Mr. J. L. Joyner was present and was charged with having assaulted and stabbed Mr. H. L. Ellison.
 Mr. Joyner made his statement of the case and, Mr. Ellison, being confined to his bed with several severe wounds, the Pres. gave his (Ellison's) statement of the case as he (Ellison) had stated it immediately after the affray. From the investigation of the case it was evident that Mr. Joyner was guilty of the charge preferred against him, and it was also evident that Mr. Ellison had provoked, to a considerable extent, the assault.
 A resolution was then passed, publicly expelling, from this College, Mr. J. L. Joyner, the consideration of what punishment should be inflicted upon Mr. Ellison was postponed till he could come before the Faculty.
