Chandler Papers Presentation

The personal and public papers of Albert B. Chandler will be formally presented to the University of Kentucky on November 18 at 2 PM in Seay Auditorium. The program will include a slide/tape presentation on the highlights of Governor Chandler's career. The main address will be delivered by Joseph J. Leary, Frankfort attorney and long-time friend and adviser to Chandler. A reception in the Special Collections Department will follow the program. Faculty and staff are cordially invited.

The Chandler Papers were deposited at the King Library in 1973. Now processed and open for scholarly research, the collection consists of nearly 600 boxes of correspondence and over 500 photographs and bits of memorabilia. These materials document Chandler's career from the 1920's to 1974, highlighted by two terms as Governor of Kentucky, six years in the United States Senate, and a vigorous and controversial tenure as Commissioner of Baseball.

Selected items from the collection will be on display in the Gallery, King Library North, beginning the week of November 14.

Conservation Collection Organized

The Conservation Committee has established a core collection of copies of articles relating to conservation. Committee member Robin Barnard is in charge of arrangements with the Reserve Room to make these timely articles available to the staff. Committee members hope that the staff will take advantage of this opportunity to learn about one of the most serious problems which all libraries face today - the preservation of library materials.
