

In April, an Emery overnight package containing \$1,000 for the father of men's baskethall recruit Chris Mills came open in transit and opened a Pandora's box of allegations of impropriety against the UK men's baskethall program. 

Roberts placed a large tape player at the edge of the jury box during his opening statement and played two tape-recorded interieves between Miller and Michael York, then a Herald-Leader reporter.

Roberts said he will show that Warford has been black-listed in coaching and lost more than-\$100,000 in wages because of the ar-ticle. He has trouble paying his bills, Roberts said.

\$500,000 worth of damage done to UK water tower

About \$500,000 worth of damage was done to the main cooling tower for the UK Chandler Medical Center when it burned down Monday, according to the hospital's chief operating officer.

Police responded to the fire with six engine companies shortly after 3 p.m. Monday, said Gary McComas, Lexington fire chief. McComas said the said the blaze was extinguished by 3:30 p.m.

No one was injured in the fire, which was caused by a welding accident.

The safety to patients and employees was not a severe problem," said William Massir, chief operating officer of the UK hospital. Massie said no one was evacuated from the UK medical center.

have any definite plans at this time, Massie said. 

Explosive ruptured fuselage, downing Pan Am flight 103

LONDON — The bomb that blew up Pan Am Flight 103 ruptured the fuselage in the area of the cargo hold just ahead of the wing, and probably contained Semtex plastic explosives, authorities said yester-day

"Initial examinations have estab-ished that the explosive device ruptured the fuselage on the left side in the area of the No. I cargo-baggage hold just forward of the wing," said a bulletin from the Air Accidents Investigation Branch. It did not say what explosives were used, but Transport Secretary Paul Channon said it was very probably, but not certainly, Sem-tex."

The authorities did not disclose now they arrived at their conclu-

sit is.

Semtex, made in Czechoslovakia, is a powerful plastic explosive that is difficult to detect and is believed to be available to several terrorist groups.

The indications that Semtex was used "point to some well-organized and well-supplied terrorist group," Channon told Parliament.

Although Czechoslovakia denied it was Semtex that blew up Flight 103 on Dec. 21, it is sending four ex-perts to Britain to assist the inves-tigation. Foreign Office Minister

william Waldegrave said they would arrive today and Thursday. Flight 103 blew up at 31,000 feet, killing all 259 people on board and 11 on the ground in Lockerbie, the Scottish town that bore the brust of the falling debris.

Channon rejected accusations that the government refrained from warning the public of a bomb threat against Pan Am. Referring to evidence that U.S. embassies were warned of a specific threat to blow up a Pan Am flight from Franktur to London, he said such warnings were constantly being the said that the said such warning were constantly being the said such warning were constantly being the said that the said in the para the said the British were given to understand that the threat "had little credibility."

Channon said the warning

Channon said the warning reached his department Dec. 9 in a Federal Aviation Administration bulletin, and "as is usually the case, it contained the explicit cav-eat that it was not to be further dis-seminated without the specific ap-

proval of the FAA's Director of Civil Aviation Security."

The warning identified the airline and the Frankfurt-US route, he said, but "no mention was made of London. And the warning threat-ened that an attack would take place within two weeks, which expired before the tragedy took place on Dec. 21."

Therefore, he said, it was decided that security at British airports was tight enough and no further measures were needed.

Immediately after the bombing, additional hold and cabin baggage checks were ordered, along with tighter security around parked aircraft, he said.

On Jan. 5, further measures were ordered "in relation to cargo, misrouted baggage and cabin baggage," he said without elaborating. He added that other longer-term routed baggage and cabin baggage, "he said without elaborating. He added that other longer-term ty pursued."

Channon promised to consider a suggestion by lawmaker Michael Colvin that every air ticket carry a \$1 levy to raise \$180 million a year for better security systems.



Bradley J. Shipman, a 20-year-old former UK student, was sentenced to five years in prison in connection with a drunken-driving accident. On Sept. 7, Shipman crashed his convertible Camaro IROC². Into a telephone pole near campus. UK junior Lisa Whalen, a passenger in the car, died of head injuries shortly after the accident. Michael Thomas Swerzeck, also a UK junior, was ejected from the car's back seat and is now being cared for at St. Joseph Hospital.

Shipman, who was not hurt in the accident, was found guilty on charges of second-degree manslaughter, second-degree assault and drunken driving in Fayette Circuit Court in December. He was sentenced to serve two concurrent five-year terms.






