After the acute attack is over, if there is any constipation, it should be relieved by Lydia E. Pinkham's Liver Pills; and if there is any discharge from the uterus Lydia E. Pinkham's Sanative Wash should be used once or twice each day, in order to hasten recovery as much as possible.

## White Discharge.

Constant bearing down pain is also present with a dragging sensation as if a heavy weight were pressing upon the womb.

All treatment of chronic inflammation should be directed toward relieving the congestion of the blood in the womb,
