# NEH FELLOWSHIPS

The Division of Fellowships and Seminars is concerned that scholars at museums, historical societies and research libraries may not be aware of their eligibility for the various programs of the Division. NEH Fellowships support six to twelve months of full-time, uninterrupted study and research that will make significant contributions to the humanities.

While NEH Fellowships cannot be used to catalogue or organize collections or to prepare exhibitions, they can be used to work on books, monographs, series of articles, series of public or scholarly lectures and presentations, and interpretative catalogues to accompany exhibitions. Work which is not eligible for fellowship support may, however, be eligible through programs in the Division of General Programs, the Division of Research Programs, and the Office of Preservation Programs.
