ACCIDENT EXPERIENCE:

The secretary reported that one disabling injury occurred last week. He said only one no-lost-time case was reported during the week. Reports of the following two cases were read and discussed:

W. S. Mackey, carpenter - General Outside, 12-29, Penalty

Walter Spencer, coal loader - Section 2, 12-30, N.L.T.

The safety inspector described the accident to W. S. Mackey and pointed out that Mackey was evidently not paying strict attention to the work he was doing. He said the saw was dull which made it necessary to push the board which was being cut with considerable force. Mr. Luke reminded the foremen that defective and dull tools were responsible for a number of accidents. He requested them to bring this to the attention of all workmen in the mine as often as possible.

Mr. Sniddie described the accident to Walter Spencer and pointed out that some collars had been set in this place and there was very little clearance over the top of the car he was loading.
