



Iraq prepares for chemical war WASHINGTON — While the Reagan administration is pressing for a worldwide ban on chemical weapons, Iraq may be preparing for the "large-scale" use of lethal nerve gas to fend off Iranian attacks in the Persian Gulf, U.S. officials said vestreday. The "bold American intitative" that President Reagan promised in his news conference Wednesday night will be a proposed treaty which would permit Soviet inspection of U.S. chemical weapons stocks and sites if the Soviets allow similar U.S. searches. Chemical and biological weapons are outlawed by two international agreements that lack enforcement and verification procedures.




