GITA Vogel still has flashbacks of shooting

A day doesn't go by that former Lexington Metro Police Sgr. Phil Voyel doesn't replay in his mind his fatal shooting of an 18-year-old black youth on Oct. 25.

Citing possible civil litigation, Vogel said he could not comment on the circumstances surrounding the shooting of Tony Sullivan, other than to say it was an accident. But he said he will live with the tragedy for the rest of his life.

"There hasn't been a day since this happened that I haven't had a vivid recall of what transpired," he said. "Knowing how fast — within the snap of the fingers. — your life and that of your family and someone else's life can end or change is brought home to me every day.

"I can assure you that no one feels sorrier for what happened that day than me," Vogel said in one of two interviews last week with The Courier-Journal.

It was his first public comment since the shooting, which occurred as police were attempting to arrest Sullivan at Lexington's Bluegrass-Aspendale housing project.

Yesterday's 97-58 loss to UK, just more than a week after a 37-point loss to UCLA, seemed to be proof positive—the Irish just ain't what they used to

The noted giant-killers bumbled their way to the 39-point blowout yesterday, getting done in by some hellacious defense and a pair of heavenly performances on the part of the Wildcats (17-3).

That defense, UK's trademark all season, held Notre Dame (14-9) to just 33 percent shooting and forced the Irish into 23 turnovers. The offensive fireworks came courtesy of Walter McCarty and Antoine Walker, who each dominated a half of play.

Those halves added up to a dominating whole for UK, one that got glowing reviews from the Cats' toughest critic.

"We've been winning all season long, but we haven't played great basketball," UK coach Rick Pitino said. "Right now, it's snowballing, and we're playing very well. We started out a good basketball team and became a very good one, now we're on our way to becoming outstanding."

The Cats aren't there yet, Pitino said, but yesterday was a step in that direction.

The Lady Kats suffered their fifth consecutive Southeastern Conference loss Saturday after falling to the visiting Alabama Crimson Tide.

No. 19 Alabama defeated the Lady Kats of Sea. 2. The Lady Tide was led by senior Niesa Johnson, who contributed 22 points, 7 rebounds, 5 assists and 3 steals.

Johnson said offensive patience and defensive pressure for the Tide's victory.

"We were getting good shots when we took care of the ball," said Johnson, whose team improved to 16-7 overall and 5-4 in the SEC. "We went to the zone in the second half and picked off the ball. We Reed shots."
