

O & M. College of Kentucky May 6 - 1904.

The faculty met in the president's room at 4 P. M. those present being President Patterson, Messrs. White, W. K. Patterson, Kastle, Roark, Pryor, Mathews, Nuelle, Pence, Brooks, Mackenzie, Norwood, Paig and Byrwaide.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Prof. Mackenzie reported a communication from Prof. Hays of Miami University, O. with reference to a preliminary intercollegiate oratorical contest to be held in Lexington on the 18<sup>th</sup> of June, this contest to precede a final test at St. Louis on the 26<sup>th</sup> of June.

He asks that this faculty should appoint one of its number and a member of the Senior class to serve as a Committee of Arrangements for this meeting at Lexington.

Upon motion of Prof. Kastle seconded by Prof. White it was ordered that such a committee should be appointed. The president appointed Prof. Mackenzie with Prof. Paig as alternate.

President Patterson called attention to the possible postponement of commencement exercises in order to permit the Senior class to participate in the encampment at St. Louis.

Upon motion of Prof. White, seconded by Prof. Nuelle it was resolved that if the Executive Committee of the college deem it best to allow it, there is no objection upon the part of the faculty to the proposed postponement of the approaching college commencement for one week.

The secretary was directed to send a copy of this resolution to the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees.

Upon motion of Prof. White it was ordered that a committee of two be appointed to take charge of the commencement programme.

The president appointed Prof. Nuelle and Prof. Pence with Prof. Brooks as alternate.

On account of Prof. Neville's absence, it was ordered on motion of Prof. Kastle, that Prof. ~~Neville~~<sup>Mackay</sup> should determine the persons in his course who are eligible for graduation.

On motion of Prof. Penn, seconded by Prof. Kastle the following order was adopted.

"that each sub-faculty of the college recommend to the general faculty, for dismissal from the college, any student within the province of such sub-faculty, who is not doing his duty as a student, or whose influence or conduct is not for the best interests of the college.

Upon motion it was ordered that the Secretary should call to the attention of the editors of the college annual the regulation of the faculty which require that all matter intended for printing in any college publication shall first be submitted to the professor in charge of the department of English, and receive his approval.

The names of candidates for graduation and for advanced degrees were submitted for the consideration of the faculty.
