Organ harvest faces ridicule rather than respect

Imagine being the parent of a child who has just died. You're in a daze, not sure really what to think or what to do. Then on top of it all you later discover that organs and other body parts were stripped from the body of your little boy or girl without your consent. For hundreds of British parents in Liverpool, this nightmarish scenario has become a reality

has become a reality.

Last month, a government report was released detailing how pathologists at the Alder Hey Hospital in Liverpool had committed the grievous crimes, which involved 2000 dead children.

We at the Kernel are appalled and sickened by the lack of professionalism displayed by these pathologists. While a lot of good surely came from the harvested organs and body parts, that doesn't erase the fact that what was done was wrong.

Typically, if someone dies, people do not just swoop in and take their personal effects without asking the permission of their survivors. In the case of something as intimate and personal as organs and body parts, this level of respect shown to both the living and the dead should especially not be compromised. dead should especially not be compromised.

What is even worse about the situation is that since the release of the report, organ donations and organ transplant operations have dropped drastically in various parts of Britain.

Sir Magdi Yacoub, a heart surgeon at the Royal Brompton Hospital said in the London Times on Sunday, "There are a large number of patients who will almost certainly die if this trend continues."

There is a serious pressure on the medical professionals in Britain to restore the faith of the general public in their health system. British Health Secretary Alan Milburne has called an emergency summit to deal with the issue, which we feel is a step in the right direction.

Regardless of how the public feels toward the medical profession

Regardless of how the public feels toward the medical profession currently, however, they should not stop donating organs. People live and die based on whether or not they get a new heart, liver or other body part. No matter how disgusted they may be with the current situation, Britains should not let go of their basic responsibility to their fellow man: That of continuing life. CONTACT



they te canning the ongest orga-tized drug bust in Kentucky histological people were ar-rested Tuesday and Wednesday on charges of trafficking in OxyContin or obtaining the drug through deception.

The prescription painkiller, known as Oxy or OC among users, is intended for cancer victims or others suffer-ing from severe pain. It can sell illegally for up to 8100 a pill. Perice may be a big part of the reason the drug is flourishing in an economically depressed region like eastern Kentucky. Law enforcement officials say those with legitimate prescrip-tions may decide they need the money more than the drug.

"What happens is they'll re-alize there is money making po-tential in their prescriptions, said Pikeville police Chie James usbridge. To one of those people, a little extra mon-

selling drugs in the history of Nentucley makes a difference."

Justice also said prescription drug abuse isn't viewed as so said prescription drug abuse isn't viewed as so sliegal drugs. "It seems like it doesn't have the same social stigma as snorting occaine or smoking marijuana." he said.

U.S. Attorney Joseph Famularo said drug users in eastern Kentucky have been crushing the pills into powder and snorting it, or diluting it for injection.

"It's like the purest form of

jection.
"It's like the purest form of heroin I've ever done." Rob Ramundo, formerly a photographer for a Chicago-based men's magazine, told The Cincinnati Enquirer in a story published this week. "Absolutely, it was just as addictive."

Ramundo, 29, is serving a four-year term at the Chillicothe Correctional Institution near Columbus, Ohio, for robbing six pharmacies in suburban Cincinnati last spring. In Kentucky, Hazzard police Chief Rod Maggard said he be-lieves 96 percent of the thefts in his town are committed by peo-ple addicted to the drug.

Justice said his department lso investigating burglaries

is also investigating burglaries at six pharmacles where Oxy-Contin was stolen.

He said police in Pikeville have worked about 200 cases in the past year in which people have altered their prescriptions to get more of the pills.

Miami mayor charged with battery

Busted: Mayor arrested for throwing a teapot at his wife

MIAMI - Miami Mayor Joe Carollo was arrested Wednesday and charged with battery after he threw a terra-cotta teapot at his wife's head, police said

Carollo was denied an emergency bond hearing Wednesday evening and was to spend the night in jail before attending the hearing Thursday afternoon.

Lawyers for Carollo and his wife, Maria Ledon Carollo, argued that Mrs. Carollo didn't want to pursue charges against her husband.

"Mayor Carollo has been singled out for much more serious treatment because of who he is," said Ben Kuehne, Carollo's attorney.

He read a statement from Mrs. Carollo that said, "Under no crumstances did my husband intend to harm or injure me."

Mrs. Carollo at first wanted to press charges against her husband but later changed her mind, said Miami police Lt. Bill Schwartz. Police decided to file charges anyway.

The Miami Police Department has a very ag-sive domestic violence policy,"

Schwartz said.

Carollo, 45, was charged with simple battery, a misdemeanor, because police decided the teapor was not a deadly weapon, Schwartz said. He could face up to a year in the county jail if convicted.

But Carollo, who has no prior record, likely won't see jail time, said Ed Griffith, a state attorney's office spokesman.

"For most first-time domestic violence offenses... If there is an agreement between the victim and the defendant, this could go into a diversion program, with counseling and anger control classes to avoid any escalation of violence." Griffith said.

Carollo had two scratches behind his left ear but Mrs. Carollo, 42, was not charged because "Mayor Carollo was the aggressor." Schwartz said.
