We have 102 miners in at No. 1 and 105 day men. We are still short an average of about 40 miners per day at this mine. I attribute this shortage to our men not getting back and to the miners laying idle throughout the district having a certain influence on the men who left here.

Our coke yard is in fair shape this morning and we will get about 180 ovens.

At No. 2 mine we have 61 loaders working and 62 day men. We should get between eleven and twelve hundred tons per day from No. 1 mine and about seven hundred from No. 2 mine.

I do not have any information relative to what the balance of the district is doing this morning and will give you report on the condition in the Harlan field tomorrow.

Practically all the men we have in town that are able to work are working.
