MEDICAL, SURGICAL AND HOSPITAL EXPENSE
CALENDAR YEAR 1918
ON ACCOUNT OF INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENTS

It has been customary for this department to make up a statement each year, showing compensation paid on account of industrial accidents, i. e. accidents which occur to employes arising out of and in the course of employment. We desire this year to ascertain how compensation which was paid for the calendar year 1918 compares with medical, surgical and hospital expense at your plant for the same period. (We desire to have only that part of medical, surgical and hospital expense which was incurred because of works accidents.)

This will include salary, or proportion of salary of physician or surgeon which is charged against the works on account of industrial accidents; salary or proportion of salary of nurse, which is properly chargeable against the works because of industrial accidents; hospital bills incurred because of industrial accidents; outside doctor bills incurred because of industrial accidents; dental bills incurred because of industrial accidents; expense incurred because of bandages, medicines and supplies properly chargeable against the works because of industrial accidents; salary of clerk, if clerk is used entirely by works surgeon for keeping his records, but do not include the salary of any of the clerks working in the Claim Department. Salary of surgeons or nurses or other expense which is charged against the E.B.A. should not be included in the statement.

You will probably also be interested in knowing what this expense is and to see how medical, surgical and hospital expense that the works will pay on account of accidents for the calendar year 1918 compares with your actual compensation which will be paid because of accidents occurring during the calendar year 1918.

The total expense along the lines suggested is all that this office cares for, unless you see fit to send us an itemized statement.
