3. It would seem that he is in some sort of deal with a printer in his own home town, publishing a booklet regarding the experience of a soldier in the recent World War, Fred Cornelius being the soldier in the case.

4. Since Fort Bayard was discontinued as an Army Hospital on June 15, 1920, and is now a U.S.P.H. Hospital and he is a patient under their care the case has been referred to the U.S.P.H. Service for investigation.
