Resolved that no member shall be allowed to speak on any one question more than five minutes, nor to speak twice until all who desire to speak have had an opportunity - unless by permission of the Board - adopted.

Curator Withers offered the following Resolved - That the Rule requiring the sessions of the Board be closed, be suspended temporarily during the present sitting of the Board - adopted.

The report of the Standing Committee on College of Arts by their Chairman Curator Campbell approved and ordered filed.

Curator Ricketts as Chairman of Comtee on the Bible College read his report which is filed together with the amendments of Curator Joseph Smith who also moved that the Report & amendments be postponed to the opening of the meeting of the Board this /231/

That the Exective Com. be instructed to confer with the Faculty of the law College and with their consent permit the Treasurer to report in his annual account the tuition fees of students of said College as received by him in full and the same as paid in full to the said Faculty to preserve his accounts in due form of law, the said Faculty being allowed to collect or these fees of the students and divide among themselves as they wish, the matriculation fees to be collected & accounted for by the Treasurer and that the Students of this College be required to observe the rules of matriculation and discipline impaired on Students of all other Departments - Adopted.

Smith be constituted and adjunct Prof. of English literature, This will give Prof. Pickett more time for the critical instruction of advanced classes - relieve Prof. McGarvey of the Sophomore class in Sacred History and give other needed aid in this department.
