

Mexican border has many holes

Unquarded: Despite Sept. 11, border patrols between two nations still lax in places

BOQUILLAS DEL CARMEN. Mexico — Along this lonesome streich of the Rio Grande: there are no fortified U.S. Customs stations, no razor withe no towering fences.

The only person at the river's edge is Victor Valdez, a 50year-old Mexican farmer with a metal dingby and a pair of plastic oars. He shuttles Mexican shoppers and American tourists
back and forth between the two nations for \$2.

Despite increased concerns about security after Sept. 11, no
border guards check passports or search bags. There are no officials at all — only a gaggle of cowboys on the Mexican side waiting to rent burros and ponies for the ride into Boquillas, less
than a mile down a rocky road.

Valdez sees no reason for concern.

"Rest assured, I a terrorist ever came here, I would tell the

security accord, the U.S. homeland security director. Tom

The round-trip would cost about \$50 for gas, which is more affordable than flying.

If being cooped up in a small sedan for 11 hours isn't your idea of fun, there are still some affordable plane tickets available through Southwest Arilines. They offer a round-trip light from Louvisite of Albany, N.Y., for \$304. The flight departs Priday morning and returns Sundley night. Flight prices for most other major airlines range from \$990 to \$2,200.







Rain and flooding continue to plague Southern states



Surely the recent proposal offered by the UK Futures Committee regarding the reorganization of the academic undergraduate colleges is memorable Essentially, arts and sciences will be split into thirds, and communication, fine arts and human & environmental sciences will be eliminated. Departments will be shuffled, the campus geography altered and havoc may be wreaked.

The committee, quite commendably, met openly and announced all of its meetings to the public well in advance under President Lee Todd's directive to create a more transparent university.

Yet, it smacks of something shady. The problem lies not with the methods of the committee but rather with its composition.

The Futures Committee consists of 20-odd UK professors and staff members who are influential in and representative of their respective fields. They supposedly form an accurate picture of the university in miniature and are drawn from the undergraduate, graduate and professional colleges of UK.

But, of the three colleges that are to be eliminated, there are only three representatives — one from fine arts, one from HES and one from communication — on the committee. Can three fight against a proposal backed by 20 others?

What's even more interesting to note is that the more powerful colleges on campus, colleges that won't be touched in any way by the proposed changes, have heavy representation.

Medicine, law and engineering boast multiple delegates each, and nothing — save perhaps increased budget shares — will happen to them if the organizational shuffle goes through.

Equal representation is a founding principle not only of our nation but of democ-




