shall indicate the nature of the work to be performed, the estimated amount of time involved, the duration of the assignment,

and the scale of reimbursement. These proposals shall become a matter of of record by the appropriate vice president who shall transmit quarterly to the President of the University full information about those that have received approval and those that have been denied. The President, in turn, shall report periodically to the Board of Trustees.]

During the annual assignment period (whether academic year, ten months or twelve months), faculty and research staff members are expected to serve the University. It is assumed that all persons on the academic staff will be interested primarily in the work of their respective educational units, giving their chief efforts to the promotion of that work.

A member of the University's academic staff shall, under certain conditions, be permitted to engage, as an expert, in professional work (consulting or professional practice) outside the University and to receive pay for such endeavors. Conditions under which such work can be undertaken are as follows:

- (1) Such activities should not interfere with the fundamental responsibility of the faculty member to meet regularly assigned duties and obligations to teaching and research, including being regularly available to students and colleagues, which are normally expected of a full-time faculty member and for which the faculty member receives compensation from the University.
- (2) Such activities require prior approval in writing by appropriate University officials.

All proposals to undertake outside assignments shall be made in writing to the chairmen whose recommendations shall be forwarded to the respective deans or directors and thence to the appropriate vice president for final action. Such proposals shall indicate the nature of the work to be performed, the estimated amount of time involved, the duration of the assignment, and the scale of reimbursement. These proposals shall become a matter of record by the appropriate vice president who shall transmit quarterly to the President of the University full information about those that have received approval and those that have been denied. The President, in turn, shall report periodically to the Board of Trustees.

Requests should reflect specific rather than general assignments. Approvals shall not be granted for blanket authorizations to consult or to engage in professional practice.

- (3) Such activities shall be governed by time limitations stated in the Administrative Regulations (AR II-2.0-1).
- (4) Such activities must avoid creating a conflict of interest. Each faculty member shall be expected to exercise sound judgment in requesting approval of outside assignments, keeping in mind with utmost care the matter of conflict of interest and the duty to insure that such activities in no way compromise the position of the University.

While it is not possible to anticipate every factual situation which might give rise to a conflict of interest, it is the intent of this regulation to affirm the general proposition that no person can be expected to faithfully serve two masters, especially when the aims of the masters are divergent. More specifically, a conflict of interest does arise within the meaning of this regulation when a faculty member represents the interests of another party against the University or when a faculty member engages in litigation on behalf of another party against the University. Interpretations as to conflicts of interest in particular factual situations are to be made by the President of the University with the proviso that an adverse decision can be appealed to the Hearing Committee of the Board of Trustees.

In general, any outside assignment demanding more than purely spare-time effort must be substantially justified in terms of the contribution its performance can bring to the faculty member's pursuit of teaching, research, and service.

<u>Background</u>: The purpose of this amendment is to define more clearly the conditions under which professional work (consulting or professional practice) outside the University can be undertaken and to provide better clarification with respect to a conflict of interest.

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE GOVERNING REGULATIONS

Recommendation: that the following proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky which were received for preliminary consideration at the June 27, 1980 meeting of the Board of Trustees be approved.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined; proposed deletions are bracketed.)

First Amendment -- Change the title and first four paragraphs of Part XI.A (page 59) to read:

# A. University of Kentucky Student [Government] Association

The University of Kentucky Student [Government] Association is recognized by the Board of Trustees, administration, and the University Senate as the official student body authority in University matters to insure a maximum of self-governance and to create mutual respect and liaison between students and the faculty and administration. It shall provide services to the students, faculty, and administration of the University and represent student opinion to the faculty, administration, and the Board of Trustees. It may have responsibilities delegated to it by the President, the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs, and/or the University Senate.

The President of the University of Kentucky Student [Government] <u>Association</u> shall be considered to be the president of the student body of the University specified in KRS 164.130.

The University of Kentucky Student [Government] Association shall be representative of the student body of the University System of the University of Kentucky. It is authorized to develop rules for its composition and procedures which are consistent with rules and regulations of the University. Copies of these rules shall be supplied to all members of the student body of the University System, the Secretary of the University Senate, the Vice President for Student Affairs, the President of the University, and the Secretary of the Board of Trustees.

For purposes of budget and other matters relating to finance, the University of Kentucky Student [Government] <u>Association</u> is responsible to an administrative officer designated by the President.

Background: This change has been recommended by the University of Kentucky Student Government. The current name of this official student body authority does not properly reflect the student body authority's function, which is the advocacy of student interest and opinion rather than the regulation of student life. Accuracy is not the only reason for this proposed change; the word "government" has negative connotations to many students. The resulting erroneous attitude keeps many students from supporting Student Government.

Second Amendment -- Change the first paragraph of Part XIV (page 65) to read:

These Governing Regulations may be amended at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Trustees provided at least one month has elapsed between proposal of the amendment(s) and final passage. The President, or the University Senate or the Senate of the Community College System, or the Student [Government] Association or the Inter-Community College Student Council, through the President, may recommend amendments of the Governing Regulations to the Board. The President, the University Senate and/or the Senate of the Community College System, and the Student [Government] Association and/or the Inter-Community College Student Council, as appropriate shall have an opportunity to recommend on all amendments before final action by the Board.

Reestablishment of the Department of Mining Engineering

Recommendation: The Department of Mining Engineering be reestablished as an educational unit in the College of Engineering, effective with the appointment of a Chairman or Acting Chairman of the Department.

Background: Education in Mining Engineering has long been a part of the academic offerings of the University. In the very early years there was a College of Mining Engineering and later a Department of Mining Engineering. Still later, this was merged with Metallurgy to form a Department of Mining and Metallurgical Engineering. As enrollments dropped to near zero, the degree programs were suspended and Mining Engineering was offered as an option in the Civil Engineering Department. Because of increased student interest, the Baccalaureate Degree Program was reactivated in 1977 and the Master's Degree Program in 1978. Enrollments have now increased to the point where the reestablishment of a separate Department of Mining Engineering is desirable. This recommendation has the approval of the College of Engineering and the Senate Council.

#### AGREEMENT

This Agreement between the University of Kentucky; River Mining Company; R. C. Durr; and Dovie Combs, James C. Combs, Carrie Combs, Charles A. Combs, Nancy Combs, Thomas E. Combs, Janice Combs, Mary E. Hudson, Andrew Hudson, Cora M. Stivers, Forrest Stivers, Price F. Combs, Judy Combs, Ruth J. McClees, and Danny McClees (hereinafter referred to as the "Combs Heirs") is entered into on this the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 1980;

WHEREAS the Combs Heirs claim fee simple title to the tract of land consisting of 5000 acres more or less located in Knott County, Kentucky and shown as Tracts A and B on the appended map; and

WHEREAS, the University of Kentucky claims title in fee simple to a portion thereof consisting of 900 acres more or less shown as Tract B on the appended map.

WHEREAS, the Combs Heirs have entered into a lease with R. C. Durr for the latter to mine the coal contained in Tracts A and B which lease has been assigned for mining purposes to River Mining Company and pursuant to which River Mining Company has applied to the Kentucky Department for Natural Resources and Environmental Protection for five interim program permits numbered 060-0047 to 060-0051 to engage in surface coal mining operations to which the University of Kentucky has filed with said Department formal objections to the issuance of said permits, and River Mining Company proposes to apply to said Department for permanent program permits in the future;

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of the mutual promises herein:

1. The Combs Heirs shall, on or before September 22, 1980, convey to the University of Kentucky by quitclaim deed all their

right, title and interest in and to Tract B, reserving to the Combs Heirs all rights to Oil and Gas minerals in Tract B, and the University of Kentucky shall permit the Combs Heirs or their licensees access to the lands in Tract B for purposes of exploration and development of said oil and gas rights.

- 2. The University of Kentucky shall withdraw its objections to the issuance of the pending mining permit applications enumerated hereinabove prior to September 24, 1980, and shall not reinstitute same or any other similar objections to present or future proposed mining ventures initiated by River Mining Company or R. C. Durr on the Combs Heirs lands in Tract A before the Department for Natural Resources and Environmental Protection or any other governmental body or court.
- 3. The University of Kentucky shall not thereafter contest or aid others in contesting the Combs Heirs claims to fee simple title to the lands in Tract A.
- 4. R. C. Durr and River Mining Company agree that River Mining Company shall amend its permit applications for Permit 060-0049 and Permit 060-0051 so as to omit therefrom all lands contained in Tract B, and that he and/or it will not, in his or their own right or by or through any corporation, subsidiary or other entity, owned or controlled, in whole or in part, directly or indirectly by R. C. Durr or River Mining Company or his or its heirs, successors or assigns hereafter seek permits from any state or federal entity on lands in Tract B and will schedule mining operations so as to first mine under Permit 060-0047 and, absent the prior approval of the University of Kentucky, will postpone mining operations on the remaining permits until March 1, 1982.
- 5. R. C. Durr shall acknowledge that his lease to mine the coal on the Combs Heirs property is applicable only to the land in Tract A, and R. C. Durr shall commence mining promptly upon issuance of the permits enumerated herein.

- 6. The parties shall conseratively undertake to establish the fair market value of the lands and minerals conveyed in Tract B.
- 7. This Agreement shall become effective when duly executed by the parties following approval by the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky and this Agreement shall be formally submitted for this approval by the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky at its meeting on September 16, 1980.
