The faculty met in the president's room at 3:30 P.M. all present except professors Neville and Rowwood.

The case of Miss Crown who desires to take the degree of B.S. from this college in June next, was first discussed. On motion of Prof. James White, seconded by Prof. Pence, it was ordered that a com. of three be appointed to consider this case. President Patterson appointed professors White, Miller, and Mackenzie.

On motion of Prof. Tuttle, seconded by Prof. Anderson it was ordered that the order of examinations be that of the order of studies as published in the catalog.

On motion of Prof. Miller, seconded by Prof. Pence, it was ordered that after Sept. 1908, no student will be permitted to alternate his studies of a given class period, and receive credit for both.

On motion of Prof. Anderson seconded by Prof. Wilson it was ordered that, for the second and third terms, in place of the usual matriculation cards to be signed individually by the president, the Deans should each prepare a list of students in their courses showing class assignments, which list shall be presented as a whole, to the president for his approval.

The meeting adjourned.
