Nice digs: Apartment complex offers many amenities but costs more than the dorms

Due to an on-campus housing crunch, UK is offering students a new, untried option for housing.

UK has arranged a deal with the University Commons, a privately owned apartment complex off Red Mile Road, to allow students to live there through their housing contract with UK.

Jim Wims, director of Residence Life, said UK has never before tried such an arrangement. "This is new terrain for us, and will present new challenges." Wims said. "But we're approaching it with a 'can do' attitude." Ben Crutcher, associate vice president of Auxiliary Services, said UK has agred to lease 72 four-bedroom

Study finds chemicals can burn out sperm VIENNA, Austria - Researchers have found the first direct evidence that chemicals in the environment · including some in foods such as peas and beer - mimic the effect of the female sex hormone estrogen on the ability of sperm to fertilize eggs. Scientists reported Tueday at Europe's annual human reproduction conference that such chemicals seem to have a much more potent effect on sperm than estrogen found in the body, and that they might make sperm burn out before reaching the egg. The study was conducted with mice, but experts say human sperm behave very similarly.







Improve relations between the city and the university

Housing shortages on campus have led UK to strike a deal with the privately owned University Commons apartment complex to house undergraduate students. Although UK currently has a list of 500 students waiting for housing, Jim Wims, director of Residence Life, said UK doesn't have a long-term plan for the campus housing shortage.

The lack of on-campus housing may soon force some students to seek

off-campus residences. After receiving numerous complaints from area orr-campus residences. After receiving numerous companies from area residents, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Council passed the Lexington Area Party Plan (LAPP) back in November. Violators of the ordinance would be issued a \$500 fine. After two citations, the property would

Tensions remain high between students and Lexington residents. As the demand for campus housing increases, more and more students are forced to seek off-campus residences. Some students have also cited UK's no-alcohol policy as a deterrent for living on campus. If students are un-

happy with the university's policies or simply cannot find housing, they are naturally going to seek out housing near campus.

Residents who live near a college campus should understand the likelihood that their neighbors will be college students. Some, but not all, colhood that their neighbors will be college students. Some, but not all, college students want to party. While such things as public drunkenness, illegal drinking and urinating on neighboring lawns are inappropriate, these issues should have been dealt with using individual ordinances. Instead, the LAPP serves as a one-size-fits-all bandage over the real problems plaguing the city and the university.

As a feminist, my wedding ceremony was not typical. No one said "man and wife", and my father did not "give me away" (I am not his to give). Instead, phrases such as "marriage of equals" and "celebration of unity" filled the day.

I expected strange glances from my family and confusion from friends who have been planning the perfect wedding from the time they were in the womb. I did not, however, expect the amount of protest and grief I would encounter for not changing my last name.

I thought it was fairly common for women to keep their surnames, but it turns out I was wrong. Only 12 percent of women who get married keep their birth names, according to theknot com, a marriage resource Web site.

Even though the percentage of women who keep their own names is small, I still did not expect to run into such a lack of understanding. I was especially surprised that most of the problems have not stemmed from family but from the general public.

It seems as if everyone has a problem understanding that I want to keep my own name. The landlord called me back and said he thought our application was good, but he noticed that my husband and I did not share the same last name. He asked for an explanation.

I quickly told my curious landlord that I had not changed my name when we married and silence followed. For a second, I wondered if this was going to be a deciding factor in whether or not we could get this house. Finally, he said OK and my anxiety ceased as I hung up the phone.

The fact that I kept my own name should not be as shocking as some people are making it seem to be. No one has the right, especially in public forums and in an application process, to question my personal decisions.

Just when everyone thought the UK basketball team had put their troubles behind them, something else happens that derails their sense of security. Coach Tubby Smith announced last


week that junior point guard Cliff Hawkins would be ineligible for the upcoming fall semester for academic

Smith will probably turn to junior Gerald Fitch or junior college transfer Antwain Barbour.
