4th That Prof. Picketts for prudential reasons should have voluntarily declined to fill a place which the President could not longer conscientiously tender him.

- 5. That in view of the common and equal rights belonging to every member of the same Faculty in any college Prof. Pickett, so long as he occupies the place to which the Curators have called him, is, without respect to other outside matters over which the Board have no control, entitled to all the rights which any other member of the Faculty enjoys, the prerogative of the President as such only excepted -
- 6. That we respectfully call attention of the Faculty to the action of the Students of the Bible College as respects their newspaper publication hereby recommending that they be called upon to make acknowledgement, that they did wrong in making that publication and that said acknowledgment be published for them by President Milligan
