#### That SGA Surplus Can Still Be Put To Work

Still Be Put To Work

It was somewhat of a disappointment to learn Wednesday morning that the Student Legislature had defeated—by a margin of one tower—the bill to establish a loan fund from SGA treasury surplus left over from last year. We had hardly thought the proposed act would pass without certain alterations being made, but we did believe there were enough members favoring the idea in general to insure the installation of some sound plan for student help.

What happened, apparently, was the fault of the rules committee, which failed to iron out the flaws in the measure, thus assuring its acceptability to a majority of those present. The result was that the bill took on the appearance of being "railroaded" legislation, the aim of which was rendered unclear.

As a matter of fact, THI KERNEL has never regarded the establishment of a loan fund as the best way possible to invest this money. The amount is not large enough to be used as principal, and the possibility of successful administration is lessened by the transient nature of the SGA membership.

A much safer risk, and, it seems to us, a by far worse needed aid, is the establishment of a scholarship fund—a thing which we have suggested previously be set up. Such a plan would provide for the recognition of ability and effort on the part of deserving underclassmen by the

provide for the recognition of ability and effort on the part of deserving underclassmen by the awarding of scholarships amounting to tuition costs for one semester.

The present surplus could be used as a starter for such an undertaking, and, if the project be found satisfactory, a portion of the SGA income (which each year thus far has exceeded budgetary appropriations by at least \$1,000), could be set aside annually to cover the cost of those searchs.
