Lady Kats Return To NCAA Tourney

With only two starters returning and a relatively inexperienced bench, the Lady Kats had to band together in hopes of reaching their goal of matching a 1989-90 season that included 23 wins and an NWIT championship.

Togetherness proved to be a successful formula as the Lady Kats recorded their second winning season under fourth-year Coach Sharon Fanning with a 20-9 record, finished fifth in the SEC and made their

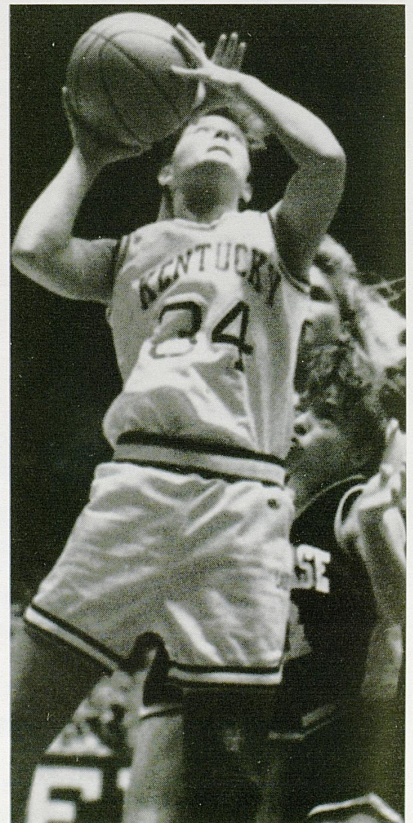
first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 1985-86.

Fans saw the emergence of junior forward Stacy McIntyre, who led the team in scoring with an average of 15 points, and in steals with 2.3 per game. The Georgetown, Ky., native was one of three players to start in all 29 games. She was named to the All-SEC honorable mention team.

McIntyre, Jocelyn Mills, Tracye Davis, Pattresa Leonard and Kristi Cushenberry made up the starting five that helped lead the team throughout the year. Mills led the team in rebounding (8.9), Leonard in blocked shots (1.5) and Davis in assists (4.3). Davis, the only senior on the team, made a place for herself in the Lady Kats record book, finishing fifth in all-time assists and sixth in all-time steals.

Coach Fanning was impressed as her young squad won four conference games to improve three places in the SEC standings. The Kats also won the Lady Kats Invitational and the Nevada-Reno New Year's Classic.

Kentucky was dominant against non-conference schools, defeating 16 of 19, while losing to Indiana, Louisville and James Madison.



Karen Killen saw plenty of action and started in six games.

The Kats stung many opponents at the beginning of the season, averaging over 100 points per game. They ended the season averaging 80.4 points, while allowing opponents an average of 70.1 points.

UK beat SEC foes Vanderbilt (80-63) and Florida (67-65) at home and Mississippi State (75-64) in Starkville, Miss. However, the most impressive victory came

against nationally-ranked Mississippi in Oxford (87-81), as senior guard Tracye Davis scored a career-high 29 points, hitting 12-of-12 attempts from the free throw line.

Kentucky's 4-5 conference record earned a first-round bye in the SEC Tournament in Albany, Ga., where the Kats suffered a loss to eventual tournament champion LSU, 96-76.

Despite the disappointing loss,

Kentucky was one of 48 teams to earn a bid to the NCAA Tournament, drawing James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Va., for the first round of play. Kentucky ended its season with a 70-62 loss to James Madison, which later beat No. 1-ranked Penn State in the second round. UK's appearance in the NCAA Tournament was its first in six seasons and the first-ever for Coach Fanning.

Coach Sharon Fanning will put a strong lineup on the court this season with the return of four starters, an experienced bench and the addition of two freshmen who could make an immediate impact on the success of the team.

Lady Kats Outlook

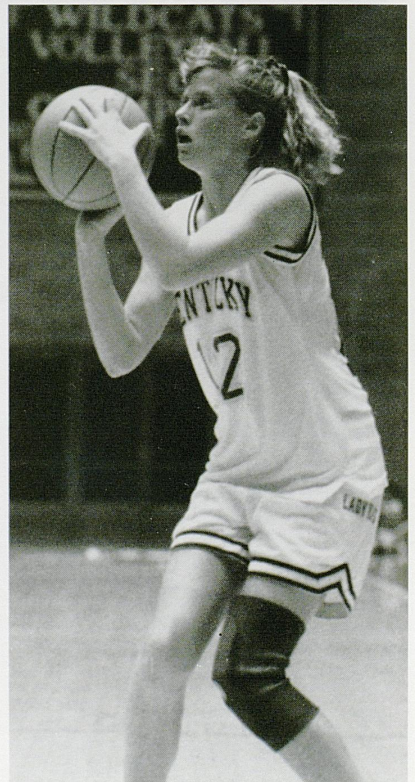
Although the Kats will have to manage without the talent and leadership of Tracie Davis, who graduated last year, Kentucky expects to be ready for a schedule that includes 12 teams that were ranked in the Top 25 poll last season.

After posting a 20-9 overall record, finishing fifth (4-5) in the Southeastern Conference, and

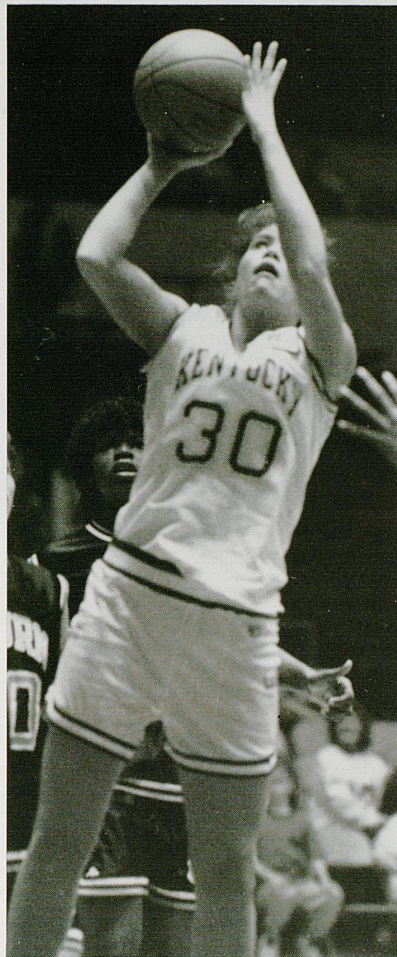
advancing to the NCAA Tournament, Kentucky hopes to improve on last season.

Senior forward Stacy McIntyre hopes to pick up where she left off last year, when she averaged 15 points and 5.1 rebounds per game. McIntyre was named to the All-SEC honorable mention squad and was the only Lady Kat to be named to both the Lady Kats Invitational and Nevada-Reno All-Tournament teams. She averaged 2.3 steals a game and was second in assists with an average of 2.5.

McIntyre is joined by 6-foot junior center Jocelyn Mills, who averaged 12.9 points and led the team in rebounding with 8.9 grabs per game. Senior guard Kristi Cushenberry returns for her final



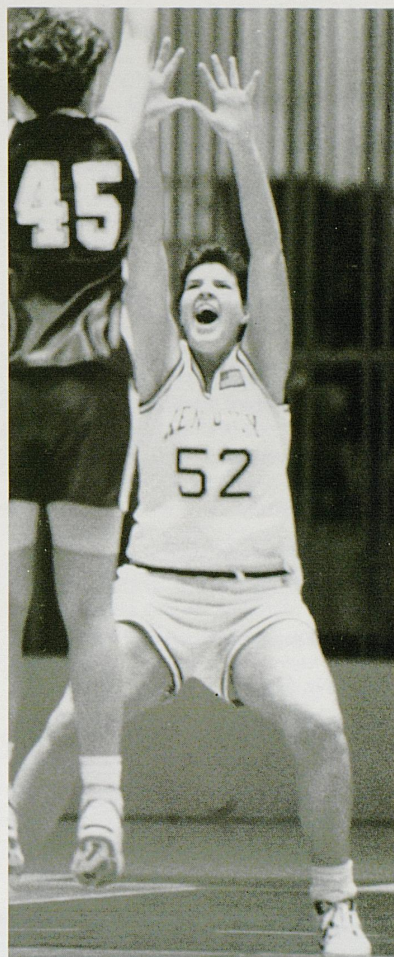
Senior Kristi Cushenberry hopes to have the best season of her career in 1991-92.

season, averaging 11 points per game, and junior Pattresa Leonard hopes to retain her starting spot after averaging 8.3 points and leading the team in blocks (1.5/game).

The Lady Kats welcome the return of junior Mia Daniel (6.6 ppg, 4.3 rpg) after an injury in practice resulted in reconstructive knee surgery in February. Daniel had played in every game prior to her injury, averaging 16.7 minutes of play.

Forward Rebekah Reasor (1.4 ppg, 1.4 rpg) rounds out the 1991-92 senior class.

The junior class includes Mills, Daniel, Leonard and Cathy Proctor (2.3 ppg, 2.2 rpg).

The returning sophomores are Lady Kats Rookie of the Year Tedra Eberhart (4.5 ppg, 2.5 rpg), Karen Killen (5.1 ppg, 4.3 rpg), Jennifer Gray (3.1 ppg, 1.9 rpg), Christe Jordan (1.6 ppg, 2.0 rpg), Kayla Campbell (1.5 ppg, 1.1 rpg) and Tiundra Love (.9 ppg, 1.1 rpg).

In addition to the returning lineup, the Lady Kats welcome two freshmen to the roster. Stacey Reed, a 5-7 guard, led Laurel County High to the Kentucky girl's state championship title and was named MVP of the tournament. Center Karri Koach, from Brantford, Ontario (Canada), averaged 20 points and 12 rebounds at North Park Collegiate Vocational School.

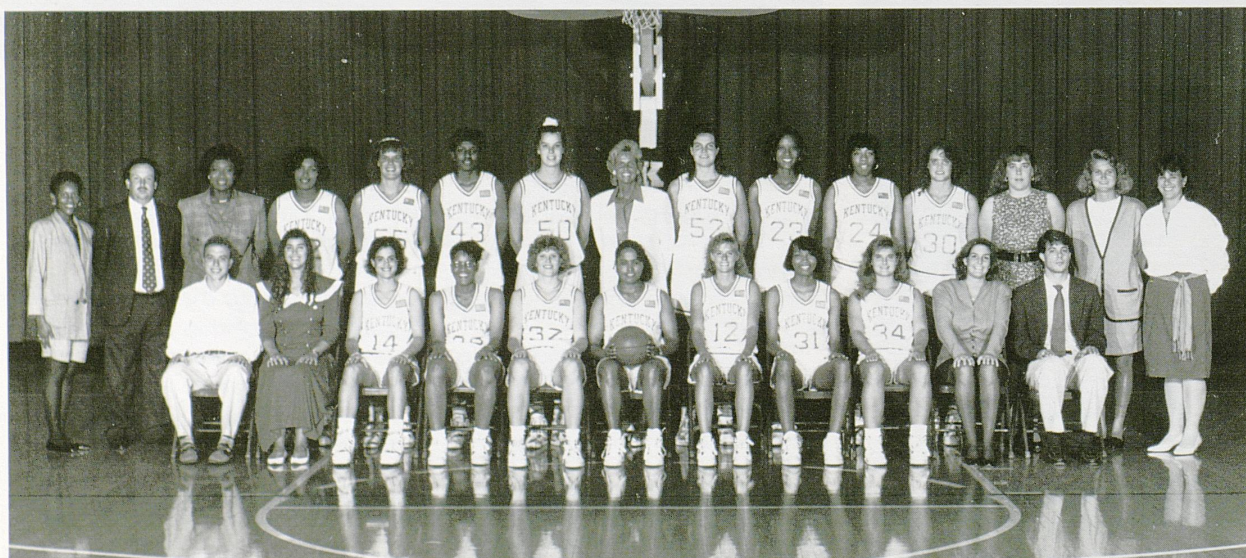

HEAD COACH



Sharon Fanning

Having guided the Lady Kats to two consecutive 20-win seasons, and a 1991 NCAA Tournament berth, fifth-year Coach Sharon Fanning is confident that her rebuilding mission is complete.

The Lady Kats posted a 20-9 overall record and a 4-5 SEC mark in 1990-91 and made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 1985-86.

Fanning enjoyed her first winning season at UK in 1989-90, as the Lady Kats appeared in the Top 25 poll and posted a 23-8 record en route to winning their first National Women's Invitational Tournament Championship.

The road to success was not easy for the Chattanooga, Tenn., native as she watched her first two UK teams struggle. She took over the program in 1987, with the team near the bottom of the SEC and little talent in the cupboard. During her first season, her worst fears were realized as injuries and personal problems saw a roster of 15 shrink to nine en route to an 0-9 SEC record and 14-15 overall mark. In 1988-89 the Lady Kats improved their SEC record to 3-6 for an eighth-place showing in league play and an overall record of 12-16.

Fanning brought to Kentucky not only an exceptional record, but also a national reputation as an outstanding coach, recruiter and motivator. In 11 memorable seasons at her alma mater, Tennessee-Chattanooga, Fanning's squads compiled a 189-129

mark, including five straight Southern Conference championships from 1982-1986. In 1984, the Lady Mocs went 26-5 and were runners-up in the NWIT.

And while her teams were reaping glory for the school, Fanning was receiving personal honors as well. She was named Southern Conference Coach of the Year in 1984 and 1985 and was nominated for Kodak's National Coach of the Year honors in 1984. In 1986 she coached the North squad in the U.S. Olympic Festival and in 1987 she was named to the staff of the USA Select team. She has also served on the staff of the USA Junior National team that competed in the World Championship Qualifying Tournament in South America.

Fanning, a native of Chattanooga, completed her undergraduate degree at UTC in 1975 while competing both in basketball and volleyball. She received her master's degree in 1976 from the University of Tennessee, where she served as graduate assistant to Pat Head Summitt for one year before returning home to build a program at UTC.

A noted speaker who is very active in civic affairs, Fanning has served two terms on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Board of Directors.

McLaughlin enters his third season as Lady Kats assistant coach. He joined the UK program after serving as assistant coach at New Mexico State University for two years.

A 1977 graduate of Flagler College, McLaughlin earned a bachelor's degree in education and helped lead the NMSU Roadrunners to a 26-3 overall record and a 10-0 record in the High Country Athletic Conference in his first season. The Roadrunners finished first in the conference in 1987 and were ranked 19th in the final poll.

In 1982 McLaughlin served as assistant boys coach and head girls coach for Fife High School basketball team in Tacoma, Wash. After leading the girls team to a 22-3 record and the Seamont League Championships, McLaughlin received coach of the year honors.

Following his position at Fife High School, McLaughlin assumed the assistant coaching position with Temple University in 1982 and helped lead the Owls to the 1982-83 National Women's Invitational Tournament.

Before joining the program at NMSU, McLaughlin served as head women's basketball coach at Siena College for two seasons. While at Siena, he compiled a record of 34-24. During the 1986-87 season, his team finished its schedule with a 20-9 overall record and a first-place finish in the MECA conference. He was named MECA Coach of the Year for the season.



MYRA FISHBACK
Assistant Coach
Tennessee Tech, 1985

Fishback begins her first season with the Lady Kats basketball program, following the departure of former assistant Karen Booker.

Prior to coming to UK, Fishback was an assistant at Southern Illinois University for two seasons.

Fishback earned her bachelor's degree from Tennessee Tech in 1985 in secondary education. She began her coaching career at Stone Mountain High School (Atlanta), as head coach of the eighth grade program and as an assistant with the varsity squad.

She returned to Tennessee Tech, where she served as an assistant coach, before completing her master's degree in 1989. While at Tech, she helped guide the Golden Eaglettes to a 22-8 record, an Ohio Valley Conference title and a berth in the NCAA Tournament.

A native of Shelbyville, Tenn., Fishback was a high school standout at Shelbyville Central, where she helped lead the team to a state championship and three 20-win seasons. Shelbyville Central has been heralded by USA Today as being one of the top two teams nationally in the past two years.



ILENE HAUSER
Graduate Assistant
Idaho State, 1990

Hauser enters her second season as graduate assistant to Coach Fanning and her staff. Hauser's primary duties include working one-on-one with the players, aiding in the coordination of the summer camps and contributing to the day-to-day operations of the program.

Hauser played basketball at Idaho State for two seasons before

earning a bachelor's degree in psychology and a minor in business administration in May 1990. Prior to that, she attended UCLA for a year and was on basketball scholarship at San Diego State for two seasons. In 1985 she played basketball on the U.S. Women's Maccabiah Team that visited Israel.

While at UCLA in 1987, Hauser served as head junior varsity girls coach and assistant varsity coach at her alma mater, Alemany High School in Mission Hills, Calif. She has also served as a fitness instructor for the Mid Valley Athletic Club in Reseda, Calif., and has coached at the Blue Star and Billie Moore basketball camps.



LEE REEDY
Staff Assistant

Lee Reedy joined the Lady Kats basketball staff in December of 1983. She was previously employed by the Bartholomew County Welfare Department and Columbus East High School in Columbus, Ind. A native of Whitesburg, Ky., Lee is married to Bob Reedy and has two children.



JOANN HAUSER
Assistant Trainer
Ohio State University, 1986

JoAnn begins her third season as assistant trainer at the University of Kentucky. Her main responsibilities include men's and women's basketball, volleyball and the supervision of Memorial Coliseum's training facility.

Hauser, a native of Cleveland, Ohio, earned her bachelor's degree in education from The Ohio State University in 1986. While at Ohio State, Hauser spent five years as a student trainer.

Overall, Hauser begins her fifth year at UK. She spent two years as a graduate assistant trainer working with gymnastics, baseball and women's basketball, and has also worked with football. She was officially named to the UK staff on a full-time basis in September 1989.

Hauser is the daughter of Jerome and Sonia Hauser of Cleveland, Ohio. She is currently completing work on her master's degree in sports administration at UK.



BRANDI DUNIGAN
Student Assistant

Brandi begins her first season as student assistant to Coach Fanning and the women's basketball staff after serving as Lady Kats manager for one year.

Dunigan, a native of Richmond, Ky., is currently completing work on her bachelor's degree in education and will graduate in May of 1992. She plans to get more involved in the field of coaching following her graduation from UK.

Memorial Coliseum

“HOME OF THE KENTUCKY LADY KATS”

(capacity — 8,700)

Memorial Coliseum is the home of one of the richest basketball traditions in the entire world. It is also the home of Coach Sharon Fanning's Kentucky Lady Kats, a team determined to bring glory and excitement to a facility that has known a wealth of both.

For 24 years, the historic coliseum housed the renowned Kentucky Wildcats, who won two national championships and 24 Southeastern Conference titles there under the direction of legendary coaches Adolph Rupp and Joe B. Hall. But the Wildcats moved downtown to 23,000-seat Rupp Arena in 1976, leaving

center Anne Donovan looming as no foe had before. A record crowd of 10,622 fired-up fans packed the Coliseum that Saturday evening, and roared hysterically as the sixth-ranked Lady Kats came from 10 points down in the second half for an 80-66 upset win. After the victory the Lady Kats, who were led by their own All-American Valerie Still, climbed to fourth in the national poll. In their three remaining home games, they averaged 7,600 fans. And they easily led the nation in attendance that year.

Just as their male counterparts did before them, the Lady Kats have made Memorial Coliseum the home of a

high-class, winning program. They have never had a bad season at home, and once boasted a 31-game win streak in the Coliseum.

In 1941, University President H.L. Donovan began plans for the

Coliseum, when he recommended a building that would “properly take care of our athletics, our health services, our physical education and our recreation.” The building was also nicknamed “the house that Rupp built,” since “the Baron’s” standout teams had long since outgrown 2,800-seat Alumni Coliseum.

Memorial Coliseum was completed in 1950 at a cost of \$3,995,000. The huge building was dedicated to serve as a memorial to the nearly 10,000 Kentuckians who lost their lives in World War II and the Korean conflict. The Coliseum covers an entire city block and has as much space as a seven-story office building.

Situated along Euclid Avenue, Memorial Coliseum is used primarily for basketball games and Athletic Department offices, but also serves as the site of other sporting events, lectures and concerts.



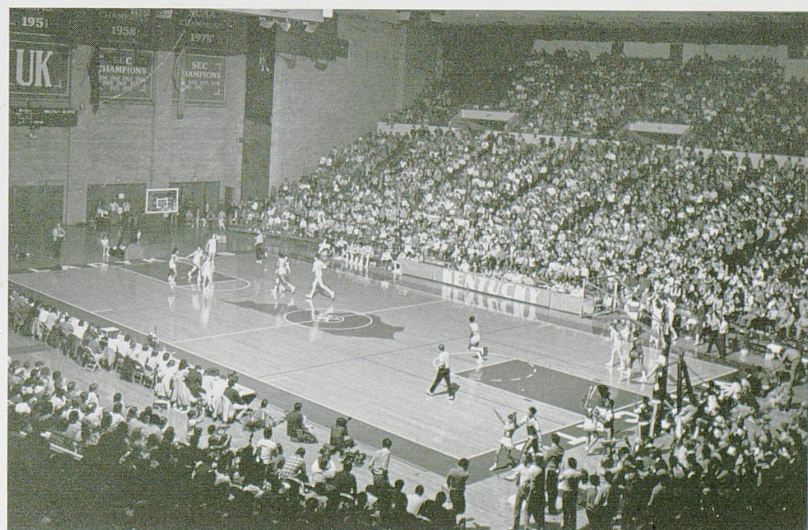

Since then, Memorial Coliseum has undergone renovations to include a state-of-the-art weight room, basketball and administrative offices, a team meeting room and modern dressing and lockerrooms.

The Lady Kats have added a Southeastern Conference title and a National Women's Invitational Tournament Championship to their list of accomplishments, and have proudly carved a 190-64 home court record into the history of the now 8,700-seat coliseum.

The undisputed highlight of the Lady Kats' Memorial Coliseum era came on a cold winter night in 1983. The date was February 5 and the opponent was No. 5 Old Dominion, with 6-foot-8 All-American

The Kats recorded their second consecutive winning season under Coach Fanning.

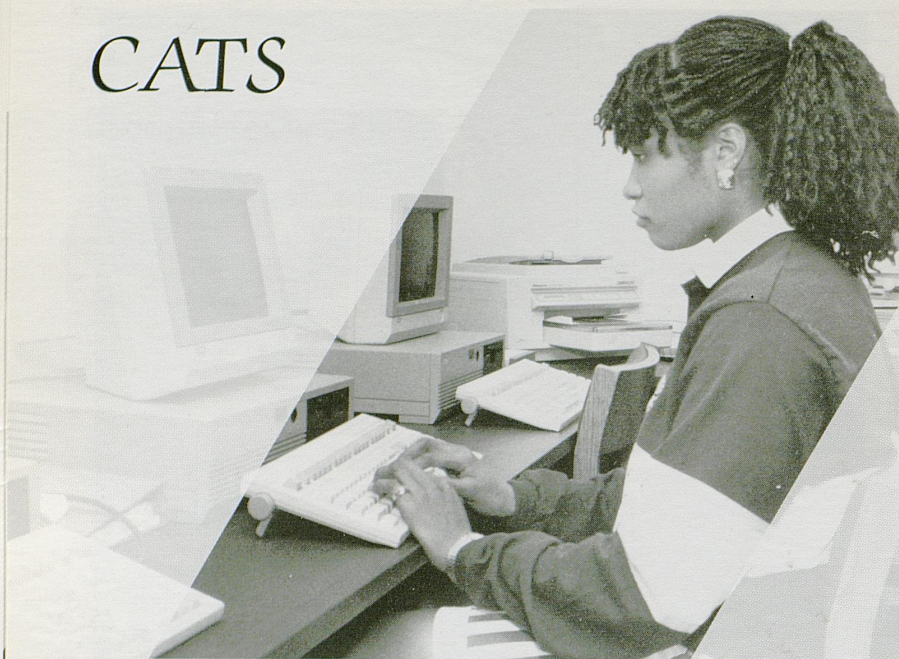

Center For Academic & Tutorial Services

The University of Kentucky continues to keep the term "student-athlete" in the proper perspective — student first, athlete second.

For that reason, the University of Kentucky opened the nation's first academic center for student-athletes in 1981. The academic center is known as the Center for Academic and Tutorial Services or simply "CATS."

CATS is located inside Memorial Coliseum. The center, specifically designed with the student-athlete in mind, contains a large general study area along with numerous smaller rooms used for tutoring. CATS expanded during the past academic year and added a language library, additional tutoring rooms, a media center and a new computer facility.

Currently, the UKAA budgets close to \$500,000 per year for the CATS Center.

"CATS is a tremendous advantage for all of our student athletes," says Lady Kats Coach Sharon Fanning. "We are very proud that Kentucky was the first in the nation to initiate an academic tutorial service of this magnitude."

"Our CATS staff monitors study hall, sets up tutors, requires a freshman orientation program to make sure our athletes get off to a good start and maintains flexible hours to accommodate any request for study time," said Fanning. "CATS also helps arrange summer job opportunities and works with the coaching staff on job placement upon graduation."

Former UK Football Coach Jerry Claiborne put the importance of the CATS Center in perspective when he said:

"There's no question, the CATS Center is a very important part of not only the UK football program, but the entire UK athletics program. Academic pursuits come first at Kentucky."

Indeed, academics do come first. The combination of the CATS Center and Claiborne, who retired after the 1989 football season and has since been replaced by Bill Curry, brought a national championship to UK in 1989. The UK football program was awarded the 1989 College Football Association's Academic Achievement Award for the nation's highest graduation rate for its 1983 freshman class. UK's achievement marked the first time since the inception of the award that a team other than Duke, Virginia or Notre Dame had won the award.

Bob Bradley, Assistant Athletics Director for Academics, supervises the CATS Center. Bradley is assisted by Barbara Deniston, Director of Student Development, and Mike Jenkins, Academic Counselor. The CATS Center also employs four graduate assistants and numerous tutors, both from the University and surrounding community.

"CATS is an incredible advantage to a student-athlete over another without an academic center," Bradley says. "This is a medium which the student-athlete can get any question about his or her academic endeavors answered." Bradley also says it helps to have head coaches that place such a strong emphasis on academics. "Many support systems across the nation do an excellent job at helping their student-athletes," Bradley said. "I have been blessed at Kentucky."

The philosophy at the University of Kentucky is this: Colleges should be able to afford the student-athlete with every opportunity to succeed not only in athletics, but in academics as well. Looking at recent statistics in Academic Honor Roll selections and graduation rates, Kentucky is standing by its philosophy.

At UK, the CATS Center certainly plays an instrumental part in keeping student-athletes at championship performance in the classroom...and on the field.

"CATS helps our players understand overachievement in the classroom. The CATS staff expects the same energy in its program as our coaching staff expects on the basketball court," said Fanning. "CATS is definitely a Kentucky advantage!"

President and Board

Charles T. Wethington, Jr. was named the University of Kentucky's 10th president on September 18, 1990 after serving as interim president for nine months. Prior to assuming the post, he served as Chancellor of the UK Community College system since 1982.

Wethington began his career in higher education in 1965, as an educational psychology instructor on the Lexington campus of the University and entered administration two years later when he was named director of Maysville Community College. In 1971 he moved to the system office in Lexington as assistant vice president, and became vice president of the Community College System in 1981.

In the University reorganization of 1982, he was named chancellor of the UK system, one of the three major sectors of UK.

Under his leadership the Community College System has set enrollment records and added an entire new college at Owensboro.

Wethington earned his master's and doctorate degrees at UK after completing his undergraduate work at Eastern Kentucky University.

The Casey County native has been active on the national higher education scene, serving as legislation committee chairman of the National Council of State Directors of Community and Junior Colleges before moving to

the chairmanship in 1985.

He has been vice chairman of the Executive Council of the Southern Association of College and Schools' Commission on Colleges, and was a member of the search committee for the executive director of the Commission.

He has held membership on the Joint Commission on Federal Relations of the Association of Community College Trustees and the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges, and has served as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

Wethington also is chairman of the Bluegrass State Skills Corporation board of directors, a member of the Board of Visitors of the Community College of the Air Force, a member of the Southern Region Education Board and a member of its Executive Committee. He has been in demand nationally in the accreditation process of community and junior colleges.

During 1957-61 he served as a cryptolinguist in the U.S. Air Force Security Service. He studied Russian at Syracuse University, 1958-59.

Wethington, born Jan. 2, 1936, in Merrimac, Ky., is married to the former Judy Woodrow, a Danville native. They have a son, Kennan, 21, and a daughter, Lisa, 24.

When Charles Martin (C.M.) Newton became the University of Kentucky's seventh Director of Athletics on April 1, 1989, he hit the ground running.

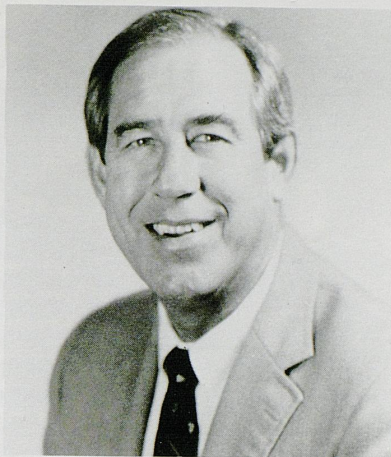
Newton's first order of business was to bring respectability back to a basketball program hit hard by an NCAA investigation. He did so by hiring New York Knickerbockers head man Rick Pitino to coach the Wildcats. A few months later, Newton was faced with the task of hiring a football coach to replace the retiring Jerry Claiborne. Newton again rose to the occasion, luring Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year Bill Curry from the University of Alabama to lead the UK program.

Newton recently scored once again with the UK fans when it was announced that UK's football and basketball games will once again be carried on Louisville's clear-channel, 50,000-watt WHAS Radio, for the first time since 1986.

After little more than a year on the job, Newton has become one of the most popular public figures in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. In addition to a lengthy, impressive list of credentials, Newton brought to Kentucky a sparkling reputation at a crucial time in the history of UK Athletics. In accepting the position at his alma mater, Newton summarized his goals and objectives by saying, "I have a resolve to try very hard to continue that great tradition, and at the same time, to totally do it within the NCAA and SEC rules and not sacrifice the academic integrity of this University."

Newton capped an illustrious basketball coaching career by leading his final Vanderbilt University team to a 19-14 record, a second-place SEC finish and its second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance during the 1988-89 season. He was named SEC Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and also received the Kodak NABC District IV Coach of the Year award. Newton served as head basketball coach and associate athletics director at the Nashville school since 1982, compiling a 129-115 record. In 32 years of coaching at Transylvania, Alabama and Vanderbilt, Newton compiled a 509-375 record overall, ranking among the top 10 active coaches in the game in terms of total victories. His Alabama teams won three consecutive Southeastern Conference championships. He finished his career ranked second in career victories in Southeastern Conference games to his mentor, Coach Adolph Rupp.

Perhaps more impressive, however, was Newton's ability to produce winning teams that also possessed exceptional academic credentials. During Newton's tenure at Vanderbilt, 18 Commodores were named to the Academic All-SEC team, over 50 percent more than any other league school,

and including his last graduating class, all 27 seniors received their diplomas.

Newton is highly regarded on the national level. He has served on the board of directors of the National Association of Basketball Coaches. He worked six years on the NCAA Basketball Rules Committee, serving as chairman of that elite group for five of those years. He also served as vice president of USA Basketball, the nation's governing body for international amateur basketball.

Newton has literally circled the globe to promote the game of basketball. He served as team manager, a combination coaching and administrative position, on the 1984 U.S. Olympic team that won the gold medal. Indiana coach Bob Knight, who tabbed Newton for the Olympic staff, called him "the finest gentleman in our business." In 1983 and 1987, Newton took Vanderbilt squads to the Republic of China (Taiwan) to represent the United States in the R. William Jones Cup International Tournament, winning the gold medal in 1983 and the silver in 1987. He has also conducted coaching clinics in numerous countries.

Newton began his coaching career at Transylvania College (now Transylvania University) in Lexington. Recommended for the job by Coach Rupp, Newton guided Transy to a 169-137 record in his 12 years at the helm.

In 1969, once again with the backing of Rupp, Newton answered a call from Paul "Bear" Bryant to take on the challenge of building the downtrodden Alabama basketball program. During his 12-year tenure, Newton orchestrated a complete turnaround in the Crimson Tide's basketball fortunes, compiling a sparkling 211-123 record.

In addition to three SEC championships, Newton guided the Tide to two trips to the NCAA Tournament and four berths in the NIT.

With few horizons left to conquer at Alabama, Newton resigned at the end of the 1980 season to accept a job as assistant commissioner of the Southeastern Conference. A year later, when Vanderbilt athletics director Roy Kramer was searching for a coach of national stature to head the Commodores basketball program, Newton was the obvious man for the job.

Newton was born Feb. 2, 1930, in Rockwood, Tenn. He grew up in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., where he was eventually named a charter member of that city's Sports Hall of Fame, along with Chris Evert, Julius Boros and the late Brian Piccolo. Newton is married to the former Evelyn Davis of Ft. Lauderdale. The Newtons have three grown children — daughters Deborah and Mrs. Tracy Thompson and son Martin.

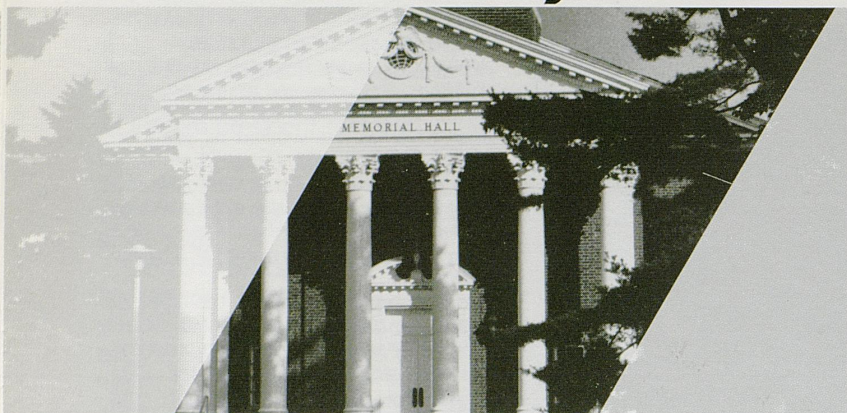

THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY

From its modest beginnings in 1865, when it was known as State College, the University of Kentucky has grown into one of the nation's most outstanding institutions of higher learning. As a comprehensive land-grant university, UK offers an educational experience that cannot be matched anywhere in the Commonwealth. In fact, only a small number of institutions across the nation can offer the wealth of opportunities that awaits students at UK. At Kentucky, there is a tradition of value.

UK EDUCATES 37% OF THE COLLEGE STUDENTS IN KENTUCKY

With more than 63,000 students — 23,000 on the Lexington campus and 40,000 at the community colleges across the state — the University of Kentucky now educates 37% of all students in Kentucky attending a public or private college or university.

UK HAD 26 NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARS IN FRESHMAN CLASS

There were 26 National Merit Scholars in the Fall 1990 freshman class on the Lexington Campus, an all-time record. They came from all sections of the Commonwealth including Lexington, Louisville, Pine Knot, Perryville, Murray, Beaver Dam and Hopkinsville. There were 77 high school valedictorians and 99 Governor's Scholars in the 1990 freshman class.

UK TAKING INITIATIVE TO ATTRACT MINORITY STUDENTS AND FACULTY

Thanks to initiatives in minority affairs, there were 10 new minority faculty at the University as it opened in Fall 1990, including the first Afro-American dean (College of Education) at UK.

UK NOW GIVING \$1.7 MILLION IN MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships to UK students based on merit now total some \$1.7 million a year. The most prestigious is the Singletary Scholarships which provide students four years of college at no cost. In the 1990-91 academic year there are 24 Singletary Scholars — 22 in the freshman class and two transfers from the UK community colleges.

UK HAS REACHED THE TOP CATEGORY OF RESEARCH UNIVERSITIES

The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching has classified UK as a "Research University of the First Class," the only such institution in Kentucky and one of only 45 in the nation.

UK AMONG NATION'S TOP UNIVERSITIES IN COMPUTING

Thanks to a \$4.9 million gift from the IBM Corporation, UK continues its role as one of the leading computing universities in the nation. The gift helped UK upgrade its IBM Supercomputer that is now being used at UK by both faculty and students. UK ranks in the top tier of public universities in the nation in computing capacity.

UK FACULTY WIN AWARDS AND HONORS IN MANY FIELDS

Some examples: GUY DAVENPORT, English, was a 1990 recipient of the prestigious MacArthur Fellowship. JOHN N. WALTER, Agricultural Engineering, is president of the American Society of Agricultural Engineers. CARY CROMWELL, Animal Science is president of the American Society of Animal Science. JOHN R. VAN NAGELL, Obstetrics and Gynecology, was selected as one of the outstanding medical specialists in the country by Town and Country magazine. LINDA CHEN, Nutrition and Food Science, won the Borden Award for exceptional research in nutrition. RAMONA RUSH, Communications, was named the outstanding woman in the field by the Association for Education in Journalism and Mass Communication's status of women committee.

UK FACULTY BRING \$70 MILLION IN GRANTS, CONTRACTS AND GIFTS

UK faculty brought in some \$70 million in grants, contracts and gifts from outside sources in the 1989-90 academic year. The record amount was 17% greater than the year before and marked a 70% increase in the past five years. As further indication of UK's faculty expertise, 98% of them have the highest degree attainable in their fields.

UK STUDENTS WIN MANY PRESTIGIOUS AWARDS AND HONORS

The debate team took second-place in the nation's largest invitational collegiate debate tournament in 1990. For three years in a row, the College of Law moot court team has been in the national finals of the intercollegiate moot court competition. A UK nursing student was one of 121 U.S. collegians chosen for the USA Today All-USA College Academic Team. UK's cheerleaders finished second in 1990 for the second straight year in the College Cheerleading Championships. UK was national champion in 1985, '87 and '88. The UK yearbook won first place nationally in competitions sponsored by the Associated Collegiate Press and the National Scholastic Press Association. UK's student newspaper received the All-America honor rating five marks of distinction, placing it in the top third of the nation's best student newspapers. The UK Jazz Ensemble was voted most outstanding among 14 student combos or big bands invited to perform at the Notre Dame College Jazz Festival, the most prestigious event of its kind in the nation.
