ABOUT THE LIBRARIES:

UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY RETIREMENT PLAN

On September 18, 1979, the Board of Trustees approved an amended version of the University of Kentucky Retirement Plan based on a normal retirement age of 65 and a mandatory retirement age of 70. Amended Administrative Regulation AR II-8.0-4 has been filed in the Library's copies of the University Governing Regulations and Administrative Regulations and is available for review.

Major changes in the University of Kentucky Retirement Plan are focused on (1) eligibility of an employee to continue to work until the end of the fiscal year in which the employee attains age 70, (2) termination of University contributions on behalf of an employee in the TIAA/CREF Plan at the end of the fiscal year in which the employee attains age 65, and (3) modification in policy and procedures relative to employment of an individual beyond retirement.

If there are questions about the University's amended retirement plan please see Mr. Willis.

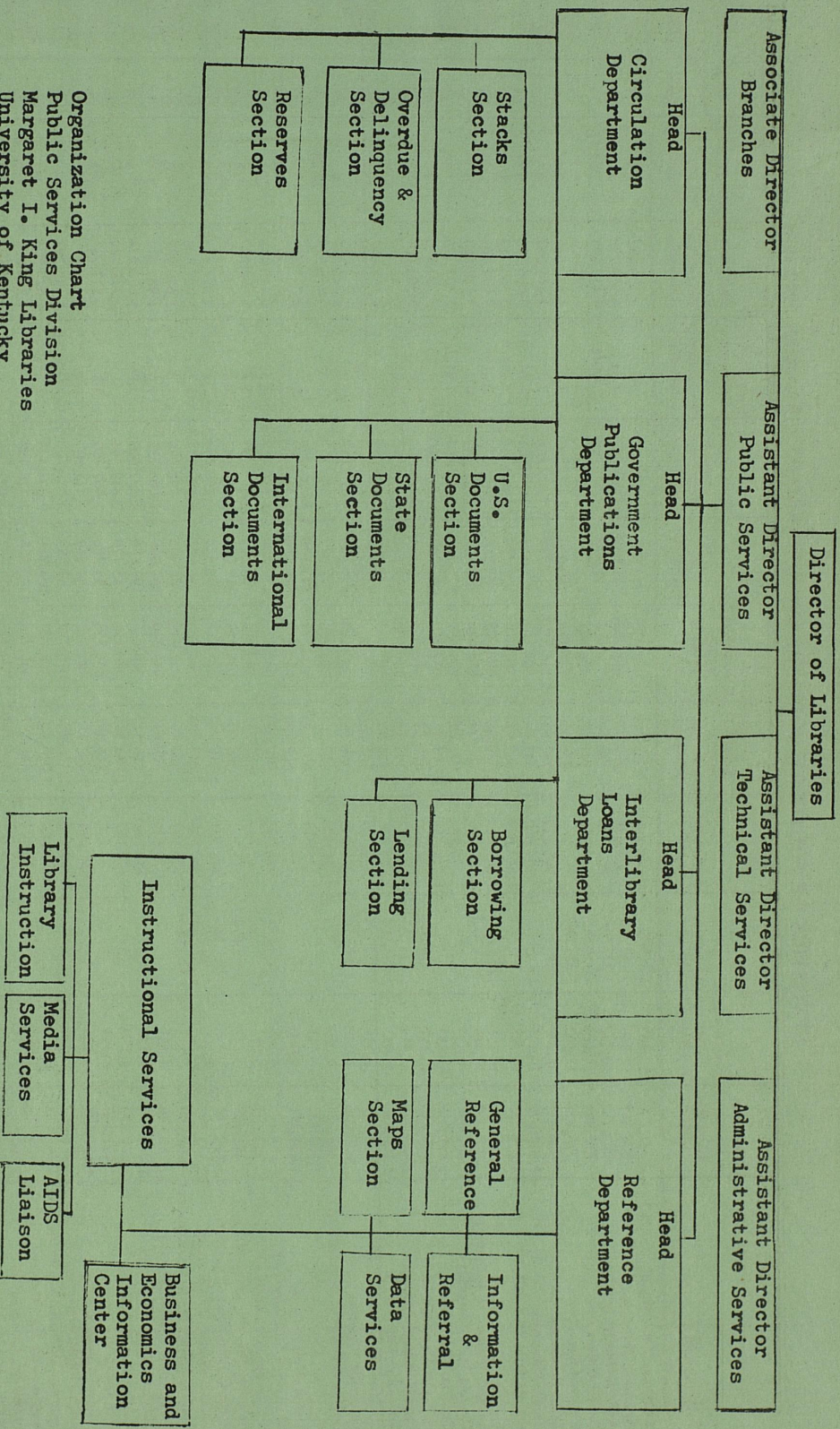
