FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

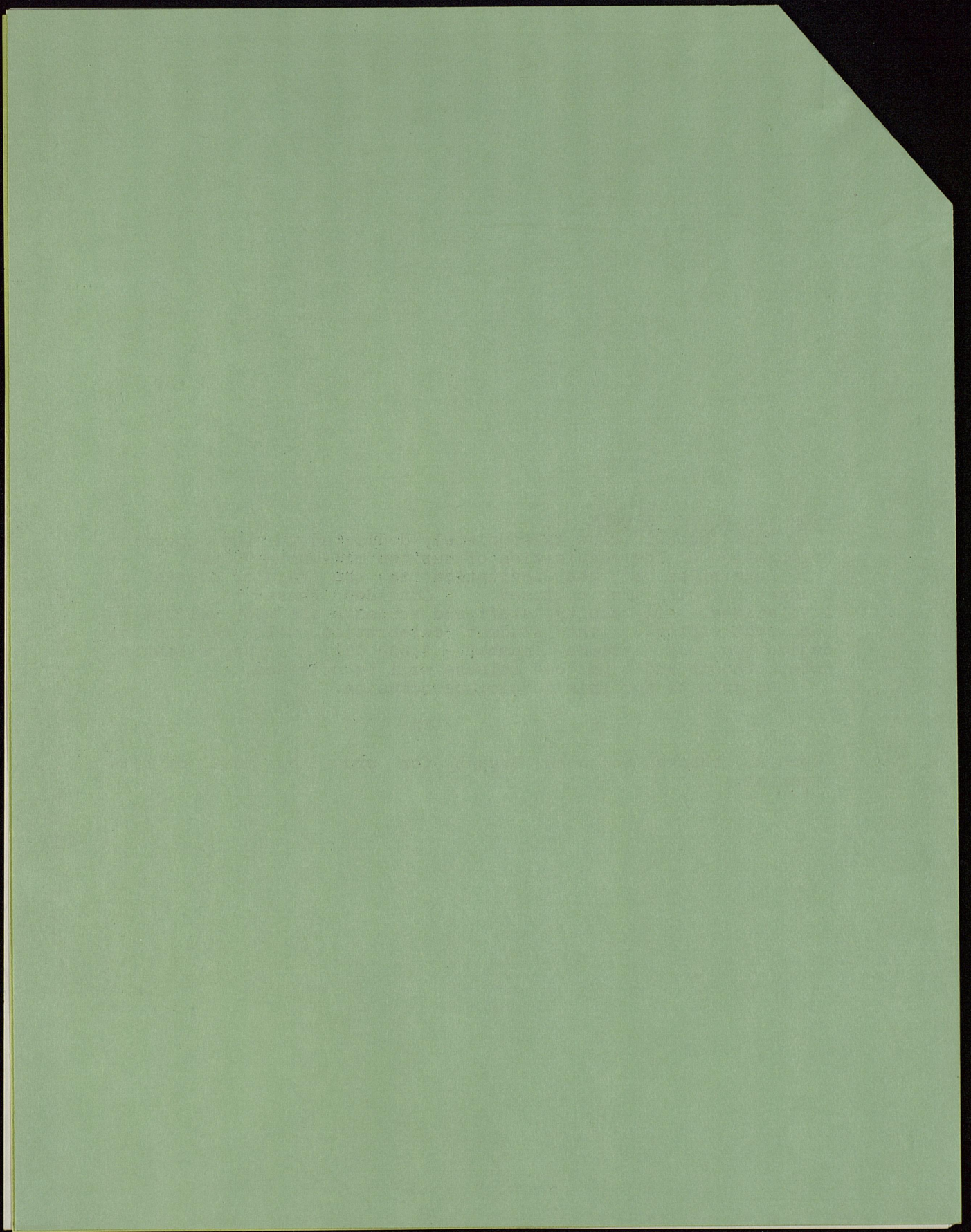
This special issue is completely dedicated to the upcoming celebration of the acquisition of our two millionth volume.

Do join us for this auspicious occasion.

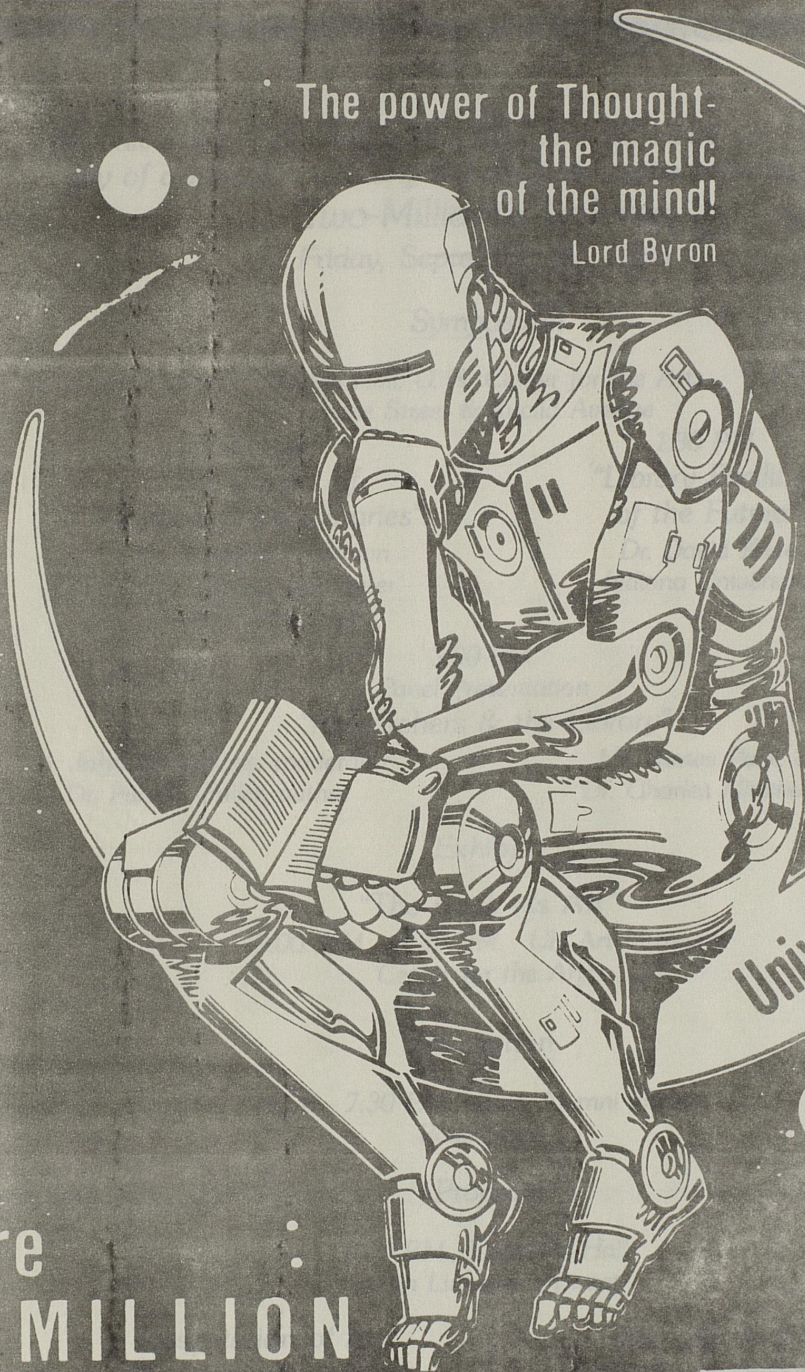
