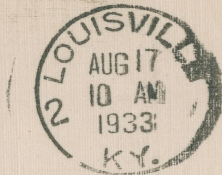
We have been real busy all week and the mornings are so short going in at 9 o'clock. It seem no time until noon but the evening are real long at least they seem that way to me.

waiting to hear from you.

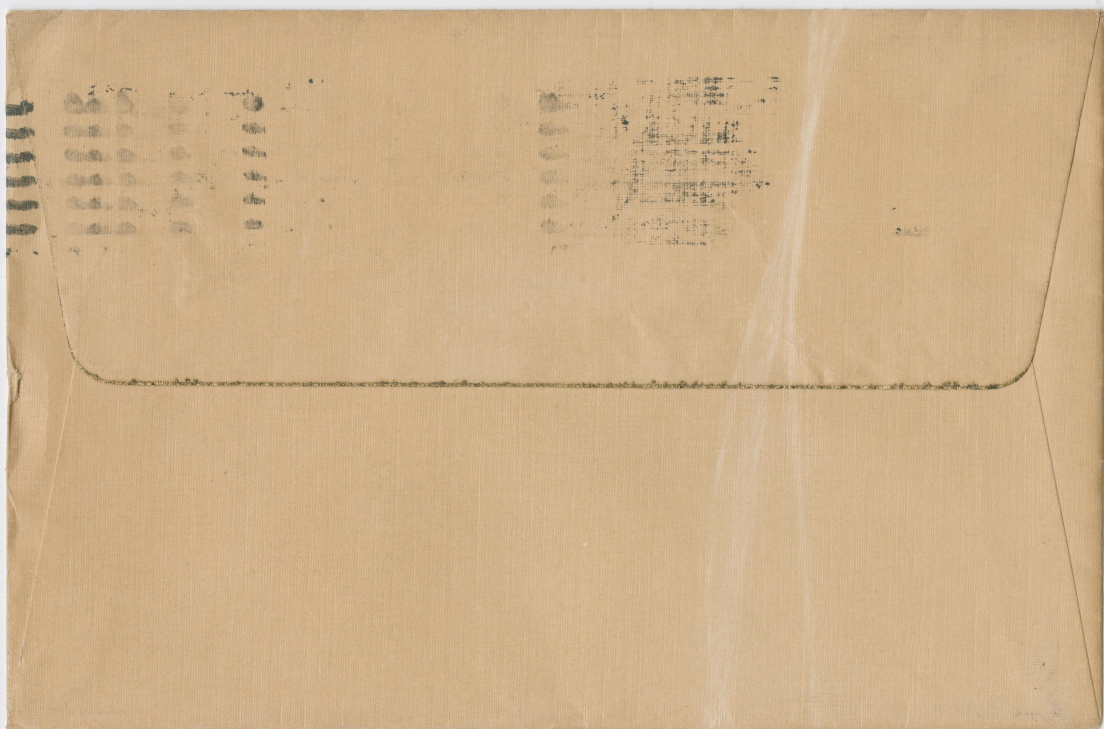

I am a widow tonight. Myrtle has gone to Shelbyville. She swore it was no desertion and that she would return to me by tomorrow sure and then for a long time.

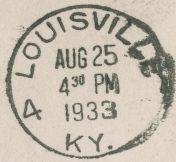
