The recent Fresidential Order halting voluntary enlistments in the armed forces DOES NOT restrict applications for appointment to commissioned or warrant rank in the U.S. Naval Reserve. Application may be made through any of the three offices listed above. The enclosed Preliminary Flacement Questionnaire should be completed and returned to the nearest office as a means of making inquiry regarding one's qualifications for appointment.

Basic requirements for appointment are, (1) U.S. Citizenship, (2) College Education, (3) Physical Fitness with no Organic Defects, (4) Good Character and Reputation, (5) Successful Experience in some Technical, Professional or Business Field, (6) Leadership Qualities, (7) Age between 19 and 50. Possession of one or more of these qualifications in a marked degree may justify waiving a deficiency in others. For younger men the educational background is most important, while in the upper age brackets experience and outstanding accomplishments count more heavily. Some duties are closed to men over forty but there are openings for men up to fifty years of age who can make definite contributions to the Navy, especially in technical and engineering fields.

The Naval Officer Procurement Service conforms to policies of the War Man Fower Commission and does not seek applications from those who are engaged in vital war work and have occupational deferment under Selective Service. From

other sources the Navy endeavors to enroll and needs the <u>best qual-ified</u> men obtainable to perform the many varied and specialized duties of Naval Officers.

If you believe yourself to be qualified and if your present work does not contribute directly towards winning the war, then you should consider this as a personal invitation to file an application. Otherwise, please pass the letter and questionnaire on to some man whom you would be willing to recommend for a Naval Commission.





School TANDY VS LASSITER LEE Tried before Judge Rodgers, district judge, intermittently September 24 to October 18, 1940. The case was finished and the judge will study over the evidence and render a decision in approximately sixty days. In all, there were about 250 defendants and their interests were under the following groups: I.Lee, II.Bane, III. Moore, IV.Sand Lake School District #39, V.Chandler, Their claims were as follows: I. LEE, Claimed that many years ago they built their fence c'd' along the line they thought to be correct. We claim cd to be the correct line based on an actual survey. The Lees will in all probability be upheld in their contention inasmuch as their fence has been there many years, they have cultivated the land, and under law, they will likely get clear title through limitation. Approximately 15 acres will be lost here. II. BANE: Claim about 15 acres through limitation. Land fenced d'f' instead of df; cultivated; live there. We shall no doubt lose this. III. MOORE: While the Lees and Banes probably made an honest mistake, the Moores admit taking a short cut ef when fencing instead of following the line aebf. They have even been paying taxes on the 20 acre plot efbe. This is a steal but legal in Texas. We shall probably lose this.

IV. SAND LAKE SCHOOL: May lose up to five acres to the school s through limitation. Their claim is not as clear as the others but it is hard to beat a school.

V. CHANDLER: The Chandler clan claims their father and grandmother "squatted" on the place from 1869-1881 and claims the whole 320 acres adverse possession. The present Chandlers had old witnesses who remembered this and our side had equally old witnesses to disprove. The eldest Chandler daughter, now age 65, swears she was born on the In Texas, a squatter can get only 160 acres. Possible decisions: 1. 160 aces property. to old man Chandler or heirs plus 160 acres to his mother or heirs, thereby our losing all; 2. 160 acres to them jointly: 3. Up to 25 acres which they claim old man Chandler actually had under cultivation: 4. Nothing to the Chandlers and all to us (or less claims, I,II, III and/or IV). Under Texas law, a squatter must definitely bound property so acquired and the Chandlers have failed to do this.

Our lawyers think we shall lose the Lee, Bame, Moore and school claims but that we have a fifty-fifty chance or better on the Chandler claim.

If the Chandlers lose, they may appeal and play for time. The time element is in their favor as our witnesses are so very old they may die any time, whereas their chief witness, the eldest Chandler daughter, is very young looking to be 65. Since 1934. when the case was tried in Waco, three of our witnesses have died.

Near the end of the litigation, the whole case was almost thrown out of court when the judge found that W.D. Lacey, whom he had appointed to represent the unknown defendants, had been on our side in the Waco trial. A compromise was effected to prevent a mistrial. If we win now, we will have to sue the "unknowns" but that will/comparatively
