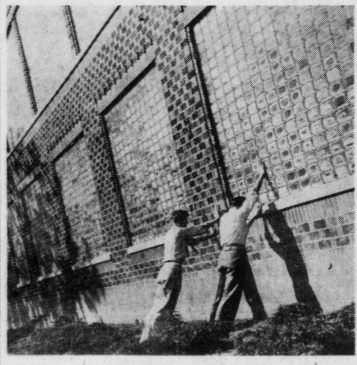

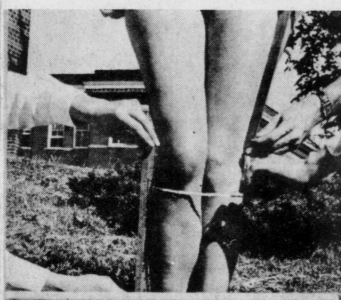

FUTTER BUDGET TO TELL CHEMS WHAT HE KNOWS

Meeting Plans Include Beer, Breakfast, Talk

Members of the American Chemical Society finally arranged to get a sponsor for their annual beer party to be held September 14 at French Villa.

Dr. Percy Adolphus Futterbudge of the National Association for the Prevention of Vivisection to Small Insects will speak on "Irrelevant Factors Contributing to the Consumption of Vital Vitamins M. L. P. Q. and Y. as yet unseen by microscope, in food products commonly consumed by man but preyed upon by lighter than aircraft insects which inhabit certain sections of the University Dispensary and Kastle hall."

His subject will concern a not very detailed study of the nitric acid content of turnips and spinach where the effect of cooking does not kill the insect or the acid consumed by them in the food products.

Doctor Futterbudge is a native of Hula-Hula, Greenland, and holds the degree of Advanced Loafing in Chemistry from the University of Murray, Murray, Ky., and in 1905 he received an honorary Ph.D. degree from the Hawaiian University of Animal Diseases in recognition of his work on chemical reactions to diseases common to horse flies in the Kentucky Experimental Station.

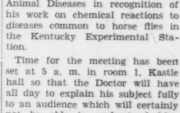

Senate Passes Bill To Glamorize Horse

The Sigma Chi chapter was visited with a plague recently, which local physicians have diagnosed as "Bridal Plaster's Seat."

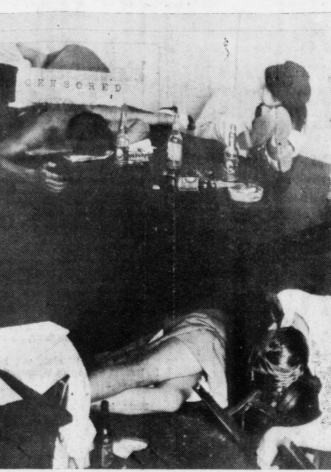

And love is a thing that can never go wrong;
And I am Marie of Roumania.*

Where else in literature can one find such rhythm, such pentameter, such hexameter as that? Surely not in American literature. No, surely not there.

I read a book last night, and I simply must tell you about it. It was written by the famed war correspondent Archibald Le Fleur Murgatroyd, and is entitled *Not Grease, But A Sword*. It is a book that each of you simply must read if you expect to be informed on the present unpleasantness in Europe.

Not Grease, But A Sword begins with Murgatroyd's adventures in a speakeasy on the South side of Montmartre, a suburb of Paris, and takes him through many bravos and hair-breadth escapes.
