Dr. James G. Morris, Chairman of the Honors Program Committee, presented the University Faculty Honors Program Committee report which had been circulated to the faculty of the University in April with the following recommendation:

that all students in the Honors Program who do not have a grade point standing of 3.5 or better but are in the top ten per cent of their class of their college be eligible to graduate in the Honors Program if they satisfy the other requirements and have approval of the Honors Program Director

The Faculty approved the recommendation as presented and received the full Report as circulated for inclusion in these minutes.

The University Honors Program is now in its fourth year of operation, with 110 students, corresponding to the original plan to have about 25 in each year's entering freshman class.

At midyear the cumulative GPA for all students in the Honors Program was 3.54; 3.35 for the freshmen, 3.56 for the sophomores, 3.58 for the juniors, and 3.66 for the seniors. The attached tables summarize enrollments and standings for the past three and a half years. A list of all students currently in the Honors Program is also attached.

Again this year the Lexington Rotary Club expressed its continuing interest in the Honors Program by making scholarship awards of one hundred dollars each to ten students in the Honors Program - Nancy Coleman, Arthur Henderson, James Huey, Larry Kelley, Robert Rich, Wilson Sebastian, Charles Anderson, Richard Crytcher, Nancy Robison, and Jean Vandermolen.

For the first time there are graduating seniors in the Honors Program. As was expected, many of the seniors are planning to continue their education in graduate school or in professional schools. Several seniors have received fellowships. Six of the eight University of Kentucky seniors who were awarded Woodrow Wilson Fellowships are in the Honors Program - Glenn Graber, Glenda Harwood, Eric Henson, Glynda Stephens, Robert Stokes, and Catherine Ward. Larry Beach, Richard Eckel, Morgan Lyons, and Mary Evans received honorable mention. James Congleton has received a National Science Foundation Fellowship.

Several of the seniors have been elected to membership in Phi Beta Kappa, Tau Beta Pi, Omicron Delta Kappa, and Mortar Board. They cannot be listed now because all the announcements have not yet been made public.

Based on the experience of four years of operation of the University Honors Program, the Honors Program Committee recently passed the following proposals which are to be effective immediately.

1. All full time students who are second semester freshmen, first or second semester sophomores, or first semester juniors and are in the top ten per cent of their class in their college be eligible to participate in the Honors Program if they have approval of their adviser and of the Honors Program Director.
2. All students in the Honors Program who do not have a grade point standing of 3.5 or better but are in the top ten per cent of their class of their college be eligible to graduate in the Honors Program if they satisfy the other requirements and have approval of the Honors Program Director.

3. All students in the Honors Program who are not in the top ten per cent of their class but have a standing of at least 3.20 if freshmen, 3.30 if sophomores, and 3.40 if juniors or seniors be eligible to remain in the Honors Program if they have approval of the Honors Program Director. (Students not already in the Honors Program and not in the top ten per cent of their class would not be admitted with such cumulative standings; that is, a distinction is made between retention in the Honors Program and admission to it.)
4. Where practical, in courses with five or more sections, one or more sections be designated "Honors Section".

In Honors Sections greater depth and understanding would be sought, perhaps with more discussion on the part of students and less lecturing by instructors.

Students in the Honors Program normally would enroll in Honors Sections automatically. Students not in the Honors Program could enroll in Honors Sections if they felt that they could do Honors level work and had approval of their adviser and of the instructor. Also, students from regular sections could transfer to Honors Sections if both of the instructors and the student agreed.

5. Honors Sections be scheduled simultaneously with regular sections, so that students not doing honors quality work could transfer to regular sections.

Students would be allowed to transfer out of the Honors Sections if they request the change and would be required to do so if the instructors recommend the change.

6. In each department there be designated an Honors Program Adviser to act as the official adviser for students in the Honors Program who are majoring in the department.

In departments with more than six students in the Honors Program there be two or more advisers wherever possible.

The advisers be appointed by the Dean of the College upon joint recommendation by the Chairman of the Department and the Honors Program Director.

7. Instructors of the Honors Sections be selected by agreement of the Dean of the College, the Chairman of the Department and the Honors Program Director.

The main effect of the new operating rules will be to bring significantly greater numbers of students and of faculty into the Honors Program.

With the first group of graduating seniors, Dr. Stephan Diachun, the Honors Program Director is also leaving the Program at the end of June. The Committee wishes to pay special tribute to Dr. Diachun for his devoted service during these formative years of the Program. Without his dedicated efforts the Program would never have become established.

1. By sex - 43 women, 67 men
2. By class year - 23 freshmen, 44 sophomores, 21 juniors, 22 seniors
3. By college - 82 in Arts and Sciences, 13 in Engineering, 7 in Education, 6 in Commerce, 2 in Agriculture
4. By Department or major interest - 12 in English; 9 each in Chemistry and History; 7 each in Electrical Engineering, Mathematics and Pre-medicine; 5 in Pre-law; 4 each in Accounting and Physics; 3 each in Anthropology, Chemical Engineering, Elementary Education, Journalism, Political Science, Psychology and Zoology; 2 each in German, Mechanical Engineering, Microbiology, Philosophy, Pre-veterinary, Sociology, Special Education, and Topical; 1 each in Advertising, Architectural Engineering, Banking and Finance, French, Pre-dentistry, Russian Area, Secondary Education, Social Work; and 1 undecided.
5. By home - 25 out-of-state and 85 from Kentucky; 28 from the Lexington area, 8 from the Louisville area, 4 from Owensboro, 3 from Henderson, 2 each from Ashland and Greensburg, and the rest scattered throughout the state.
6. By length of time in the Honors Program - 18 of the 23 freshmen entered in the first semester and 5 entered in the second semester; 16 of the 43 sophomores began in the first semester, 4 entered in the second semester, 22 entered

as sophomores, and 1 entered at the end of the third semester; 7 of the 21 juniors began in the first semester, 9 entered as sophomores, 1 entered at the end of the third semester, 3 entered as juniors; 14 of the 22 seniors were in the original entering group, 4 entered as sophomores, 1 entered at the end of the third semester and 4 entered as juniors.
