The University Senate met in White Hall Monday, March 18. with President McVey presiding.

The minutes of February 11 were approved as read.

Hygiene 105 - Advanced Hygiene. Prerequisite Hygiene 1 and Bacteriology. Two hours a week; two credits. (To replace 105a,b)

Hygiene 110 - Health Education and Health Supervision of Schools. Prerequisite Hygiene 1, 105 and Bacteriology advised. Three hours a week; 3 credits. (to replace 110a, b)

Hygiene 113 - Vital Statistics. Prerequisite, Hygiene 1. Three hours a week; three credits

Hygiene 1.2 - Public Health Law and Administration. Prerequisite Hygiene 1. Three hours a week. Three credits

Hygiene 114 - Industrial Hygiene · Prere a week; three credits (Omitted 1929-30) Prerequisite, Hygiene 1. Three hours a week;

Hygiene 115 + Epidemiology. Prerequisite, Hygiene 1. Three hours a week. Three credits

Hygiene 116 - Sociologic and Economic Aspects of Diseases. Three hours a week; three credits (Omitted 1929-30)

Horticulture 103 - Apple Production. 3 credits

Horticulture 104 - Stone Fruits. 3 credits

Education 149 - Extra-Curricular Activities. 2 credits

Agricultural Education 287 - Advanced Problems in Agricultural Education - changed from 187. Open only to graduate students.

Agricultural Education 280 - Methods in Teaching Vocational Agriculture - changed from 180. Open only to graduate students.

The following recommendations from the College of Arts and Sciences were approved:

"The faculty of the College of Arts and Sciences recommends to the Senate the following changes in requirements for the degree of Bachelor of Science in Industrial Chemistry:

- 1. Instead of Chemistry 113a and b, Organic Chemistry, eleven credits, require Chemistry 127a and b, Organic Chemistry, 10 cmedits (5 credits per semester).
- 2. Instead of Chemistry 115a and b, Physical Chemistry, six credits, require Chemistry 131a and b, Physical Chemistry, eight credits (4 credits per semester)
- 3. Drop Hygiene 1b, 1.3 credits and substitute Hygiene 1 for la, 1.3 credits.

The effect of these changes is to reduce the total requirements for graduation by .3 of a credit."

The following recommendation from the College of Law was approved:

"Students having the major part of their work in law must in all cases register in the College of Law.

Seniors registered in other colleges, and by reason thereof carrying at least one-half of their work therein, may take as many as eight hours of law during a semester, selected from the following courses: Contracts, Torts, Agency, Crimes, Property I and II, Constitutional Law, Taxation, Municipal Corporations, Public Utilities and such other law courses as the Dean of the College of Law may approve

Students registered in other colleges who are not seniors may take work in the College of Law, only on securing the consent of the Dean of the College of Law.

Students taking the combined six year Arts-Law or Commerce-Law courses should, before taking up law subjects, complete the first three years of Arts or Commerce work, including all subjects required for the degree in these colleges."

The following proposed rule was read and action postponed to the next meeting:

"Teachers in service carrying full teaching loads are not allowed to gain more than 6 credits a semester in the University."
