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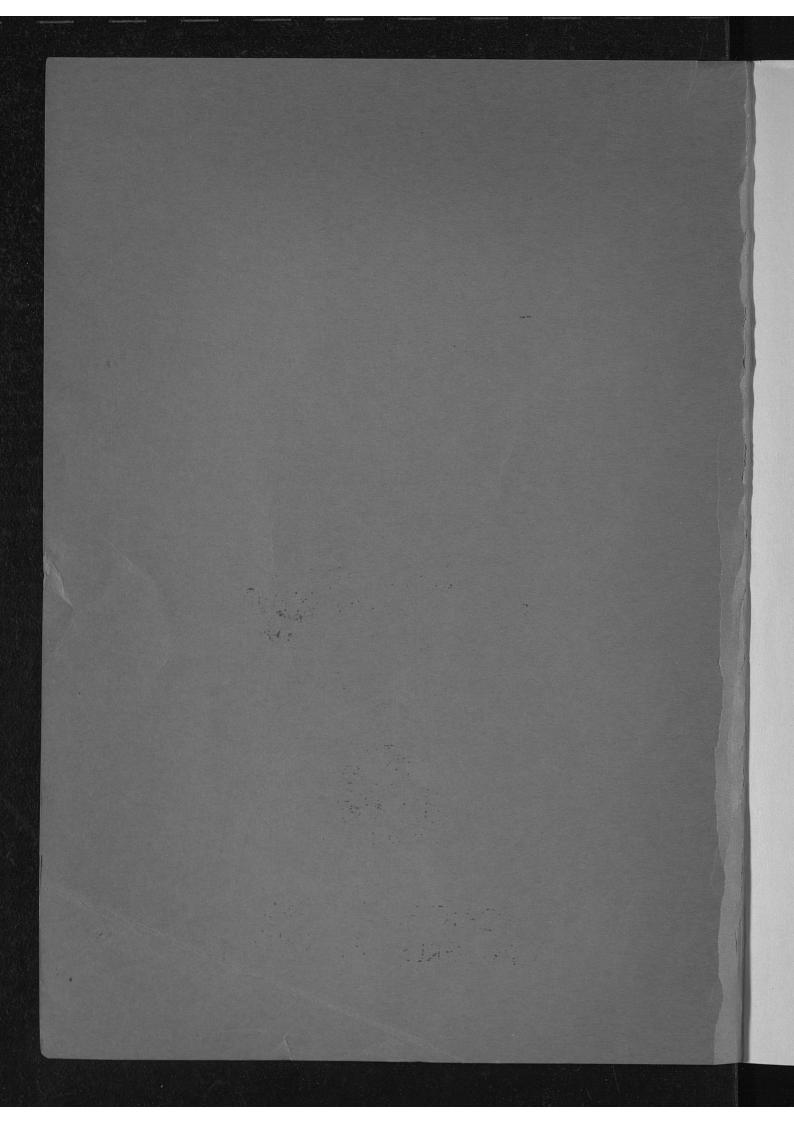

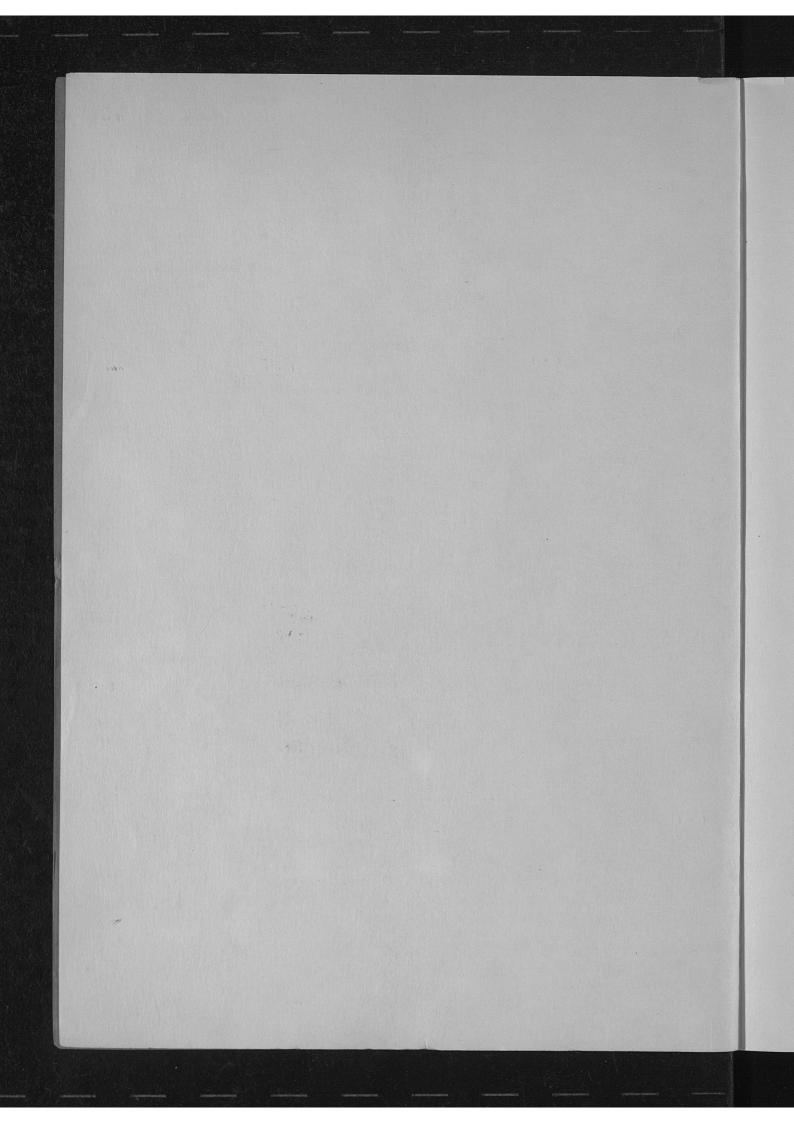

PREFACE

The Inventory of Federal Archives in the States is one of the products of the work of the Survey of Federal Archives, which operated as a nation-wide project of the Works Progress Administration from January 1, 1936 to June 30, 1937, and has been continued since that date as a unit of the Historical Records Survey, also operating as a nation-wide project of the Works Progress Administration, and a group of state or

local projects of that Administration.

The plan for the organization of the Inventory is as follows: Series 1 consists of reports on the administration of the Survey, acknowledgements, and general discussions of the location, condition, and content of federal archives in the states. Succeeding series contain the detailed information secured by workers of the Survey, in inventory form, a separate series number being assigned to each of the executive departments (except the Department of State) and other major units of the Federal Government. Within each series No. 1 is a general introduction to the field organization and records of the governmental agency concerned; the succeeding numbers contain the inventory proper, separate numbers being assigned to each state in alphabetical order. Thus, in each series, the inventory for Alabama is No. 2, that for Arizona, No. 3, that for Arkansas No. 4, etc.

Information from the local offices regarding each series, or unit of related records, is presented in the following order: title, inclusive dates ("to date" indicating an open file at the time the information was secured), a general description of content and system of filing or indexing (if any), a statement of frequency and purpose of use, form of the record itself (bound volumes, sheets in folders, etc.) linear footage, type of containers, physical condition of records (not stated if satisfactory), location by room, and finally, the number of the Form 58SA on which the content was originally recorded by a survey worker and from which it was later abstracted for the Inventory. This form is on file in the National Archives. Whenever it contains substantial details on addenda sheets not included in the mimeographed abstract, indication of

such fact is given by use of the reference: "See addenda."

In Georgia the work of the Survey was under the direction of Professor Merritt B. Pound from its inception until June 30, 1937. Since that time the project has been under the supervision of Mr. Raiford J. Wood, State Director of the Historical Records Survey in Georgia. This Inventory of the records of the Department of the Treasury in Georgia was prepared in the Atlanta office of the Survey and was edited before final typing by Dr. Erik Achorn of the Washington office. It is reproduced in mimeographed form through the facilities of the Historical Records Survey.

Correspondence pertaining to the disbursing account of former Special Disbursing Agent, Veterans: Administration Facility, covering accounts, Treasury warrants, proofs of depository balance, appointment of subordinates, monthly reports, finance, adjusted service certificate information, accounting procedure, and monthly work reports. - 3. EXCEPTIONS TAKEN BY GENERAL ACCOUNTING OFFICE, Aug. 1, 1930 Nov. 30, 1932. Records relating to adjustment of exceptions to errors in disbursing records; these exceptions were based on errors in payment of current accounts of individuals, including veterans' adjusted service certificates and firms and corporations furnishing supplies or services. Monthly recapitulation of transactions, showing total disbursements, adjustments, funds transferred from Chief Disbursing Office, amount of cancelled checks, and balance of money Government departments are due United States; also shows appropriation number, fund, and account, titles, symbol, number of checks, total collections received, disposition of money, and balance on hand or due the Treasury Department. Filed chronologically. (Daily, checking monthly transactions.) 9 x 12 folders, 1 ft. 6 in., in steel filing case. R. M-101. (2261)
- 7. APPROPRIATION LEDGER, Dec. 1, 1934 to date. Tabulation of funds appropriated for expenditures used for control and subsidiary accounts; also advances to travelers, agent-cashiers, and assistant disbursing officers. Filed numerically as to appropriation symbol number. (Daily, checking expenditures against appropriations.) 12 x 16 loose-leaf books (6), 1 ft., in steel filing case. R. M-101. (2295)
- 8. COLLECTION LEDGER, Dec. 1, 1934 to date. Record of receipts and disposition of money received from sundry administrative offices for credit to appropriations and miscellaneous receipt titles; also receipts and disposition of special funds. Filed numerically as to appropriation symbol number. (Daily, checking receipts and disposition of money against appropriations.) 12 x 16 loose-leaf books (3), 1 ft., in steel filing case. R. M-101. (2281)
- 9. COPIES OF PROGRESS SHEETS AND COPIES OF PAID SCHEDULES OF DISBURSE-MENTS, Dec. 1, 1934 to date. Copies of progress sheets for checks issued, showing check, schedule, and symbol numbers, number of checks issued and vouchers paid, and dates and agency for which checks were drawn; also copies of schedule of disbursements by agencies receiving their disbursements from this office, showing name of agency for which the schedule is made, bureau, voucher, and symbol numbers, amount of check, and dates when schedule was made and paid. - 15. REGISTER OF LOT SUMMARY, Dec. 1, 1934 to date. Register of lots, for checking account symbols from which vouchers are to be paid, showing date, symbol numbers, description, name, and location of department for which lot is made. Filed numerically by lot summary number. (Daily, as a condensed record of information.) 12 x 18 vols. (3), 4 in., on wooden desk. R. M-106. (2323)
- 16. REGISTER OF VOUCHERS, Dec. 1, 1934 to date. Date voucher was received, voucher, lot, and symbol numbers, amount of voucher, and bureau or office for which issued. Filed numerically as to voucher number. (Daily, as a condensed record of information.) 14 x 18 vols. (4), 6 in., on wooden desk. R. M-101. (2322)
- 17. REGULAR CERTIFICATES OF DEPOSIT FOR CHECKING ACCOUNT, Dec. 1, 1934 to date. Duplicate certificates, furnished by Chief Disbursing Office, Washington, showing amount of funds deposited with Treasurer of United States for departments which receive their disbursements from this office. Filed numerically as to appropriation symbol number. (Weekly, checking appropriations.) 9 x 12 folders, 1 ft. 6 in., in wooden and steel filing cases. R. M-101. (2270)
- 18. TREASURY DEPARTMENT STATEMENT OF CHECKING ACCOUNT, Dec. 1934 to date. An accounting by Treasury Department, constituting detailed record of deposits to credit of the Atlanta Office, checks paid against the deposits, and balance. - 24. STATEMENT OF FUNDS INTRUSTED TO AGENT-CASHIER AND ASSISTANT DISBURS-ING OFFICERS, Dec. 31, 1934 to date. - 33. CERTIFICATES OF DEPOSIT FOR SPECIAL CHECKING ACCOUNT, July 30, 1935 to date. Correspondence regarding disbursements, with all government branches receiving disbursements from this office, including Internal Revenue Service, Lighthouse Service, Veterans' Admn., Custom Service, Coast Guard, Dept. of Agric., Dept. of Justice, and National Park and Indian Services, embracing Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Tennessee, and parts of North Carolina and South Carolina. - 37. ADMINISTRATIVE BONUS FILE, Mar. 1, 1936 to date. Copies of monthly report of bonus personnel absentees to Chief Disbursing Office, Washington; correspondence regarding salary leave and appointments of bonus personnel, personnel separated from service, and copies of vouchers and pay rolls for Bonus Unit. - 38. DISBURSING OFFICER'S SCHEDULE AND VOUCHER FOR BONUS LEDGERS, Mar. 26, 1936 to date. - 39. GENERAL BONUS FILE, Mar. 26, 1936 to date. Reports pertaining to payment and tabulations regarding soldiers' bonus, showing changes of addresses of veterans, copy of schedules of cancelled checks, deaths, certificates of deposit, daily summary and schedule of disbursements, journal vouchers, daily statement of balance, weekly work reports, radiograms transferring money, progress sheets, account current reports, notices of item to be voided, and reports of total amounts paid for bonus. - 42. BONUS GENERAL CORRESPONDENCE, Apr. 1, 1936 to date. Correspondence with veterans, postmasters, Veterans' Admn. Facility, and others concerned with payment of bonus, pertaining to addresses of veterans, adjustments, procedure, and details regarding payment of the soldiers' bonus. Filed alphabetically as to name of veteran. (Daily, information regarding veterans' bonus.) 9 x 12 folders, 3 ft., in steel filing case. R. M-101. (2283)
- 43. LIST OF ADJUSTED SETTLEMENT BONDS HELD, June 15, 1936 to date. Relates to bonds issued to World War veterans in settlement of adjusted service certificates; these bonds were regularly issued but, because of inability to locate the veteran or errors in name, are now being held pending information as to address of veteran or correct name. Filed alphabetically. (Daily, checking names of veterans for whom bonds are being held.) 9 x 12 folders, 1 ft., in steel filing case. R. M-101. (2302)
- 44. SCHEDULE OF DISBURSEMENTS FOR PAYMENT OF ADJUSTED SERVICE CERTIFICATES, June 15, 1936 to date. Record of settlement of adjusted service certificates held by World War veterans, as shown by general schedule of disbursements, public vouchers for payment, detailed record of original amount of certificates, lien deductions, amount payable, amount issued in bonds, and amount of cash. The cash item is sustained by check copies held in companion files. Filed chronologically and numerically as to Disbursing Officer's schedule number. STATE ACCOUNTS OFFICE

This office was established July 1, 1935. It controls accounts and encumbrances against appropriations for official and works projects for Federal Emergency Relief in Georgia. No records have been destroyed. All reports are sent to Washington.
