# IFC Reveals New Rush System

The fraternity rush system this year has been drastically reconstructed to facilitate rushees finding the fraternity of their choice, Bill Cooper, president of Interfraternity Council,

said.

The new aspects in this year's program include a bid system.

With this invocation upperclassmen, second semester freshmen and transfer students will sign a preference card on which they will list in order of preference the fraternities which they are willing to pledge.

The fraternities will also submit bids with the names of the eligible rushees the fraternity is willing to

Interfraternity Council will determine which men pledge which fraternities by coordinat-ing the two sets of cards according to the preferences of the rushees and fraternities.

Bid Day is scheduled for Sept. 30 when there will be a formal an-

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# State Law Forces Car Registration

The law previously a University regulation is to be placed into effect at all state supported colleges and universities.

The ruling will be the same as in past years and the enforcement will be as strict or even more so according to Kenneth E. Harper, acting dean of men. He said there are no changes in student automobile registration excepting the fee for student parking permits habeen increased to \$10.

Dean Harper said the rules permit only seniors, juniors or sophomores with a 3.0 standing or above to register their automobile register their problems. No student on academic probation or freshmen will be granted permission to register their cars. He noted exceptions would be made only by the Dear's Office.

The long-range goal of the institute will be its development into a "ministry of justice" to survey the law and its practice and make appropriate suggestions, for improvement.

The institute, first proposed by the UK College of Law in 1954, was authorized in July, 1962.

In recent years there has been a steady demand on the college by the bar and governmental agencies for assistance in various projects.

The proposed mistitute would act as a local counterpart within the College of Law to cooperate with these groups.

Dr. Paul Oberst, UK professor of law, will head the institute in addition to his regular duties. Law students will eventually be hirred for part time work groups. duties. Law students will eventually be-hired for part time work
