"I'm a little surprised at the attention my photos are getting," McCann said. "I had no expectation they would get any public attention." In what they considered to be the public interest, neither the Herald nor the Leader (which merged in 1983 to form the Herald-Leader) published photographs of the social activism taking place on Lexington's streets.

The Lexington Farfiers' Market will set up at 300 Southland Drive each Sunday through August 28. The market will be open from 11 am. till 3 pm. or sellout.

Jeff Dabbelt, marketing manager for the Farmers' Market, called the Southland location "a tremendous success." He said that approximately one hird of vendors sold out, and he looks foreword to the Fourth of July holiday as a good test of future success.
