It was also resolved that a student of any other College, other than the "A. C. C.", be not allowed to occupy a room on these grounds, unless special permission be given him.

November 4

The Faculty met in Col. Whittier's Office at 10 o'clock.

Mr. D. Taylor was present, charged by Col. Whittier with refusing to obey an order issued by Maj. Thebault. The evidence in the case being insufficient to establish the charge it was withdrawn.

Mr. Thompson, acting as Superintendent of the Farm, was present and stated ^{that} the students in the Labor department were unwilling to work longer without receiving the money due them. In consequence of a resolution, passed by the Executive Committee,

directing that the farm should be rented for the present year, this Faculty did not know in what relation the labor department ^{stands} stood to the A.M. College, and hence what jurisdiction should be exercised, by the Faculty, over the students in the labor department.

In Mr. Thompson's opinion an attempt to force the boys to work before receiving the money due them would result in an open rebellion, the Faculty therefore thought it prudent to suspend the working department till a meeting of the Executive Committee can be had to define for us our authority, if any, over the labor department. A resolution, suspending the working department till the above mentioned time, was then passed.

The Faculty then adjourned, any further consideration of these matters till Friday ^{Nov. 5th} 5th.
