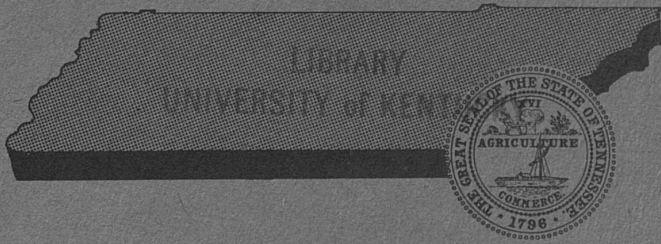

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FOREWORD

In time of national emergency, such as the present, inventories of maps serve a twofold purpose. The preparation of accurate and adequate maps involves expenses which may be justified only by the amount of valuable and repeated use made of them. Widespread information on the availability of maps will do much to speed the progress of work in many lines, since the time as well as the expense of preparing new maps can be saved. In addition to eliminating unnecessary duplication involving expenditures of limited funds and time, map inventories also enable various war and defense agencies to make use of current information on all phases of the State's resources, including mineral, property, transportation, communication and similar facilities. Unquestionably, one of the greatest needs at the present time is more complete information on these tools and resources, now at our command. This volume is being issued as a tentative opening of that vast, almost untouched, field.

Eventually a complete inventory of maps in this State will be prepared, and it is hoped that every depository of maps and map collections will be listed in it and subsequent revisions, advising as additional or new maps become available. The Tennessee State Planning Commission, for example, is continually adding maps to its files. The publication of supplements to this Preliminary Inventory, with the listing of all other maps prepared locally or by Federal and State agencies, will increase considerably the utilization of these maps.

Although maps are generally prepared for specific purposes, they frequently can be used as base maps for purposes other than those originally intended. Inter-related planning subjects and projects are often studied advantageously by super-imposing one map pattern on that of another. New relationships and trends, presenting a composite picture which can be studied and analyzed, will thus be indicated, and solutions for the problems prepared.

PREFACE

This Preliminary Inventory of Maps is exactly what its title indicates: a preliminary report upon map collections which had been inventoried and on which field schedules were prepared by the Tennessee Historical Records Survey before its discontinuance in April 1942. A few of these entries have been included in the county inventories published by the Tennessee Survey, but the great majority represent unpublished items.

This Inventory is designed to make available at the present time whatever information has been compiled concerning various map collections in the State. It is intended that a complete overall Inventory of maps in offices of State and other county officials will be issued as a sequel. Field work of inventorying and describing such map collections is now being conducted by this project.

The work was suggested by the Tennessee State Planning Commission as a definite aid to war, defense, and State agencies in presenting information on extant maps. It was, for example, only through an incidental survey of maps by the Tennessee Historical Records Survey in Gibson County that maps were located to enable an orderly acquisition of land for use by the Wolf Creek Ordnance Plant. Intelligent planning for Civilian Defense is practically impossible without access to maps. It is obvious that maps of abandoned sewer lines and power conduits, roads, utilities, rivers and channels, and tunnels and bridges can all be of vital necessity in times of emergency. Maps are technically essential to the improvement, defense, and welfare of any given locality and, therefore, of especial importance in these times.

Information concerning mapping programs of the older and more established governmental agencies may be secured although war and national defense work are calling heavily upon the experienced staffs of these agencies. The demand for maps is such that little time and insufficient personnel are available in which to prepare accurately the specific area maps for which the war and defense programs have created a demand. Mapping programs of emergency agencies and new bureaus are subject to changes, due to the experimental bases on which the programs are started, lack of trained mapping personnel, and other causes.

At times mapping programs have been initiated, only to be discontinued because of lack of adequate base maps or mapping data, or of continued appropriations to carry on the work, determination that the mapping program was not necessary and either duplicated or failed to supplement existing information, or lack of trained personnel. Many inadequacies in county and city maps and surveys exist, as will be determined in the use of this and subsequent inventories by mapping technicians of government agencies who receive copies for reference and study.

Preface

Each entry in this book represents a map series, whether it be one item or fifty, drawn from the field description of the maps examined by project workers. In several cases, standard recheck procedures and techniques were not applied to the records and some descriptions in this book are based upon preliminary field inventories. The entries are arranged alphabetically by title under the county in which the map was located. This volume also contains abbreviations and explanatory notes and an index. Not all counties are represented herein, only those in which the Tennessee Historical Records Survey operated.

The original field inventories were made by a considerable number of project employees under the supervision of James E. Davis, Edith L. Pierce, and Arch Paidloy, Jr. Editing of the entries was done by Beatrice O. Kannon and the index was prepared by Elliott S. Ford. Typing of the book and cutting of stencils was done by Virginia H. Sibert, Marie P. Stewart, Eleanor Waters, and Mary B. Morel, and mimeographing by Sue S. Jones. Compilation of this book and its publication were under supervision of the undersigned.

The field work for this volume was conducted under general supervision of Madison Bratton as State Supervisor of the Tennessee Historical Records Survey. Both the Tennessee Survey and the present project have been under the general administrative supervision of Mrs. Betty Hunt Luck, State Director of the Service Division, and T. Marshall Jones, former Section Chief of War Services.

Acknowledgment of cooperation is due all county officials whose records are listed herein. Particular acknowledgment is made to William D. Price and Dennis W. Eagan of the Tennessee State Planning Commission for valuable suggestions and criticisms, and to Winston Marshall of the Tennessee State Planning Commission for the cover design.

Explanatory Notes

In this book each entry represents a map or map series. Each entry is arranged alphabetically under the county in which the map was found.

The actual record title as it appears on the map or map container is given in the entry in upper case letters, but if this exact title is misleading, vague, or otherwise inadequate, an assigned explanatory title is

inserted in lower case letters enclosed in parentheses. If a map has no title, and it has thus become necessary to assign one, the assigned title is in upper case letters and is enclosed in parentheses. The current or most recent title of a series is used as the entry title.

The years for which a map series is available are shown immediately following the title. The use of a hyphen between two dates indicates the inclusive years for which a series is available. A single date followed by two hyphens indicates that the series is current and dates from the year given. Dates are broken to indicate years for which a record was not made or could not be located. If it was not conclusively established that a record was actually discontinued at the last date shown in the entry, no statement of discontinuance is made. Labeling of the container is shown in parentheses after the quantity.

Where two or more containers or records are considered in a single entry, the quantity is shown in chronological order insofar as possible.

Also given, following the description of the maps or map collection, are the name of the draftsman when known, the publisher, if any, whether the item is printed, handwritten or typed, the scale, size, and location of the maps. Location of all offices are in the respective county court-houses, unless otherwise indicated.
