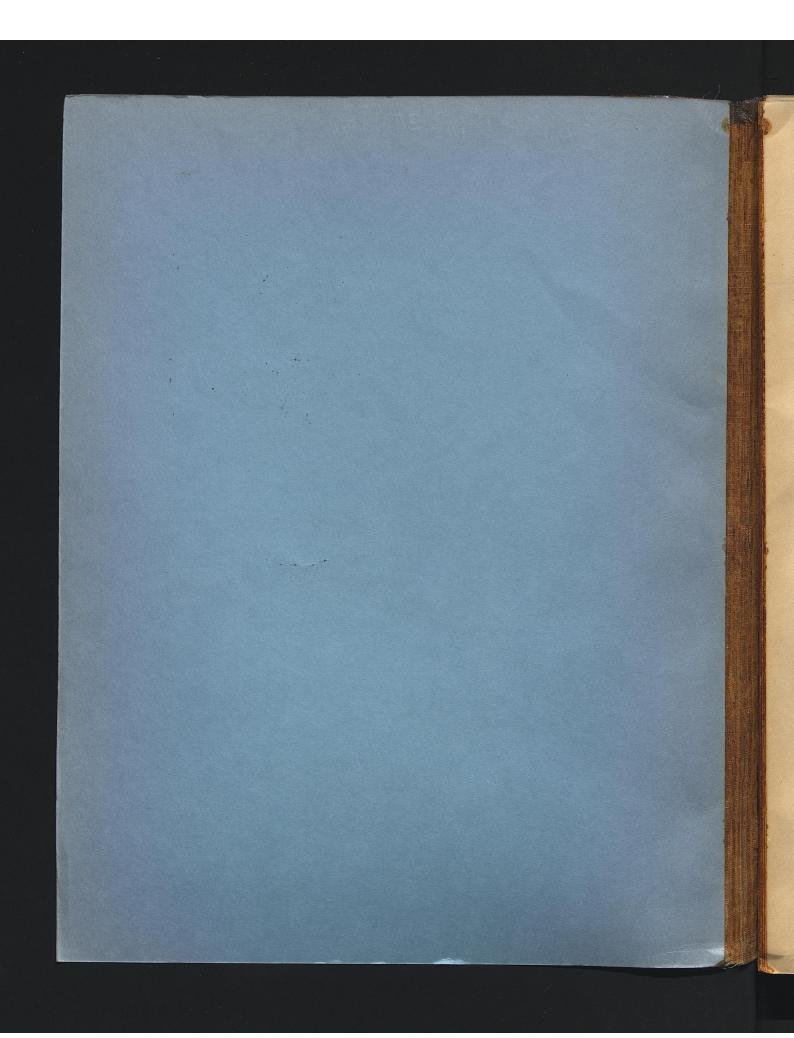

PREFACE

The Inventory of Federal Archives in the States is one of the products of the work of the Survey of Federal Archives, which operated as a nation-wide project of the Works Progress Administration from January 1, 1936 to June 30, 1937, and has been continued since that date as a unit of the Historical Records Survey, also operating as a nation-wide project of the Work Projects Administration, and a group of

state or local projects of that administration.

The plan for the organization of the Inventory is as follows: Series I consists of reports on the administration of the Survey, acknowledgments, and general discussions of the location, condition, and content of federal archives in the state. Succeeding series contain the detailed information secured by workers of the Survey, in inventory form, a separate series number being assigned to each of the executive departments (except the Department of State) and other major units of the Federal Government. Within each series No. 1 is a general introduction to the field organization and records of the governmental agency concerned; the succeeding numbers contain the inventory proper, separate numbers being assigned to each state in alphabetical order. Thus, in each series, the inventory for Alabama is No. 2, that for Arizona No. 3, that for Arkansas No. 4, etc.

For each local office information regarding each series, or unit of related records, is presented in the following order: title, inclusive dates ("to date" indicating an open file at the time the information was secured), general description of informational content, description of the system of filing or indexing (if any), a statement of frequency and purpose of use, form of the record itself (bound volumes, sheets in folders, etc.), footage, description of the containers, physical condition of the records (not stated if satisfactory), location by room number or other identifying information, and finally, the number of the Form 58SA on which this information was originally recorded by a Survey worker and from which it was abstracted for the Inventory. This form is on file in the National Archives. When it contains additional information on addenda sheets which have not been included in the mimeographed abstract, indication of this is given by use of the reference "See addenda."

The work of the Survey in Western Pennsylvania was under the direction of Mr. Louis W. H. Johnson, Regional Director from February 11, 1936 until October 4, 1937. Since that time and until March 30, 1939 Mr. John T. McMahon, Project Unit Supervisor directed the Survey. The Survey in Eastern Pennsylvania was directed by Mr. Richard R. Heindel, Regional Director, from February 26 until August 1936 and from August until December 31, 1936 by Mr. John L. Corry: After Dr. Corry's resignation nation the project was reorganized with Dr. Richard B. Morris of New York as regional director and James L. Whitehead as Assistant Regional Director. In October 1937 Mr. James L. Whitehead was appointed Project Superintendent for the state and acted in that capacity until September 19, 1938 when he resigned and was succeeded by Miss Williametta Wallace. This Inventory of the records of the Department of Agriculture in Pennsylvania was prepared in the Philadelphia and Pittsburgh offices of the Survey and was edited before final typing by Wr. L. J. Darter Jr. of the Washington office.

U.S. Custom House, 2d and Chestnut Sts.

This office was established in June 1906. It administers regulations throughout the State of Delaware, Southern New Jersey, and the eastern section of Pennsylvania. Its functions are to inspect and analyze samples of various products falling under the jurisdiction of the Food and Drugs Act. Some of the papers of this office have been destroyed by fire. After a period of five years, upon proper authorization, useless papers are destroyed. Important records are filed in Washington, D.C.

- 1. ANALYSIS CARDS, 1906 1936. Cards written up, and collected by Dr. Brinton personally over a period of 30 years, chiefly from newspaper articles and trade journals, relating to the introduction of new food and drug products on the market. - 5. DECIMAL FILES, 1918 1936. Decimal filing system; correspondence and documents covered by the files relate to all the manifold activities of the local office. Filed according to subject matter. - 6. SHIRLEY AMENDMENTS IMPORTS, 1919 1935. Multigraph cards for information issued at Washington, D.C. by the Department of agriculture, concerning the composition and analysis of products imported from abroad or other states; if a violation of the pure food and drugs law is apparent, department's criticism is set forth and appropriate action recommended. (Daily, official.) 5 x 8 papers, 2 ft. $1\frac{1}{2}$ in., in 20 drawers of wooden filing cases. R. 1204. (2663)

- 7. MISCELLANEOUS CORRESPONDENCE, 1920 1935. Correspondence between this office and the department at Washington, D.C., dealing with supplies for local office; requests from consumers for publications issued by the Department, and requests for speakers to appear before gatherings interested in domestic science and pure foods, to explain the function of the Department of Agriculture Food and Drug Administration. (Monthly, official.) 9 x 12 folders, 6 ft., in 4 drawers of wooden filing cases. R. 1204. (2659)
- 8. FOOD AND DRUG VOUCHERS, 1935 1936. Food and Drug vouchers listing duplicate bills attached; bills cover expenses incidental to the operation of the Philadelphia office. (Weekly, official.) 9 x 12 folders, 2 ft., in drawer of wooden filing case. R. 1204. (2661)

The Kane Experimental Forest within the Allegheny National Forest was established in 1931. The Kane Experimental Forest comprises 1736.8 acres of government land situated in the Allegheny National Forest in Jones Township, Elk County, Pennsylvania; the tract lies for the most part on a high plateau dissected by various streams. "The object in establishing the Kane Experimental Forest is to provide a center of field work for the Experiment Station in the birch, beach, maple and hemlock type of trees. Here are carried on investigations of methods of stand improvements, such as cleanings and thinnings, of methods of cutting to obtain natural regeneration, of rehabilitation of areas wrecked by cutting and fire, and the more silvical and ecological problems involved in the management of the type. It is hoped that the tract will also prove suitable for the investigation of the effect of forests on stream flow, particularly because regulation of stream flow was the object for which the Allegheny National Forest was originally established."

The agency was located in the Laboratory Building, R.D. No.2, Kane, Pa. on the seven mile road from Kane to Wilcox; the agency has

been in this location since its establishment.

None of the records have been lost or destroyed although most of the experimental data has been transferred from the Kane Branch Field Station to the Philadelphia office of the allegheny Forest Experimental Station. No useless papers and destroyed without official authorization from the allegheny Forest Experimental Station. Instructions, regulations and orders from the office of Experiment Stations as well as from the Forest Service, Eastern Region No.7, Regional Office, determine the disposition of records to Philadelphia and Washington, D.C. headquarters.

- 9. ADMINISTRATIVE OPERATION FILE, Jan. 1931 to date. Correspondence incoming and outgoing, maps, blueprints, telegrams, news letters, circular letters, etc. See addenda. (Frequently, official.) 9 x 12 folders, 4 in., in wooden filing case. Field Office. (1)
- 10. INVENTORY STRIP-CRUISE SHEETS, 1932. Inventory cruise sheets as to the tally of trees, species, diameter, reproduction tally, and sample trees. The Kane Experimental Forest was cruised by strips. This data is the original basis for compilation of percentage of species as shown on the Photostatic Map of the Kane Experimental Forest. Sample forms used on file in the National Archives. (Occasionally, official.) 9 x 12 envelopes, 1 ft., in wooden cupboard. Field Office. (5)
- 11. INVESTIGATION FILE, Jan. 1931 to date. Incoming and outgoing correspondence, blueprints, reports, catalogues and specifications. The file contains material regarding: the pumps and water system, the power plant and septic tank; also in regard to RS-AL (research-silvics), mensuration of trees, general material as to hardwoods within the Forest, data regarding the Kane Experimental Forest Soil Survey, and the material regarding damage by bears of various tree plots. Other data regarding

forestation in general, and specifically as regards student labor, poplar hybrids, planting of Norway pine, protection of trees from animals and diseases, phenology, and general weather influences. Weather data and specific tree studies are also in the file. (Frequently, official.) 9 x 12 folders, 6 in., in wooden filing cases. Field Office. (2)

As shown on this map the component parts of the Kane Experimental Forest consists of stands of timber of various species as well as of various age groups; this furnishes the basis for the division of the Experimental Forest into compartments. These compartments are more or less typical of the Allegheny National Forest as a whole. The area of the Allegheny National Forest is 739,277 acres (gross) including privately owned land. Map Legend shows: Experimental Forest boundary, adjacent property lines, compartment line, stand boundary, good motor road, secondary motor road, wagon road, trail or path, railroad, abandoned railroad grade, pipe lines, telephone or telegraph line, wire fence, barbed wire fence, stone fence, Experimental Forest corner, National Forest corner, cruise stake, compartment corner, building and gas well.  - 16. WEATHER BUREAUS: COOPERATIVE OBSERVER'S METEORLOGICAL RECORD, Feb. 1936 to date. Weather Bureau Form 1009: Meteorlogical Record for the Kane Station. Observations taken between 5 and 6 P.M. Record as to temperature, precipitation, direction of wind, character of day and miscellaneous. (Daily, official.) 9 x 15 loose-leaf book, 1 in., in cupboard built in wall. Field Office. (10)

- 20. DIARIES, FIRE SLIPS, PROPERTY RECORDS, AND BILLS, 1932 1936. Miscellaneous records including Form 877, Purchase records, etc., and official diaries pertaining to several forest rangers for the years 1935 and 1936. (Occasionally, official.) Variously sized bound vols., and loose sheets, 8 in., in wooden card cabinet and cupboard. Field Office. (12)

KINZUA

ALLEGHENY NATIONAL FOREST COAL KNOB FIRE LOOKOUT TOWER Coal Knob Tower near Kinzua

This lookout tower was established about 1922 and is operated in conjunction with the Pennsylvania Department of Forests and Waters.

No important records have been lost or destroyed. In regard to so-called useless papers it would be necessary to receive instructions from district supervisor's headquarters allegheny National Forest, before this file material could be destroyed. Reports and other data deemed necessary are sent through official channels and local administrative units of the Allegheny National Forest, and the Eastern Regional Office at Washington, D.C.

- 21. LOOKOUT REPORT, Apr. 1936 to date. Form 1-R-7, report of fire sighted. In cases of fire sighted, lookout telephones report to district office. It is then transmitted to other stations in the area. By means of adopted triangulation and through the cooperation of other stations, the location of the fire can be established with exactness and prompt measures taken to control or extinguish it. Filed in a chronological order. (Frequently, official.) 4 x 7 loose-leaf book, 1 in., on wooden table in office. Tower. (1)
- 22. NATIONAL FOREST TRAVELERS! REGISTER, Apr. 1936 to date. Form 449 A, register of visitors, with addresses and date of visit. (Frequently, official.) 9 x 12 loose-leaf book, 1 in., on wooden table in office. Tower. (2)

23. DaILY LOG AND DIARY, July 1933 to date. Form 934, contains entries of events pertaining to operation of station. (Daily, official.) $8 \times 10\frac{1}{4}$ vols., 3 in., on wooden shelf. Tower. (3)

PHILADELPHIA

FOREST AND RANGE EXPERIMENT STATION 3437 Woodland Ave.

This office was established on July 1, 1927. Its functions are to disseminate information as to the best methods for the use of forest products and to conduct investigations into the field of forestry. Correspondence and intra-office memoranda are destroyed after five years. Vouchers, paid bills and expense accounts are destroyed after seven years. Original data, gathered by field men, are made into reports and are sent to Washington, D.C. periodically.

- 24. FIELD DATA AND NOTES, 1924 1937. Data and reports of original work by workers in the field arranged according to name of projects; individual tree records showing: tree number, species, diameter and height in inches (4½ from highest side), total height by feet, volume of individual tree and basal area in square feet, physical condition, crown form and supplementary notes, height to base of crown by feet, area by acres, the location and the name of forest where cumulative record was made on sample lot is also reported on Form 562-2A. Plantation reports from Kane, Pa., giving complete report on condition found in area. Standard Summary and Periodic Increment sheet on Form 523 shows total number of trees per acre, increase or decrease in number of trees, dead trees etc., reported on sample plot at specified forest over period of time on trees over 3.5 inches in diameter. Reports on proposed projects including statistics sheets, memoranda, correspondence and working plans; object of the study is to obtain the biological information necessary to successful silvia cultural management; plan of work: to obtain information on number of forces, species and character, methods of planting, etc., expenses, salaries and wages, transportation and equipment, number of men required and time involved, cooperation and agencies working along similar lines such as Resettlement, Land Grant Colleges, etc. Arranged alphabetically. (Daily, official.) 10 x 12 folders, 21 ft., in 9 drawers of 3 wooden filing cases. 1st and 2d floor. (9336)
- 50. TRACINGS AND BLUE PRINTS, 1927 1937. Tracings and blue prints of wood done in the field, plans and specifications for new buildings, at various experimental stations, tracings contain data on field erosion, slopes and soil condition, i. e., type of soil and production soil. The Mechanical Section of the Division of Operations was established approximately in 1922. Prior to locating in the Garage at the rear of the Northern Ranger District Station, allegheny National Forest near Sheffield, Pa., Nov. 1, 1934 this division was located at Marienville, Pa. 1922 - Oct. 31, 1934. Although this agency is located at the rear of the Northern Ranger District Station it comes directly under the supervision of the District Supervisor's Headquarters allegheny National Forest has charge of Equipment Repairs of trucks, heavy equipment, etc. in service in the Allegheny National Forest including the equipment used at the various Civilian Conservation Camps located within the Forest. This Division also occasionally repairs Department of Commerce vehicles which are in this area on official business.

Records prior to 1934 are not stored at present location; whether these records were destroyed or still stored at Marienville, Pa. could not be learned. The Allegheny National Forest was organized October 21, 1921. The area involved within the boundaries of the Forest is 739,277 acres, including privately owned land. As of March 1, 1936, 427,854 acres have been acquired or approved for purchase and includes parts of Warren, McKean, Elk and Forest Counties in Northwestern Pennsylvania. The organization, supervision, and operating efficiency of the Forest and its related divisions in the field (such as maintenance, fire protection, timber management, acquisition, engineering, emergency conservation work,

etc.) is the outstanding function of the Forest Service.

The supervisor's headquarters of all allegheny National Forest consists of the administrative force necessary to supervise its works program in the field as well as serving as the base for the direction of the Forest Service within the allegheny National Forest. The field organization of the supervisor's office is as follows: within the Northern Working Circle there is the Northern Ranger District Station (Sheffield, Pa.) and under their supervision are three Civilian Conservation Corps Camps, one WPA. Transit Camp, and five Pennsylvania Department of Forest and Waters Lookout Towers. Within the Southern Working Circle there is the Southern Ranger District Station (Marienville, Pa.) and under their supervision are six civilian Conservation Corps camps, one WPA. Transit camp, three U.S. Forest Lookout Towers, and three Penna. Dept. of Forest and Waters Lookout Towers.

The Office of the Title Attorney: Office of the Solicitor, with a Title Abstractor in charge does the necessary title abstract searching for the land to be acquired by the Allegheny National Forest. The office of this division of the agency is located in the Warren Bank and Trust Company Building, 315 Second Avenue, Warren, Pa. Other buildings formerly occupied by the National Forest Administrative offices is the Pierce Building, $304\frac{1}{2}$ Third Avenue from Oct. 21, 1921 - June 1932.

No records have been lost or destroyed excepting those useless, closed files that were destroyed in accordance with instructions received through the Forest Service. In regard to useless papers the agency closely follows Instruction Circular No.0-291 (June 4, 1936 - USDA. FS No.7) which states: "... all previous instructions for destruction of useless closed files are cancelled and superseded by this letter"! Hereafter, no official files will be destroyed except as and when author-

ized by the National Archives Council.

All reports, correspondence, etc. is with the Eastern Regional Office, Washington, D.C. with the exception of the personnel folders of the Civil Service appointed employees who have been separated from the Service for more than three years. The Westmoreland Homesteads Suburban Resettlement Project was estavlished on January 15, 1934 as the Westmoreland Homesteads. Inc., under a Delaware charter and subject to the regulations of the Federal Subsistence Homesteads Corporation. Organization and construction work began immediately. In June 1934 the project was taken over entirely by the Division of Subsistence Homesteads of the Department of the Interior. During the next year it passed with all the activities of that Division to the control of the Agricultural Adjustment Administration and the Federal Emergency Relief Administration for short periods. Finally, on June 1, 1935 it became a project of the Suburban Resettlement Division of the new Resettlement Administration under the supervision of the Director of Region 1 at New Haven, Connecticut. The records were created by the Management, and the Division of Construction of the Resettlement Administration.

The project is developing about 1325 acres in Mt. Pleasant Township, Westmoreland County. It has about 250 houses built and occupant and several community enterprises under construction, including a community house, a swimming pool, a school and a gymnasium. The homesteaders on their initiative and responsibility have organized a cooperative store.

This is one of four coordinate soil conservation demonstration projects in Pennsylvania supervised by the regional conservator for Region 1 at Williamsport, Pa., whose authority extends to the states of Maine, Vermont, New York, New Jersey, Maryland, West Virginia and Pennsylvania. The other three Pennsylvania projects are located at Lancaster in Lancaster County, Vandergrift in Westmoreland County, and Waynesboro in Franklin County.

The Indiana project is the oldest, and has in the past supervised temporary small isolated projects, particularly in Huntingdon County. But at the present time its jurisdiction is confined to the watershed area of Crooked Greek mainly in Indiana County. Within that area, however, it operates CGC Camps SCS 1, 2, 5 and 6 near Home, Sprankles Mills, Sligo and Shelocta, respectively. It also operates a nursery, and furnishes nursery stock to the other projects.

The project was set up late in 1933. From that time until March 1935 it was a part of the Scil Erosion Service of the Department of the Interior. For the first two years of its existence its headquarters were located in the Municipal Building.

None of its records have been lost or sent to either Washington or Williamsport. None are considered useless. Practically all business with the national headquarters clears through the regional office.

This is one of four coordinate soil conservation demonstration projects in Pennsylvania supervised by the Regional Conservator for Region 1 at Williamsport, Pa., whose authority extends to the states of Maine, Vermont, New York, New Jersey, Maryland, West Virginia, and Pennsylvania. The other three Pennsylvania projects have headquarters at Indiana in Indiana County, Lancaster in Lancaster County, and Waynesboro in Franklin County.

The jurisdiction of the Vandergrift project covers the water—shed area of Beaver Run in Westmoreland County, including 35,500 acres of farm land, 49.6% of which, by the most recent calculation, is under contract with the owners and tenants. In addition the project staff supervises the work of CCC camp, SCS-3 near Slickville, Pa., on the eastern edge of the watershed area. Occasionally, too, it furnished advice and help on soil conservation problems to farmers outside the watershed area who make special application, usually at the suggestion of county agricultural agents.

The project was set up in August 1935, has always been located in the Italian Union Mutual Benefit Society Building, has no papers considered useless, maintains no relationship with Washington headquarters except through the regional office at Williamsport, Pa., and has never sent any records to either Washington or Williamsport, except reports.

This station was established May 25, 1873 under the Signal Service, later Signal Corps of the United States Army. It was transferred to the newly established Weather Bureau of the Department of Agriculture on July 1, 1891.

Quarters were occupied in the Rindernecht Building at Fifth and State Streets from the date of establishment to July 31, 1888, in the Old Federal Building at State Street and South Park Row from August

Practically all records are considered permanent except daily weather forecast maps and forecast telegrams. These are kept only temporarity. The original copies of all meteorological records are sent to the Bureau at Washington, copies being filed here permanently. As indicated below most of the records are bound. The binding is done at Washington, and in several cases the recent files are actually at Washington being bound.

This agency cooperates very closely with the Commerce Department's Airway Communications Teletype Station at the Erie airport.

A staff of six is maintained, including an assistant meteorologist, an observer, a minor observor and three part time signal displaymentat Erie, Ashtabula, Ohio and Dunkirk, N. Y.

PITTSBURGH WEATHER STATION

New Federal Bldg., 7th Ave., and Grant St.

A weather station of the Signal Service (later Corps) of the U.S. Army was established in Pittsburgh on November 1, 1870; Sergeant James West, Observer. On July 1, 1891 the station was transferred with meteorological work of the Signal Corps to the Weather Bureau of the Department of Agriculture.
