







Constitution

ARTICLE I-Name

This organization shall be known as The Woman's Club of Richmond, Kentucky.

ARTICLE II—Object

The object of this club shall be to create among women an organized center of thought and action, for the promotion of social, educational, literary and artistic growth of whatever relates to the best interests of the community.

ARTICLE III—Officers

Sec. 1. The officers of this club shall be a President, First and Second Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.

2. The duties of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the Club, to act as Chairman of the Executive Committee, to fill all vacancies occurring in subordinate offices, and to call a meeting of the Club whenever the Executive Committee thinks necessary.

Sec. 3. The duties of the First Vice-president shall be to fulfill the duties of the President in case of the absence or disability of that officer, and to act as a member of the Executive Committee.

Sec. 4. The duties of the Second Vice-president shall be to fulfill the duties of President or the First Vice-president in case of the absence or disability of both of these officers.

Sec. 5. The duties of the Secretary shall be to keep a permanent record of all the proceedings of the Club, to read at each business meeting of the Club the minutes of the previous meeting, and to act as a member of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV—Committee

The Executive Committee shall consist of the officers of the Club, together with the Chairmen of the different departments, and the standing committees.

ARTICLE V—Elections

Officers shall be elected by ballot at the last meeting in March and take their offices at the next meeting.

ARTICLE VI

Majority of members present shall be considered a quorum.

ARTICLE VII

The appointment of committees shall be in the hands of the President.

By.Laws

- 1. There shall be an annual tax of One Dollar for each member and for each associate member.
 - 2. Dues must be paid by the first meeting in April.
 - 3. Papers shall be limited to ten minutes.
- 4. Each meeting shall be limited to two hours, opening promptly at 2:30 and closing at 4:30.
- 5. In emergency the expenditure of funds of the Club shall be left to the President, Treasurer, and two of the Executive Board.
- 6. The business year of the Club shall end with the election of officers and the new year begin with the first meeting in April, when the annual dues shall be paid.

Chart of Motions

In the Order of Their Precedence

To fix the time to adjourn—(Debatable if no other question before the house; can be amended and reconsidered.)

To adjourn—(Not debatable; can be amended and reconsidered; cannot be repeated without intervening business.)

Questions of privilege—(To be decided by chair, subject to appeal.)

For orders of the day—(Undebatable.)
