## Marcos' prisoners wait for release by Aquino

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — President Corazon Aquino's Cabinet took over yesterday and her office announced that records in several ministries reportedly had been de-stroyed by Marcos loyalists.

The new government said hundreds of political prisoners held by the fallen Marcos regime could be freed next week, but extensive paper work slowed the process.

Some political prisoners were freed yesterday, but only one of the 39 people on the list for immediate release actually had gone home by nightfall, said Armando Malay, head of a group of prisoners' families called Kapatid (Brother).

Other prisoners were taken from jails to processing centers and had emotional reunions with relatives while bureaucrats dealt with the decuments.

Officials said more than 500 people were in jail on assorted political charges when Ferdinand E. Marcos ended 20 years of rule in the Philippines and fled the country Wednesday in a U.S. Air Force plane. He now is in Hawaii.

He told Aquino that the popular uprising that forced Marcos from of-fice, which was largely peaceful, had "deeply moved the American people and those in the highest circles of the U.S. government," the statement said. It did not say what the two discussed.

#### Philosophers to meet in Lexington

About 100 philosophy professors from across the country will meet in Lexington this weekend for the annual meeting of the Society for the Advancement of American Philosophy.

Sessions for the conference start this morning at the Hyatt Regency, and tonight a lecture will be held on campus, said Tom Olshewsky, a UK philosophy professor and chairman of the local arrangements committee. At 8 p.m. in 230 Student Center, professors from several Kentucky colleges will discuss "Freedom and Determinism on the Frontier."

Olshewsky said the meetings will focus on philosophical debate in the beginning of the century. The lecture is free and open to the public.

#### Lottery amendment clears committee

FRANKFORT — Yesterday's winning number was 11-10 as a bill proposing a constitutional amendment for creation of a Kentucky lottery squeaked out of the House State Government Committee by the barest possible margin.

The committee was a crucial testing ground for the measure, House Bill 134. In 1984, it was the burial ground for a lottery bill that originated in the Senate.

Sixty votes are needed in the 100-member House to pass the lottery bill and send it to the Senate. Passage there would place the issue on the November ballot to let voters decide whether the Kentucky Constitution should be amended to allow a lottery.

#### Panel says decision process is flawed

WASHINGTON — The chairman of the presidential Challenger commission bluntly denounced NASA yesterday for a "clearly flawed" decision-making process, after hearing of a second instance in which the space agency brushed aside contractor fears for the safety of the shuttle and

crew.

Summarizing three days of hearings at which several witnesses complained that their concerns were not passed to the agency's top officials, Chairman William Rogers lectured four senior NASA officials: "You climinate the element of good judgment and common sense,"

Rogers said he was speaking for the whole panel and said the process "should require people to take stands, and you should have a record on it."

ROME - The prosecutor recommended yesterday that e Bulgarians be acquitted because he could not prove conspired in the shooting of Pope John Paul II. He

Antonio Marini appeared to suggest in his lengthy summation, however, that the jury exercise its right to ignore his recommendation. Italian law requires prosecutors to ask for acquittal if they feel the evidence is insufficient.

Acquittal on that basis stops short of complete absolution, with the possibility of future prosecution left open.

At the last minute, Marini tried to have the nimemonth-long trial reopened so he could call more witnesses, but Judge Severino Santiapichi denied his request.


