

COVINGTON, Ky. — Health workers have targeted intervenous drug users in northern Kentucky and gracine Albe in an attempt to prevent a growing problem from becoming an epidemic, officials said yesterday, "We're looking at the intravenous drug users as being the pathway for AIDS to permeate the rest of society," said Julane Simpson, co-chairman of the AIDS task force fonorthern Kentucky.





Education group calls for better graduation level

ATLANTA — The Southern Re-gional Education Board is calling on state governments to commit themselves to seeing that 90 per-ent of the South's adults have high school diplomas or an equivalent by the year 2000. That goal, which would depend of dramatic increases in the num-ber of adults in workplace literacy and high school equivalency pro-grams, is one of 12 proposed by the group.

grams, is one of 12 proposed by the group.

A related goal calls for cutting in half the disproportionately high dropout rates in Southern states. "Significant improvements in education don't just happen." said former South Carolina Gov. Richard Riley, chairman of the board's Commission for Educational Quality, the group of 17 Southeastern educators and politicians which drafted the goals.

Riley said states have to aim for specific goals if they want to make

permanent improvements in their educational systems.

In a report issued Wednesday, the StEEB also said states should, by the year 2000:

Make high school more rigor.


