

Big Blue Madness still a big night for Hanson

Sixteen years after he suited up for his first Mid-night Madness as a Wildcat, forward Reggie Hanson still remembers exactly how he felt.

"Every night is exciting, but that very first Madness I was so excited and scared to death," Hanson said. "It's so exciting but at the same time you're very nervous. You don't want to come out and embarrass yourseft."

No one knows better than Hanson what the full Madness experience is like.

After four years as a player with UK and a professional career that took him around the world a professional career that took him around the world a professional career that took him around the world same as a saistant coach for the Wildeats. He said white much time has passed since his first Midnight Madness, the excitement level remains the same.

"The excitement is the

the excitement level remains the same.

"The excitement is the same but the nervousness is gone," he said. "Tim just as excited as the players, the fans, anybody. It's a great building block for the season. It's a night to have fun."

The fun began for Hanson in 1987 when he first donned the blue and white

for then-head coach Eddie Sutton. But after two seasons of solid contribution off the bench, he found himself on a team that was about to endure two years of NCAA probation. Instead of leaving UK for another school like most of his teammates, Hanowing he would never have another opportunity to reach the NCAA Tournament.

With no chance for post-season glory in sight, Hanson anchored the squad his last two seasons, serving as team captain both years and leaving the school as a member of its exclusive 1,000-point club. Rick Pitino would eventually rename the team's sacrifice award after Hanson to honor his dedication to the program during tough times.

Although coaches and the same the same captain the same the team's sacrifice award after Hanson to UK basketball, it was the fans who appreciated Hanson to most. He says it is their support that helps make Big Blue Madness such a resounding success.

"It means a great deal to these fans," he said. "Most of these fans," he said. "Most of these fans, that come out to Madness are the ones who don't get tog to a lot of the games at Rupp Arena. It's just a chance for them to be a

part of the program and I think that's important."

Hanson said the overwhelming fan support at Madness also makes it easier to convince young recruits to come to UK.

"You have 8,000 people packing Memorial Coliseum at midnight just to see guys introduced, do some shooting drills and scrimmage for about 40 minutes," he said. "And when you got people camping out just to get a ticket that shows recruits just how dedicated UK fans are."



For four newcomers, conjeht will be the first opportunity to witness that dedication firsthand. Using his own experience, "Coach Hanson has already tried to prepare his new players for their first Midnight Madness.

"Twe told them to expect an exciting, electric atmosphere," he said. "That's the only thing you can tell them. It's something you have to experience to get the full effect of it. I can sit here and tell you all day about the electricity in the air, but you still wouldn't have any clue what to expect."

SG deserves our praise for plan to man library

Last year administrators made the decision to stop keeping the William T. Young library open 24 hours a day. They cited the budget crunch and a lack of late-night student visitors as justification for closing the library

from 2 a.m. to 7 a.m. However, officials recognized that circumstances change during high-stress periods, namely, during mid-term and finals weeks. The library has maintained its old hours during these times ever since the new policy was

implemented.

But this semester, there aren't enough library staff members available to keep the doors open during mid-terms. Students were doors open during mid-terms. Students were going to be forced to sleep or study elsewhere between 2 and 7 in the morning. That is, until Student Government stepped in and volunteered to work at the library during mid-term week so it can stay open 24 hours a day. SG members have agreed to work for free to keep the library available to students all night beginning this Sunday and continuing through next Thursday. They have even planned a mid-term kickoff event, which

starts Sunday at 10 p.m., where refreshments will be available to students coming to study at the library.

SG has endured a lot of valid criticism from the Kernel Editorial Board in the past, but this is an instance in which the organization is living up to its purpose of student ad-

vocacy and assistance.

It's a tremendous sacrifice for SG mem-It's a tremendous sacrifice for SG members, who have their own mid-terms to prepare for, to volunteer their time and effort to help fellow students study for their exams. Working the graveyard shift at the library probably wasn't what SG candidates envisioned when they ran for their posts, but they are to be commended for taking on the task. SG is doing its constituents a great service by following up on its committment to student service. Members even played a role in the administration's decision to keep the Fine Arts Library open 24 hours beginning next semester.






