Dear Sir:-

At the annual meeting of the Kentucky Society of Sons of the Revolution, held on February 22nd, 1920, it was unanimously voted to donate to the Marne Monument, intended as America's gift to France, the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00), to be raised by voluntary contributions. Ten dollars of the amount has already been contributed. If each member of the society, who has not already made a donation, will contribute not more than \$1.00 to the cause, the amount pledged will soon be raised. The names of all contributors are to be recorded and placed under the corner-stone of the proposed monument, the total cost of which will approach a quarter of a million dollars.

Please let me have whatever sum you may choose to give, as soon as possible, in order that the remittance for the Society may not be unduly delayed.
