All I have is Migne and a coupleof learned Catholic journals that have some articles on him. Also perhaps Carolyn might find for me a good history of the late Roman Empire, especially covering the Barbarian invasions and the state of affairs in the 6th century. This would be useful for background to Cassiodorus. I look forward very much to seeing you both. Meanwhile, God bless you. And all best wishes. I am still happy about the painting.
