Hobbs to the effect that the R. O. T. C. units of the United States would be given an opportunity to assist in the completion of the stadium, and asked for twenty-five cents from each student in the Reserve Officers Training Corps.

Colonel Hobbs, who spent four years at Fort Benning before coming to the university, and who was in charge of the Kentucky subscriptions, sent a telegram to officers at Fort Benning stating that the local unit had already made a 60 percent subscription, and would probably make it 80 percent in a few days.

The donations to this fund was made through the various instructors in the Military department and approximately 700 students.

The following letter was received by Col. Hobbs in reply to his telegram announcing that Kentucky had "gone over":

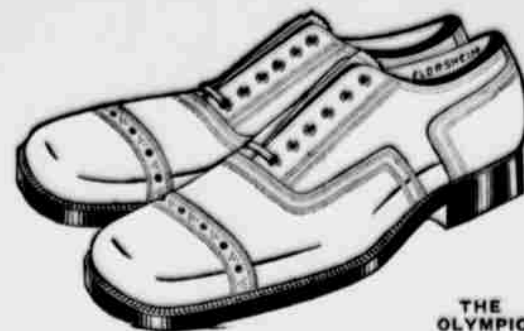

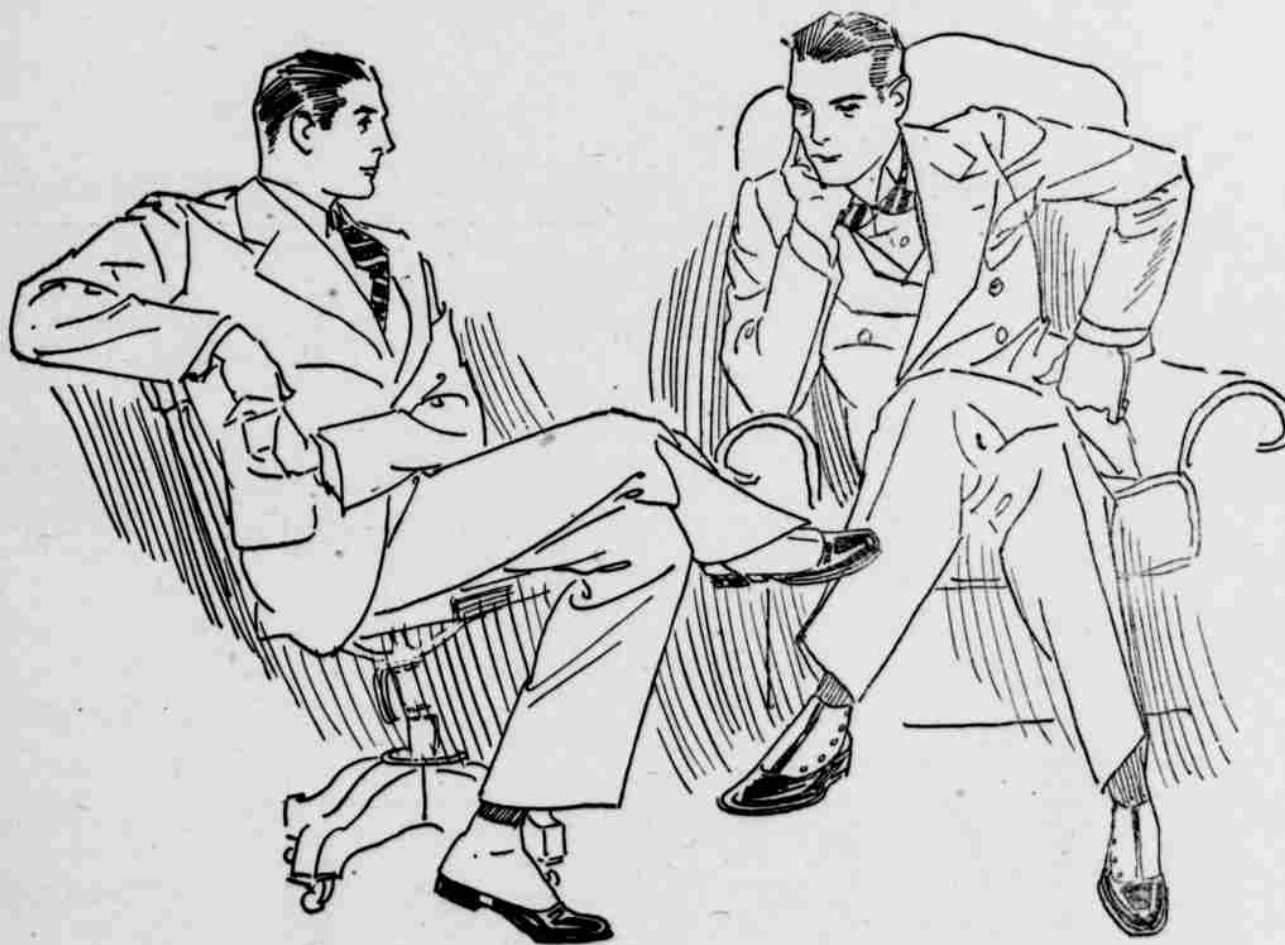
