The advantages and disadvantages of an tonomic government have been set out many times by its friends and foes. Recently comes to light, however, the greatest instance of the pow-

light, however, the greatest instance of the pow-er which is at the disposal of a dictator and the manner in which he can misuse it. Published in an anti-Facist journal in Paris and translated by The Manchester Guardian were a list of secret instructions sent by Musolini to all newspapers of Italy, in which rules were laid down as to just what the press of that country could and could not comment upon. It was indicated that these instructions are being sent in short, regular intervals to all news-papers. No doubt such a plan was formulated to lessen any chance of Musolini's demise of power as a result of the Ethiopian campaign.

and dogmatic and leave no chance whatever for
the individual editor to use his own judgment
as to what should be printed in his own publication. Some examples are: February 15–(1) Attentuate the Blum affair and the disbanding of the French Fascist Leagues; (2) Cut down messages from abroad; (3) No interest to be shown in the oil embargo; (4) Nothing more to be said about the Stress Front and the watch on




