The faculty met in regular monthly session, in the President's room, in the college at 8:30 am

All present except Prof Mathews.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The President called attention to a communication from the Classical Faculty recommending action relative to the deficiency, in Latin, of D. C. Doran, E. C. Elliott, J. S. Gibson, S. A. Laughridge, B. F. Thompson, Miss L. Foran, and Miss B. Wiley.

The Dean of the classical faculty stated that the students mentioned had shown a marked improvement in their recitations and that he desired to withdraw the recommendation for the present.

Prof Miller submitted a report of the committee on the plan for a number of lectures to "Accredited Schools" by members of the faculty during the next collegiate year.

The committee recommended that \$1000 be appropriated by the Board of Trustees for advertising purposes.

Prof Anderson moved to amend by striking out \$1000 and inserting instead \$500, carried

On motion the report was then recommitted.

E. E. Simpson
Excused from
drill

Mr E. E. Simpson came before the faculty and stated that he had performed military duty for six years, that he has only two hours work daily, that it is not convenient to remain at the college until the drill hour; for the reasons mentioned he requested to be excused from drill.

voted on motion that Mr. E. E. Simpson be excused, hereafter, from military duty. It is understood, however, that this action shall not be regarded as a precedent.

Ordered that during the examinations beginning March 6th the time of the chapel services be changed from 10.30 am to 8.30 am
