Dr. Adams discussed briefly the commencement procedure to be followed at the approaching exercises and announced the alumni dinner for the graduates, and the tea and reception.

Professor Vandebosch asked the Senate to consider the question of the heavy teaching loads assigned during the summer session, the normal load being the equivalent of 18 hours, including in addition in the case of many professors a large amount of work in directing graduate study and theses. Dr. Adams pointed out that the administration was aware of the heavy demands made on the staff during the summer, but indicated there would be little opportunity to change this satisfactorily unless more money was appropriated by the Legislature for the summer session. In response, Professor Vandebosch asked why the summer session could not be made an integral part of the school year and financed as a part of the regular University budget. This issue was discussed briefly.

Dean Funkhouser pointed out that late registration during the second term of the summer session, together with the necessary early filing of marks for the candidates for degrees sometimes meant that there was left little more than three weeks of actual teaching time. He suggested that it might be advisable to shorten the registration period during the second summer term, or perhaps even confine it to a single day. Dr. Adams asked that this suggestion be noted for consideration in making the plans for the next summer session.
