The Kentucky Historical Society is sponsoring a five-day tour of the Jackson Purchase area of Kentucky August 1 through August 5. The tour will emphasize Kentucky's cultural, historical and recreational opportunities of the area. Participants will learn about Kentucky in the Civil War,
