

INCORPORATED TOWNS AND CITIES IN KENTUCKY:

Population in Places of 1,000 or More, 1900-50

The location of various towns and cities has been determined to a large extent by the resources and facilities that encourage the development of commerce and industry. Among these are breaks in transportation lines, location of natural resources, and market potentialities. Likewise, these and similar factors govern the growth and development of cities. The rapid expansion of industry, major strides in technology, mechanization of farms, and related developments have caused major population shifts from rural to urban areas.¹

This cityward movement of the population has been strikingly evident in population studies in Kentucky. During the past half-century (1900-50)² the urban population increased 132 percent, compared with an 11 percent increase in the rural population. The urban population in the state in 1900 accounted for 22 percent of the total population, while 39 percent of the total population was urban in 1950. Even with this large percentage of the population living in urban areas, Kentucky is far more rural than the United States as a whole. In the nation, 60 percent of the total population was urban in 1950.

In order to reveal more clearly the major areas of urban growth in Kentucky, between 1900 and 1950, the development of incorporated towns

and cities, with a population of 1,000 or more in 1950, during the past half century is traced in the following tables. There were 148 such places in 1950, and 15 of them had a population of more than 10,000. Louisville was the only city at that time having a population of more than 100,000.

Table 1 shows the total number of persons living in such places, grouped according to economic areas.¹ Incorporated towns and cities having 1,000 or more persons in eight of the 13 metropolitan and non-metropolitan economic areas more than doubled their population during the 50-year span. The state as a whole approximately doubled its population in such places during the same period.

The 3 metropolitan areas, which cover an area of only 4 counties, accounted for almost one-half of the total population gained in the incorporated places. The state gain during the half-century was 553,000, and the 3 metropolitan areas had a combined gain of 256,000. Jefferson County alone (Metropolitan Area A) accounted for almost one-third of the total state gain in population in incorporated places of 1,000 or more population.

Among the nonmetropolitan economic areas, the Cumberland Plateau (Economic Area 9) had the largest increase from both a percentage and a numerical standpoint. More than five times as many people in this economic area lived in incorporated places of 1,000 or more in 1950 than lived in these same places in 1900. The development of the eastern coal fields no doubt accounted for a major portion of this phenomenal growth.



The smallest gain in population of incorporated towns and cities, among both metropolitan and nonmetropolitan economic areas, during the 50-year period was made by Economic Area 6 (Outer Bluegrass Area).

According to Table 2, only 9 of the 148 incorporated towns and cities, having a population of 1,000 or more in 1950, gained as much as 10,000 in population during the half-century. Louisville, as is to be expected, led in this respect with a gain of 164,000. Lexington was next with a 29,000 gain, and Ashland, Covington, and Owensboro followed with gains of more than 20,000. Paducah had a gain of 13,000 and Bowling Green, Middlesborough, and Fort Thomas gained a little more than 10,000 during the period. Six of the 148 places had slight losses between 1900 and 1950.

There were 15 cities in Kentucky in 1950 with a population of more than 10,000 (Table 3). Their total population at that time amounted to 724,147, which represented 65 percent of the total population of all incorporated places of 1,000 or over. Fourteen of these 15 cities, all except Fort Thomas, were incorporated prior to 1900. In 1900 the 14 cities (excluding Fort Thomas) had a total population of 389,482, which was 70 percent of the total population of all incorporated towns and cities with a population of 1,000 or more. This indicates that a larger proportion of the population in towns and cities was concentrated in the major cities in 1900 than in 1950.

Louisville and Lexington are the only two cities for which census data are available for 1790. It is interesting to note that Lexington was larger than Louisville until the 1830 census. From that

period on Louisville grew much more rapidly than Lexington, gaining 90,000 in the next 40 years, while Lexington gained 9,000.

Table 4 shows the incorporated towns and cities arranged according to their size in 1950, and grouped in specified population classes. In addition to the 15 cities, previously discussed, with a population of more than 10,000, there were 20 incorporated places with between 5,000 and 10,000 population in 1950. At that time there were 33 such places with a population of 2,500 to 5,000 and 80 places between 1,000 and 2,500 population.

In 1950, 1,109,233 persons lived in incorporated towns and cities having a population of 1,000 or more. In other words, approximately 40 percent of Kentucky's population, in 1950, lived in incorporated places of 1,000 or more persons. Sixty-five percent (724,000 persons) of those living in these places in 1950 lived in cities of more than 10,000 population. Thirteen percent (141,000 persons) of those living in these towns and cities lived in places of 5,000 to 10,000 population. Incorporated towns and cities with a population between 2,500 and 5,000 had 121,000 inhabitants, in 1950, or 11 percent of the population in places of 1,000 or more, while 123,000 persons (also 11 percent) lived in places of 1,000 to 2,500.
